

# Report on the working of the Workmen's Compensation Act (VIII of 1923) for the year 1940

The District Officers throughout the Province continued to work as Commissioners under the Act. No particular difficulty was reported by them in the working or administration of the Act.

During the year under report, the number of factories increased from 626 to 654, and the average daily number of workers employed showed a corresponding increase from 159,738 in 1939 to 179,735 in the year under report; about 96.5 per cent. of this force was adult male. With the increase in the number of factories and of the number of workers employed therein, the number of accidents also increased from 2,632 in 1939 to 3,348 during the year under report. Of these accidents 41 were fatal, 536 serious, and 2,771 minor. Of the 536 serious accidents all, but 15, were recorded as such due to the injured persons being off duty for 21 days or more.

The incidence of accidents per 100 workers during the last three years, viz. 1938, 1939 and 1940 shows a constant increase. In 1938, the incidence was 1.53, in 1939: 1.65, and in 1940, the year under report, 1.86. The increase in the number of recorded accidents is partly attributable to better reporting on the part of the mill authorities as a result of the vigilance and care exercised by the supervisory staff.

The following statement shows the number of accidents of each kind for which compensation was paid during 1940 and also the amount of compensation. Corresponding information for the last year is also given:

(Three cases of death, and three cases of permanent disablement have not been included as appeals in these cases were pending at the end of the year 1940 in the High Court of Judicature at Allahabad.)

The year opened with a pending list of 58 cases. One case relating to a railway establishment other than a railway workshop or running shed, and one case which was shown as pending at the conclusion of the previous year both under section 10 and under section 8 have been excluded from the cases shown in the column "Pending at commencement" of the Return A of this year. One hundred and thirty-one cases were instituted during the year as against 127 in the previous year.

Forty-two cases were received for disposal from other Commissioners and eleven were transferred. There were thus 220 cases for disposal out of which 150 were disposed of, leaving a balance of 70.

During the year 94 agreements for payment of compensation were registered against 88 in the previous year. Of these 88 were for permanent disablement, and 6 for temporary disablement. As usual, Campore tops the list with 24 agreements.

The majority of those who were awarded compensation drew a monthly salary not exceeding Rs.18. Thus 59 out of 85 victims of fatal accidents, and 34 out of 50 persons permanently disabled belonged to this wage class. This fact shows that the low paid and unsk lled workers suffer most from accidents due to their carelessness and to their lack of training in the skilful handling of machines. A great drive is, therefore, needed to pursuade the employers, to set up safety first committees in their mills and to provide their workmen with adequate training in the use of safety first devices.

No appeal or reference under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, was filed in the Chief Court of Oudh. Appeals in six cases were filed in the High Court of Judicature at Allahabad. All the six cases were pending decision at the end of the year under report.
