## APPENDIX R.

The public roads and streets (their aggregate length being about 131 miles) received the usual annual repair, including, as regards most, a fresh layer of metalling. The operation of pipe-laying throughout all the streets has had the result of putting the surface of the roads in all parts considerably out of order, and time will be required before they can be restored to their former state.

The public streets and roads were watered during the dry season (8 months), the principal thoroughfares twice, others, once a day.

The daily scavenging of the whole town and Island has been performed under the supervision of the Board's Executive Officer, in as perfect a manner as the want of a good system of drainage will admit of.

Very considerable attention has been paid to the cleanliness of the various slaughter-houses, and markets, and food of a bad or inferior quality has never been allowed to be exposed for sale. Whether the improved health of the Island, generally, may be attributed to the above measures, the Commissioners will not presume to say; they can, however, state that the average mortality of the past season has been decidedly below that of former years.

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## APPENDIX S.

Forty new night-soil carts have been constructed for scavenging purposes.

The public urinary at the corner of "Sootarchall Lane" has been removed at the expense of the owner of the premises adjoining it (as it was a source of great annoyance to the persons living near it) to "Sheik Memon Street" near the Green Market. The masonry work is in part finished, and as soon as the cast iron pipe for flushing the urinary can be obtained, it will be ready for use.

The drain under "Mahomed Syed Mookree Street" has been completed. In its unfinished state, the drain was a cause of great annoyance to the residents of the streets, who have now been relieved of the nuisance.

The road leading to the cemetery on the flats has been repaired, and slightly raised, so as to render it passable for carts. This road requires further improvement to make it passable during the monsoon. This improvement will be effected next year, if the state of the funds will admit of the work being taken in hand.

The pier at Chinch Bunder for the disposal of the night-soil on the eastern side of the town, has been completed, with the exception of the pumps for lifting water. The pier has however been brought into use by the Halalcores, who have commenced emptying the contents of their baskets into the tanks, made to receive the soil, instead of throwing the filth on the shores at Warree Bunder, where they have hitherto emptied their baskets. As soon as the pumps are finished, the contents of all the night-soil carts will be discharged from this pier instead of at "Love Grove," where the practice of discharging the soil caused much nuisance.

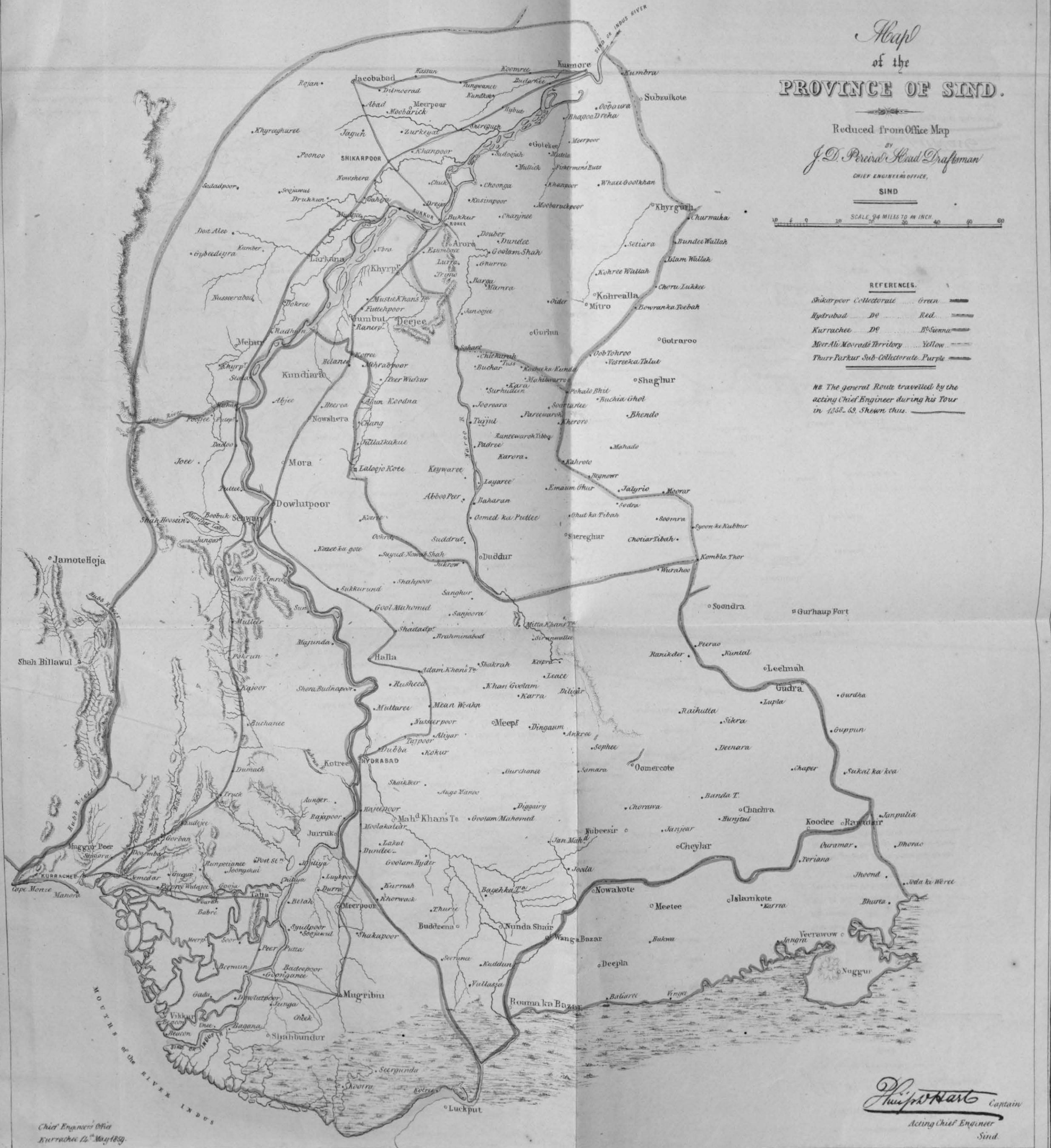
