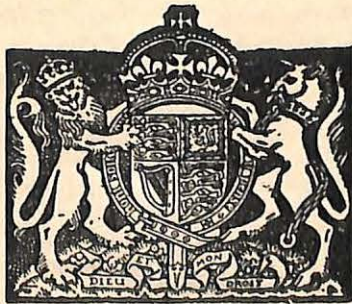

**Proceedings of the Punjab Government in the Local Government (Small Towns) Department, No. 4960-L. G.-38/33477-A., dated the 10th October, 1938.**

READ—

The Annual Administration Reports on Small Towns for the year 1936-37.

THE number of small towns at the beginning of the year was 107 and at its close 104. The Town Committees of (i) Pattoki in the Lahore District and (ii) Tandlianwala in the Lyallpur District, were raised to second class municipalities, and the Town Committee of (iii) Anandpur, in the Hoshiarpur District, was converted into a Notified Area Committee during the year.

The total population of Small Towns was 452,328 and the number of members was 667, as against the previous year's figures of 469,653 and 678, respectively. Of the 667 members 529 were elected, and 138 nominated, of whom only 48 were officials. Of the Presidents, 31 were officials, all elected. Beside casual bye-elections, general elections were held during the year in 40 Small Towns, and in all 171 out of 258 seats were contested. Contests were generally keen, the percentage of voters going to the polls being 89 in Kangra, 95 in Shahkot and Shahdara (Sheikhupura District), 91 in Bhalwal (Shahpur District) and 95 in Fateh Jang (Attock District). It would be observed that no election offences were reported anywhere.

2. The number of special orders issued under the various clauses of section 35 of the Small Towns Act was 682 as compared with 606 of the last year. **General and Special Orders.** Of these, 105 were issued by the Town Committee of Dasuya (Hoshiarpur District), 36 by Kallurkot Committee (Mianwali District), 75 by the Kahror Committee (Multan District) and 66 by the Kot Adu Committee (Muzaffargarh District). Fresh general orders under the same section were framed by 35 Town Committees as against 32 during the preceding year. As remarked in last year's review the Town Committee of Budhlada (Hissar District) is reported to have failed to take effective action in regard to non-compliance with general orders issued under sub-clauses (l) and (m) of section 35 of the Act. The result was that there was no appreciable decrease in the number of encroachments. In the Rawalpindi Division the use of powers under general orders in connection with the control of building operations and food supplies was generally adequate. The power to issue general or special orders was not abused in any case. The number of persons convicted for breach of general and special orders during the year was 333 as compared with 356 of the last year. 3. The income for all Small Towns during the year under report was Rs. 7,51,832, as against Rs. 7,95,836 for the preceding year. The decrease was due to a fall of income under the following heads :—

The fall in total income may also be attributed to the reduction in the number of Small Towns.

The incidence of taxation per head of population was Re. 0-12-3, as compared with Re. 0-13-4 in the last year. The incidence was high-

est at Sillanwali (Shahpur District) Rs. 6-9-8, and lowest at Vehoa (Dera Ghazi Khan District) Re. 0-1-0. In the case of Small Towns where the incidence is very meagre, the Committee cannot provide for adequate amenities for their inhabitants. There was considerable decrease in the income of Pindi Bhattian and Kila Didar Singh Town Committees in the Gujranwala District and the Town Committees generally in the Jhang District because of the slackness in realization. Town rate continues to be the main source of income in almost all Small Towns.

4. Total expenditure during the year under report was Rs. 7,38,473, as against Rs. 7,60,659 during the preceding year. The decrease is spread over the various heads of expenditure. As many as 44 Town Committees spent nothing on Education and only 20 of them spent Rs. 1,000 or above under that head. The District reports show that where funds are available, the Committees have a fair distribution in the matter of expenditure over various objects specified in the Act, but most of the smaller Town Committees have the disadvantage of lack of funds and cannot expand their beneficent activities.

5. The proceedings of a meeting of Budhlada Committee (Hissar District) and of a meeting of the Daira Din Pinah Committee (Muzaffargarh District) were suspended by the Deputy Commissioners under section 47 of the Act. Three resolutions of the Gujjar Khan Town Committee, two of Bhalwal and one of Sillanwali were suspended by the Deputy Commissioners under the same section. Two resolutions of the Town Committee of Jalalpur-Pirwala were suspended and two revoked by the Deputy Commissioner, Multan, under section 37. The proceedings of a meeting of the Duniyapur Committee and those of a meeting of the Kabirwala Committee were declared void as they were not in order. Eleven out of 14 Town Committees in the Ambala Division were inspected during the year under report by the Deputy Commissioners or their Assistants. The result of the inspection was generally good, except in the case of Hidayatpur Chhaon in the Gurgaon District, where the affairs are said to be very unsatisfactory, on account of a large number of encroachments on nazul land and bad sanitation. All the Town Committees in the Jullundur Division were regularly inspected by Deputy Commissioners or their Assistants. Owing to the unsatisfactory condition of its finances, the Khanpur Committee (Hoshiarpur District) was warned that unless it improved its finances, action would be taken against it under section 49. Twenty-four out of 38 Small Town Committees in the Lahore Division were inspected by Deputy Commissioners or their Assistants. No cases of defalcation or embezzlement were reported from any district. All the 17 Small Town Committees in the Rawalpindi Division were inspected by the Deputy Commissioners or their Assistants. Fourteen out of 16 Town Committees in the Multan Division were inspected by Deputy Commissioners or their Assistants. Four Committees were inspected by the Inspector of Local Bodies, 3 by the District Medical Officer of Health and 5 by Audit Officers. The local officers express appreciation of the valuable assistance rendered by the Inspector, Local Bodies.

6. The Commissioner, Ambala Division, in concluding his report on the Small Town Committees states that the working of the Act has been reported to be satisfactory on the whole. The following remarks by the Deputy Commissioner, Hissar, quoted by the Commissioner, in his review, are of general interest and are reproduced below :—

“ The success of a Town Committee like that of any other local body is dependent mainly on official assistance. Left to itself a Committee tends to deteriorate rapidly and as it goes deeper and deeper into the quagmire of party friction, sloth and nepotism the need of an official President becomes clearer. In the main there are two



problems which these Committees will not face even under considerable official pressure—(a) the checking and removal of encroachments and (b) the increasing of income to meet the cost of the various amenities of civic life. The aversion to increased taxation is apparent in most Committees.”

The Commissioner, Jullundur Division, concludes his report with the remarks that little improvement is visible in the working of the Town Committees.

The Commissioner, Lahore Division, remarks :—

“ The working of the Small Towns Act should provide valuable education in local government, but its success is handicapped by the fact that the electorate in the majority of cases does not concern itself with returning the best available representatives. The best brains available seem to prefer the role of critic to the burdens of membership. Members themselves generally lack a sense of public service and are influenced by personal and party considerations rather than local patriotism. Moreover, they apparently realise that they have not generally the confidence of the electorate and are consequently not prepared to carry through measures which they expect to be unpopular. The result is that for the most part committees are handicapped by serious financial difficulties and little or no useful progress can be made in any direction. Besides local officers, the Divisional Inspector of Lahore Division has inspected several Small Town Committees during the year under report and given them valuable advice and assistance, but on the whole there is no marked improvement in the administration of these Small Towns and no optimistic view of the future is possible so long as members are actuated by selfish motives, and so long as members of the general public remain under the impression that they are entitled to something for nothing. Members of the public fail to realize that money raised by taxation is intended to be returned to the public in the form of necessities and conveniences.”

The Commissioner, Multan Division, states :—

“ The fear of losing votes by offending voters still dominates most members. Disobedience of General Orders is thus overlooked and any question of further taxation is shunned as something most improper. Funds are scarce, public co-operation is not secured and most small towns lack the essential amenities of modern civilized life. It is hard to detect any great or general improvement in administration, but things would be far worse without the Inspector of Local Bodies.”

The Commissioners are almost unanimous in their view that the administration of Small Town Committees generally is not very satisfactory and shows no signs of early improvement. Government agree with this view, and feel that the present state of affairs must be ascribed to the lack of education and civic sense of the electorate. In fact in most Small Towns it seems that the people prefer squalor with comparative freedom from taxes to a more efficient but necessarily more costly administration, and a member who favoured the energetic collection even of existing taxes could have little chance of being returned again. The spread of education, industrialization of the province and careful and sympathetic guidance from officials will, it is hoped, improve matters eventually and Government trust that district officers assisted by Local Bodies Inspectorate will continue to work with hope and a determination to see a better standard of local government in the countryside.

**Order.**—Ordered that copies of this review be forwarded to all Commissioners of Divisions and Deputy Commissioners in the Punjab, and the Secretary to Government, Punjab, Public Works Department, Buildings and Roads Branch; and be submitted to the Government of India in the Department of Education, Health and Lands.

Ordered also, that the review be published in the *Punjab Gazette*, and that copies be supplied to Deputy Commissioners for the information of Town Committees.
