Resolution—No. 2, Press, dated 22nd January 1947.**JAMABANDI—FASLI 1355 (1945-46)—REPORT—SUBMITTED.**

1. The Board submits its report on the settlement of Land Revenue in the Madras Presidency for fasli 1355 (1945-46) together with the prescribed statements.

Main Features.—The main features of the fasli were—

(i) On the whole the season was generally fair in Coimbatore, Madura, Tinnevely, South Kanara and the Nilgiris and it was below normal in the other districts—vide paragraph 2.

(ii) The total extent of ryotwari holdings increased by 7,134 acres from 27,654,185 acres in the previous fasli—vide paragraph 7.

(iii) The total assessment on holdings showed an increase of Rs. 23,985 from Rs. 6,04,27,311 in the previous fasli—vide paragraph 8.

(iv) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings decreased by 481,828 acres—vide paragraph 9.

(v) The amount of water-rate and second-crop charge decreased by Rs. 4,43,162—vide paragraph 10.

(vi) Seasonal remissions increased by Rs. 53,45,218—vide paragraph 11 (i).

(vii) Fixed remissions decreased by Rs. 10,456—vide paragraph 11 (ii).

(viii) Beriz deductions decreased by Rs. 3,245—vide paragraph 11 (iii).

(ix) The amount of revenue remitted in this fasli was Rs. 71.33 lakhs against Rs. 18.02 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli—vide paragraph 11.

(x) Miscellaneous revenue decreased by Rs. 5,79,754—vide paragraph 12.

(xi) There was a decrease in the number of land sales—vide paragraph 26.

2. *Seasonal conditions*—(a) *The south-west monsoon (June to September 1945).*—The south-west monsoon burst on the South Malabar coast on the 5th June 1945 causing heavy rains on the West Coast between the 7th and 10th of June 1945. It slackened thereafter and strengthened again by the 19th of the month and remained fairly active for the rest of the month. Local showers occurred in the Peninsula between the 3rd and 10th, and between the 20th and 27th of the month. The rainfall in the month was below the normal in all the districts of the Province. The monsoon was generally active on the West Coast in July, and the rainfall in the month was normal or bordering on the normal in South Arcot, Salem, Tinnevely and Malabar; below the normal in Trichinopoly and Madura; and above the normal in the other districts of the Province. The monsoon revived on the 9th August and was fairly active on the West Coast till the 26th of the month. Widespread thunderstorm occurred in South-East Madras in the beginning of August 1945, on the North Madras coast on the 25th and again in the South-East Madras on the following day. The rainfall during August 1945 was normal or bordering on the normal in Cuddapah and Madura; below the normal in Vizagapatam (Plains), Kurnool, Bellary, Anantapur, Nellore, Chingleput, Coimbatore, Tinnevely, Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris; and above the normal in the rest of the Province. The monsoon was generally weak in the Province during September 1945. Local thundershowers occurred in parts of the Province between 1st and 3rd, 7th and 10th and 26th and 30th September 1945. The rainfall in the month was bordering on the normal

in the East Godavari (Plains), West Godavari and Cuddapah; above the normal in Vizagapatam (Plains), East Godavari (Agency), Kistna, Guntur, Nellore and Chingleput; and below the normal in the rest of the Province. As a result of insufficient rainfall in the month of September dry crops in parts of the Rayadrug taluk of the Bellary district were adversely affected to some extent, and the level of Periyar lake in Madura and of the Mettur Dam in Salem was exceptionally low for the time of the year. Insufficient rains and inadequate water-supply in the irrigation sources affected the yield of the early varieties of paddy and of dry crops, and the outturn was reported to be generally below the normal. Over the whole period of the south-west monsoon (June 1945 to September 1945), the rainfall was normal or bordering on the normal in Kistna, Cuddapah, Nellore and North Arcot; above the normal in East Godavari, West Godavari, Guntur, Kurnool, Chingleput and Chittoor; and below the normal in the other districts of the Province.

Freshes came down the main rivers in time except in the Cauvery, and continued steady and generally sufficient for agricultural purposes.

Sowings of the early crops (both wet and dry) were above the average in the Circars and below the average in the Deccan, the Carnatic, the Southern districts and the West Coast. In the Central districts, sowings of early wet crops were above average while the sowings of early dry crops were below the average.

The condition of the standing crops was generally satisfactory except in parts of the districts of Bellary and Anantapur.

(b) *The north-east monsoon (October 1945 to January 1946).*—During the second week of October 1945, fairly widespread thundershowers occurred in the South Peninsula. A depression formed in the Bay on the 14th developed into a cyclonic storm by the 15th morning, and intensifying further, crossed the coast just south of Cocanada on the morning of the 18th, causing violent gales and heavy rainfall along the Circars coast. The storm was associated with a tidal wave 5 to 7 feet high which inundated the coastal belt between Cocanada and Masulipatam. It caused much destruction to property and crops in the Circars. Early and mid-season paddy varieties in Kistna and the Basangi and Akkulu varieties in East and West Godavaris which were all ready for harvest or in flower, suffered severe damage. Associated with the cyclonic storm, widespread and locally very heavy rain fell in South Malabar on the 17th and 18th of October 1945, and in the Madras Deccan on the 18th. During the last week of the month, thundershowers fell in the South Peninsula. The rainfall during the month was above the normal in Vizagapatam (Plains), East Godavari (Agency), Guntur, Coimbatore, Madura and Ramnad; and below the normal in the other districts of the Province. Dry crops in parts of the Deccan began to wither on account of the insufficient rainfall in September and October 1945. The monsoon was generally active during November 1945. Unsettled conditions appeared in the South-East Bay on the 1st November 1945, and swept over the South Peninsula causing widespread rainfall along the Coramandal Coast and in South Malabar on the 2nd, and locally heavy rainfall in South-East Madras and Malabar between the 9th and 16th November 1945. The later half of the month was marked by thunder-storm activity in the Peninsula. The rainfall during the month was above the normal in East Godavari (Agency), Chingleput, South Arcot, Coimbatore, the Southern districts, the West Coast districts and the Nilgiris, and below the normal elsewhere. The monsoon again strengthened in the South-West Bay on the 4th December 1945 resulting in locally heavy showers on the South Coromandal Coast from 4th to 7th. Light showers occurred along the North

Madras coast from 13th to 15th, and in South-East Madras on the 15th and 18th to 20th. There was practically no rainfall during the month in the Deccan and the Circars except in Vizagapatam. In the rest of the Province, the rainfall was below the normal. As a result of insufficient rains in the north-east monsoon period, the supply of water in the irrigation sources was inadequate, and paddy cultivation was generally restricted. The level in the Mettur Dam was also unprecedentedly low. The weather was generally dry in January 1946 except for light local showers in the South Peninsula. Over the whole period of the north-east monsoon (October 1945 to January 1946), the rainfall was bordering on the normal in Ramnad; above the normal in Vizagapatam (Plains), East Godavari (Agency), Coimbatore, Madura, Tinnevely and the Nilgiris; and below the normal in the other districts of the Province.

Sowings of the late crops were above the average in the Circars, the Southern districts and the West Coast; and below the average in the Deccan and the Carnatic. In the Central districts sowings of the late crops were above the average in the case of the dry crops and below the average in the case of the wet crops.

The condition of the standing crops was generally satisfactory except in parts of the Deccan, the Central districts, South Arcot and Ramnad.

There was practically no rainfall in the Province in February 1946. The rainfall in March 1946 was normal in Anantapur, above the normal in Kurnool, Cuddapah, Chingleput, South Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, the Southern districts, the West Coast and the Nilgiris, and below the normal elsewhere. Local thundershowers occurred in the Circars, the South Peninsula and the West Coast during the second and third weeks of April 1946. The rainfall during the month was normal in Salem; below the normal in Kurnool, Anantapur, Cuddapah, the Carnatic, Chittoor, North Arcot, Trichinopoly, Tanjore and Tinnevely; and above the normal, in the other districts of the Province. Scattered showers occurred during the second and last week of May 1946 throughout the Province, and the rainfall during the month was normal or bordering on the normal in Kistna, Guntur, Salem and Madura, below the normal in Vizagapatam (Plains), East Godavari, (Agency), Cuddapah, Chingleput, Chittoor, Coimbatore, Tinnevely, the West Coast and the Nilgiris; and above the normal in the rest of the Province.

(c) *Resume.*—On the whole the season was generally fair only in Coimbatore, Madura, Tinnevely, South Kanara and the Nilgiris. It was below the normal in the other districts, especially in parts of the Deccan and North Arcot where it was disappointing.

(d) *Distressed areas.*—Owing to the inadequate and ill distributed rainfall in both the monsoons and the consequent failure of crops, seasonal conditions were not favourable in parts of Bellary and Anantapur districts, and in Rapur taluk of the Nellore district. Distress spread over the entire district of Anantapur towards the end of the fasli. In order to provide employment for the labourers, expansion of district board road works, irrigation works and other works of permanent utility such as the digging of new wells, the repairing of old wells and tanks, widening and deepening of supply channels to tanks, etc., were taken up for execution. The people employed on all these works were paid wages at the prevailing market rate. Grain depots were opened close to every work. Special grants were made to improve the supply of drinking water in these districts. The number of works increased from

time to time as a result of the increasing demand for employment. The average number of labourers relieved daily in all these works was 6,855 in Anantapur and 3,094 in Bellary. Gratuitous relief both in the shape of grain and cash was distributed to the infirm and decrepit in the affected areas in these districts.

(e) *Special land revenue concessions.*—Land revenue had to be remitted on a comparatively large scale, as a result of severe damage caused by the cyclone of October 1945 in the districts of Vizagapatam, East Godavari, West Godavari, Kistna and Guntur. The land revenue remitted in the year was Rs. 60,907 in Vizagapatam, Rs. 2,53,479 in East Godavari, Rs. 14,68,597 in West Godavari, Rs. 6,32,225 in Kistna, and Rs. 3,11,579 in Guntur. Government also sanctioned the postponement of collection of the instalments under the Land Improvements Loans Act and the Agricultural Loans Act for one year in the taluks of Narsapur, Bhimavaram and Tanuku in the West Godavari district. The postponement of the collection of loan instalments within the fasli in the cyclone affected areas of East Godavari district was also sanctioned by the Board.

In view of the adverse seasonal conditions, Government also granted graded remission of assessment on dry lands, ranging from 25 per cent to 100 per cent in 741 villages in Anantapur district and 25 villages in Kurnool district; and ranging from 50 per cent to 100 per cent in 334 villages in Bellary district.

The total amount remitted as a result of the concession was Rs. 5,22,029 in Bellary district, Rs. 5,93,370 in Anantapur district and Rs. 25,178 in the Kurnool district. As considerable distress prevailed in Bellary taluk, the collection of the full assessment in four villages in which no remission was granted, and the collection of the unremitted portion of the land revenue in cases in which only partial remissions were granted, were ordered to be postponed to the next fasli. The Government further directed that the collection of the suspended amounts due in fasli 1355 should be postponed for a year in respect of villages in Anantapur and Kurnool districts where dry remissions were granted. In order to afford relief consequent on the failure of the monsoon and insufficient supply of water in the Tanjore district, the Government ordered that all lands on which paddy crops were grown which received no wetting after 15th January 1946 and the crop outturn of which was 4 annas and less should be granted full remission of land revenue in fasli 1355. The loss of revenue involved was Rs. 1,96,192.

In addition to these concessions, the temporary reductions of water-cess in East and West Godavari and Kistna districts and in the deltaic tracts of Guntur were continued during fasli 1355 also.

3. *Number of ryotwari villages.*—The total number of ryotwari villages in the Presidency was the same as in the last fasli (21,101).

4. *Sources of land revenue.*—The land revenue of the Province is derived from the following sources :—

- (i) peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates ;
- (ii) shrotriyam jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages ;
- (iii) assessment, including water-rate on lands held under ryotwari tenure ; and
- (iv) miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 47,49,958 as against Rs. 47,50,293 (revised figure) in the previous fasli. The decrease of Rs. 335 is explained below :—

6. *Quit-rent.*—The quit-rent payable on villages held on shrotriyam or favourable tenure was Rs. 7,36,040 as against Rs. 7,36,922 (revised figure) in the previous fasli. The decrease of Rs. 882 is explained below :—

7. *Ryotwari holdings.*—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 27,661,319 acres against 27,654,185 acres in the previous fasli which shows an increase of 7,134 acres. There was an increase in all the districts except the following where there was a decrease : Kistna (31); Guntur (110); Nellore (64); Cuddapah (29); Kurnool (197); Chingleput (48); Chittoor (41); North Arcot (72); South Arcot (175); Coimbatore (721) and the Nilgiris (8).

The increase in Malabar district was mainly due to the transfer of "unoccupied" lands to "occupied". The increase in the other districts was chiefly due to fresh assignments and resumption of inams.

8. *Assessment on ryotwari holdings.*—The total assessment of holdings was Rs. 604.51 lakhs as against Rs. 604.27 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net increase of 0.24 lakh. There was an increase in all the districts except the following where there was a decrease : Guntur (Rs. 632); Nellore (Rs. 57); Kurnool (Rs. 139); Chingleput (Rs. 135); Chittoor (Rs. 140); Tinnevely (Rs. 41); Coimbatore (Rs. 714); Salem (Rs. 163) and South Kanara (Rs. 414).

9. *Area cultivated.*—(i) The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 20.20 million acres as against 20.69 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net decrease of 386,533 acres under dry and a net decrease of 95,295 acres under wet, resulting in a net decrease of 481,828 acres.

(ii) The total area cultivated during the fasli including that under miscellaneous cultivation was 21.05 million acres as against 21.51 million acres in the previous fasli. There was an increase of 399,071 acres under waste charged.

10. *Water-rate and second crop charge.*—The revenue derived from this source amounted to Rs. 48·21 lakhs against Rs. 52·64 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 4,15,826 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 8,58,988 in other districts resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 4,43,162. There was a decrease in all the districts except the following where there was an increase :—

Vizagapatam (Rs. 3,014), East Godavari (Rs. 78,821), West Godavari (Rs. 3,13,698), Kistna (Rs. 16,304) and Guntur (Rs. 3,989). The decrease in the districts was mainly due to unfavourable seasonal conditions, inadequate supply in the irrigation sources and the inability of the ryots to raise second crop cultivation. The increase in the West Godavari district was due to the fact that vast extents were thrown open for second crop cultivation under additional areas to compensate for the loss caused by the cyclone of October 1945.

11. *Remissions.*—The total remission granted was Rs. 71·33 lakhs of which Rs. 59·47 lakhs were seasonal remissions. As compared with the previous fasli, there was an increase in remissions of Rs. 53·32 lakhs. There was an increase in all the districts except in Ramnad, the Nilgiris, South Kanara and Malabar where there was a decrease.

(i) *Seasonal remissions.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 59,46,996 as against Rs. 6,01,778 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 53,45,218. There was an increase in all the districts except in Ramnad where there was a decrease (Rs. 311). The increase under this head was due to unfavourable seasonal conditions and inadequate supply of water in the irrigation sources. The large amount remitted in West Godavari district (Rs. 14,68,597), East Godavari (Rs. 2,53,479) Kistna (Rs. 6,32,225) and Guntur (Rs. 3,11,579) was due to the liberal remissions granted by the Government to give relief to the ryots of the cyclone-affected areas.

(a) *Waste remissions.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 6·04 lakhs against Rs. 1·53 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 4·51 lakhs.

(b) *Shavi or loss of crop.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 17,22,622 against Rs. 79,806 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 16,42,816 which was due to adverse seasonal conditions. The increase, which was common to all the districts, was marked in West Godavari, East Godavari, Kistna, Nellore and North Arcot.

(c) *Tirvakammi remissions* (i.e., remissions of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply).—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 8,18,421 against Rs. 1,69,473 in the previous fasli and there was a net increase of Rs. 6,48,948. There was an increase in all the districts except in the following where there was a decrease : East Godavari (Rs. 143), West Godavari (Rs. 743), Kistna (Rs. 7,347) and Ramnad (Rs. 290). The increase was due to unfavourable conditions of the season.

(d) *Remission for damages caused by floods.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 11,67,393 against Rs. 93,123 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 10,74,270.

(e) *Remission of second crop charge.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 69,934 against Rs. 8,660 in the previous fasli.

(f) *Short crop or poor harvest.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 15,16,049 against Rs. 40,959 in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 14,75,090.

(ii) *Fixed remissions* (i.e., abatement of demand on account of reasons unconnected with the season).—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,73,884 against Rs. 1,84,340 (revised figure) in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 10,456.

(iii) *Beriz deductions*.—Deductions made in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 10,12,538 against Rs. 10,15,783 (revised figure) in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 3,245.

(iv) *Land revenue concessions*.—Though the economic condition of the agriculturists generally improved with the rise in prices of agricultural produce, resulting in the withdrawal of the general concessions of land revenue granted in previous years, special remissions at graded scales amounting in all to Rs. 48,74,215 were granted during the fasli in respect of the areas affected by adverse seasonal conditions in Bellary, Anantapur and Kurnool, by cyclone and by floods in Vizagapatam, East Godavari, West Godavari, Kistna and Guntur, and owing to scarcity of water-supply in Tanjore.

12. *Miscellaneous Revenue*.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 120.70 lakhs (col. 55 of statement No. 4) against Rs. 126.50 lakhs as now revised) in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 4,54,335 in certain districts and a decrease of Rs. 10,34,089 in other districts resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 5,79,754. The several items of the revenue are dealt with below :

(i) *Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 22.97 lakhs against Rs. 23.39 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli.

(ii) (a) *Second crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 1.56 lakhs against Rs. 2.42 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 0.86 lakh.

(b) *Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 15.57 lakhs against Rs. 18.63 lakhs in the previous fasli, the decrease being Rs. 3,05,487.

(iii) *Charge for water in villages in estates (including tirvai jasti and fasli jasti)*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 28.24 lakhs against Rs. 33.97 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in a decrease of Rs. 5.74 lakhs.

(iv) *Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.14 lakhs against Rs. 4.05 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a decrease of Rs. 0.91 lakh.

(v) *Charges levied for occupation with or without permission of assessed and unassessed lands*.—The revenue derived under this head was Rs. 6.25 lakhs against Rs. 7.15 lakhs (revised figure) showing a decrease of Rs. 0.90 lakh.

(vi) *Charges levied for occupation of poramboke lands*.—The revenue derived under his head was Rs. 6.56 lakhs against Rs. 6.14 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 42,072.

Taram assessment was levied on an extent of 152,566 acres against 122,837 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in the districts of Coimbatore (22,399 acres), Guntur (18,559 acres), Salem (16,403 acres), Nellore (13,370 acres) and Tanjore (10,262 acres).

(vii) *Revenue derived from taxed trees*.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3,32,259 against Rs. 3,55,585 (revised figure) in the previous fasli.

(viii) *Commission for estates under the Court of Wards.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 21,680 against Rs. 30,314 in the previous fasli showing a decrease of Rs. 8,634.

(ix) *Revenue from process fees.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 6,231 against Rs. 5,812 (revised figure) in the previous fasli resulting in an increase of Rs. 419.

(x) *Sale-proceeds of lands sold.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 2.90 lakhs against Rs. 2.16 lakhs in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 0.74 lakh.

(xi) *Rent of lankas.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 12.86 lakhs against Rs. 7.65 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in an increase of Rs. 5.21 lakhs.

(xii) *Quit-rent and ground-rent.*—The revenue under this head was Rs. 2.98 lakhs against Rs. 2.96 lakhs in the previous fasli showing an increase of Rs. 0.02 lakh.

13. *Net ryotwari demand.*—The net ryotwari demand including water-rate, second crop charge and miscellaneous revenue amounted to Rs. 702.09 lakhs against Rs. 765.39 lakhs (revised figure) in the previous fasli, resulting in a decrease of Rs. 63,30,444. The details for the net decrease are given below :—

16. *Demand, collection and balance of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 9,74,34,649. A sum of Rs. 9,50,80,902 or 97·6 per cent was collected within the fasli and Rs. 3,63,536 or 0·35 per cent written off the accounts. The collection of a sum of Rs. 647 was suspended or postponed. The percentage of collection to the collectable demand was therefore 97·96. The percentage of collection to demand during the previous fasli was 98·71, that written off was 0·45 and that suspended or postponed was 0·04. The percentage of collection to the collectable demand was 99·19. The land revenue concessions for Fasli 1355 have been dealt with in paragraph 11 (iv) above.

17. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 11,71,816, a sum of Rs. 8,52,662 or 72·76 per cent was collected and a sum of Rs. 1,36,253 or 11·63 per cent was written off the accounts. The Collection of Rs. 9,441 or 0·8 per cent was postponed or suspended. The percentage of collection in the previous fasli was 76·44 and that written off was 3·27.

18. *Balance.*—The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both arrears and current was Rs. 21,73,112 against Rs. 11,79,625 at the end of the previous fasli. As reported by the Collectors in their Demand, Collection and Balance statements for September 1946 the balance at the beginning of Fasli 1356 was Rs. 26,51,051. Up to the end of September 1946 a sum of Rs. 16,18,926 was collected and Rs. 7,467 written off the accounts. A sum of Rs. 8,578 was collected or adjusted after the close of the Treasury month. The net recoverable balance on 1st October 1946 was thus Rs. 10,16,080. Out of this amount, a sum of Rs. 6,30,220 was covered by orders of suspension or postponement in the Presidency. Deducting this amount the realizable balance on 1st October 1946 was Rs. 3,85,860.

19. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collections between land revenue and cesses is effected in the Collectors' offices after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year. Statements showing the amount of cesses collected during the fasli on behalf of the local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli, and the amount to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from Collectors, and verified by the Accountant-General. The recovery of overpayments, if any, is watched by the Board in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, L. & M., dated 7th December 1926.

20. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges in the land revenue department are shown in the accounts under the head "25. General Administration—District Administration and Miscellaneous." The district administration charges excluding village establishments amounted to Rs. 160·97 lakhs during fasli 1355. The village service charges including those of the proprietary estates during the fasli were Rs. 201·66 lakhs. The total charges amounted to Rs. 362·63 lakhs or 38·14 per cent of the total revenue and cess collected.

It has however to be borne in mind that the expenditure does not represent merely the cost of collecting the land revenue. The land revenue department performs multifarious duties of which the control and collection of land revenue is only one. The village establishment in particular has to render services to all departments of the Government; and as is well known, a very considerable portion of the [time of the Collector and his subordinate officers is taken up by magisterial work, civil supplies work, and a host of other

duties while the actual cost of collecting the land revenue cannot be estimated with any degree of accuracy, it is clearly far less than the amount of expenditure shown above.

21. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives particulars of coercive processes issued for the realization of the Government dues under Madras Act II of 1864. The following abstract shows the numbers of processes issued during fasli 1355, as compared with those for the three preceding faslis. It will be observed that there was a marked decrease under every item, when compared with fasli 1354.

22. *Demand notices.*—The number of demand notices issued during the fasli was less than that in fasli 1354 and only a little more than that in fasli 1353.

23. *Distrain or attachment notices.*—There was a large decrease in the number of distrain or attachment notices when compared with those of the three previous faslis.

24. *Percentage of distrain or attachment.*—The ratio of notices of distrain and attachment of personal property, to the total number of demand notices shows a decrease of 2·57 per cent when compared with the previous fasli. There is a decrease of 0·14 per cent in respect of real property.

The number of defaulters whose immovable properties were attached during the fasli was 995 against 2,166 in fasli 1354.

25. *Sale notices.*—Out of 11,255 defaulters whose properties were attached, 99 per cent paid up the arrears before sale notices were issued as against 98 per cent in the last fasli. The number of notices of sale were large in Tanjore (1,373) and Malabar (893).

26. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose properties were sold in the fasli was less than that in fasli 1354 by 257. There was a decrease in the number of sales of personal property by 115, and also in the number of sales of real property by 142. The percentage borne by the actual number of sales to the number of sale notices in the province is 2·7 against 6·18 in fasli 1354. The percentage of the number of defaulters whose properties were sold, to the total number of holdings is 0·000012 against 0·01 in the previous fasli.

Value of lands sold.—Immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 7,761 was sold for the recovery of Rs. 5,768. The estimated value of lands sold was disproportionate to the amount of arrears in some of the districts. The prices fetched for lands sold to private individuals amounted on the average to fourteen times the assessment in the case of dry lands and nine times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1354 immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 24,953 was sold for the recovery of arrears of Rs. 5,182, the amount realized being Rs. 14,767.

Extent of lands sold.—The extent of lands sold to private individuals in the fasli was 110.61 acres under dry and 75.35 acres under wet against acres 353.70 and 121 acres respectively in fasli 1354. The total area bought in by Government for want of bidders was 57.00 acres under dry and 35 acres under wet against 157.25 acres and 166 acres respectively in fasli 1354. The total area of lands sold was 277.96 acres against the total holdings of 7,189,106.

27. *Process service establishment.*—Statement No. 13 gives the particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency and by the special establishment, and of the fees realized during the fasli. The total number of processes served by the village agency was 529,126, i.e., 368 more than that in fasli 1354. The number of processes served by the special agency (4,965) was less than that in the previous fasli by 3,337.

28. *Civil suits.*—A sum of Rs. 17,902-14-1 was awarded to Government as costs during the fasli. Including the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 84,042-11-0 of which Rs. 23,599 was collected and Rupees 1,587-1-9 written off the accounts. The net recoverable balance at the end of fasli was Rs. 58,856-9-2.

29. *Interest on arrears of land revenue.*—The total demand on account of interest on arrears of land revenue including the balance at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 81,010 of which Rs. 15,294 was collected and Rs. 24,703 was remitted, leaving a balance of Rs. 41,013. The balance is nil in Kurnool, Coimbatore and the Nilgiris, and exceeds Rs. 1,000 in East Godavari, Nellore, Bellary, Chingleput, Chittoor, Tanjore, Madura and Malabar.

30. *Sale of lands under B.S.O. Nos. 15, 21, 45, 90, 91 and 197.*—1,322.17 acres of lands assessed at Rs. 2,931-14-0 were sold for Rs. 2,76,939-2-0 under B.S.O. No. 15. 9.16 acres of house-sites and town-sites with a ground-rent of Rs. 5,110-8-0 were sold for Rs. 22,166-6-0 under B.S.O. No. 21. An extent of 67.11 acres of land bought in by the Government at sales for arrears of land revenue were sold under B.S.O. No. 45 for Rs. 1,995. 49.11 acres of lands which had been acquired for public purposes but subsequently relinquished were sold under B.S.O. No. 90 for Rs. 6,873-8-0. An extent of 1.22 acres for which the Railways were not likely to have any further use was sold for Rs. 564-8-0 under B.S.O. No. 91. 1.92 acres of land were sold for Rs. 24 under B.S.O. No. 197. There were no disposals of tank-bed lands under B.S.O. No. 16 or of lands and buildings occupied by a Government department under B.S.O. No. 22.

31. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—In the fasli there were no cases of subdivision under B.S.O. No. 58 of the joint liability to pay quit-rent of shareholders in enfranchised inams.

32. *Jamabandi by Collectors.*—No jamabandi was conducted by Collectors during fasli 1355. The Government have ordered that the jamabandi by Collectors, which was suspended for the duration of the war, should be revived with effect from 1947—vide G.O. No. 2101, Revenue, dated 27th September 1946.

33. *Advances under Loans Acts.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and Agricultural Loans Acts during the year amounted to Rs. 26.87 lakhs as against Rs. 19.97 lakhs in the previous year. No amount was advanced during the year under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment), Act 1935, for the relief of agricultural indebtedness as this scheme was suspended by the Government for the duration of the war in G.O. Ms. No. 95 (S), Revenue, dated 11th August 1942.

34. *Loans—Demand, Collection and Balance (Principal).*—Including the uncollected balance at the end of the previous year, the amount repayable during the year on account of principal under both Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts was Rs. 28.56 lakhs as against Rs. 36.63 lakhs in the preceding year. Of this amount a sum of Rs. 20.33 lakhs or (71 per cent) was collected. A sum of Rs. 8.95 lakhs was repaid by the borrowers on account of loans the repayment of which had not fallen due, while a sum of Rs. 0.03 lakh was written off as irrecoverable. The bulk of the sum written off relates to Bellary district.

The amount of principal repayable during the year under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, was Rs. 1.94 lakhs of which Rs. 1.78 lakhs was collected.

35. *Loans—Demand Collection and Balance (Principal and Interest).*—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts including the balances relating to previous years was Rs. 31,24,416 of which a sum of Rs. 22,60,186 was collected and a sum of Rs. 3,260 was written off. The balance outstanding at the end of the year was Rs. 8,60,970 as against Rs. 6,08,510 in the previous year.

The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under the Agriculturists' Loans (Madras Amendment) Act, 1935, was Rs. 3,00,670 of which a sum of Rs. 2,76,973 was collected. The outstanding balance during the year was Rs. 23,697.

36. *Debt Conciliation Boards.*—The Debt Conciliation Boards were abolished in all the districts.

37. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing a general or collective notice in each village in accordance with B.P. No. 58-Sett., dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked well. The ryots were aware of the rules, and made timely representations to the jama-bandi officers. This resulted in the prompt investigation of objections and consequent reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission deterrent penalties were imposed.

38. *Cultivation of tank-bed lands.*—As a result of the Grow More Food campaign there was a considerable increase in cultivation of tank-bed lands. Wherever cultivation was permitted, ordinary rates were charged. Cases of objectionable cultivation were dealt with under the provisions of the Madras Land Encroachment Act.

39. *Cowles.*—During the fasli 8 acres of land were held on cowle for Rs. 10 as in the previous fasli.

40. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—Maintenance of these registers was fairly satisfactory and no general errors of a serious nature were disclosed.

41. *Taluk and village statistical registers.*—The Taluk Statistical Registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the districts of Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris. The village statistical registers were maintained in all ryotwari villages of the other districts.

42. *Minor Irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of minor irrigation works in charge of the Revenue department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1946. The statement also shows the number of minor irrigation works proposed for repairs during the official year ending 31st March 1947,

43. *Ryots' Conferences.*—Ryots' conferences were held in all the districts except Chingleput, Madura, Coimbatore and Malabar. These conferences enabled ryots to personally represent their views to the Government officers concerned, and in turn enabled the local officers to come into close contact with the ryots, and explain various aspects of Government policy.

44. *Inspection of subordinate offices by the Board, the Collectors and the Revenue Divisional Officers.*—All subordinate offices were inspected in fasli 1355 by the Collectors and the Revenue Divisional Officers. The Collectors' inspection of the Revenue Divisional Offices was generally thorough. The Board examined the notes of inspection of the Revenue Divisional Offices, and issued suitable instructions.

During the fasli under report the Members of the Board of Revenue inspected the offices of the Collectors of Vizagapatam, West Godavari, Nellore, Kurnool, Madras, Chittoor, South Arcot, South Kanara and Coimbatore with reference to the instructions in G.O. Ms. No. 2086, Revenue, dated 17th September 1942, and G.O. Ms. No. 2954, Revenue, dated 22nd November 1943, and found that the administration of the districts continued to be generally efficient.

45. *Administration of charitable and religious service inams.*—In their Memo. No. 1346-F/46-2, dated 29th May 1946, the Government ordered that the submission of the annual periodical statement showing the religious and charitable inams resumed during the year should continue to be suspended till 30th June 1947 (end of fasli 1356).

46. *Rent roll (Quinquennial).*—Statement No. 20 shows the number of pattas of various values held in the several districts of the Presidency for fasli 1355 (1945-46). Excluding Madras, where the land revenue consists mainly of quit-rent imposed on house-sites, the total number of pattas held during the last fasli of the quinquennium was 7,189,106. This was 499,282 more than at the end of the previous quinquennium. Of these, 223,020 were under single pattas and 276,262 were under joint pattas. There was an increase in all the districts except East Godavari and Chittoor where there was a decrease. In East Godavari there was a decrease of 10,368 pattas, while in Chittoor, there was a decrease of 738. The increase was marked in Guntur (266,602), Madura (40,302), Nellore (34,848), North Arcot (20,494) and Malabar (18,823). These districts contributed an increase of 381,069 or about 76 per cent of the total increase. The increase was mainly due to the grant of waste lands on darkhast; and to the splitting up of joint holdings, resulting in the grant of separate pattas after subdivision to the several former joint holders. The bulk of the increase under single and joint pattas was confined to pattas paying Rs. 10 and less but over Re. 1. The increase in this category came to 317,557 or about 64 per cent of the total increase. Of the total number of pattas held, 3,970,093 or about 55 per cent were assessed at Rs. 10 and less but over Re. 1 a year, the gross assessment thereon being Rs. 1,50,21,669. In respect of pattas paying Rs. 10 and less but over Re. 1, the average extent of land held worked out to about 3 acres, and the average assessment to Rs. 4. The bulk of the land covered by these small holdings was dry (9,394,309 acres).
