Subject.—Report on the Administration of the Workmen's Compensation Act in the Central Provinces and Berar for the year 1946.

SIR,

With reference to paragraph 3 of letter No. L-4037, dated the 11th February 1947, from the Assistant Secretary to the Government of India, Department of Labour, I am directed by the Governor of the Central Provinces and Berar, to forward a brief report on the Administration of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, in the Central Provinces and Berar, during the year 1946, together with the prescribed returns A, B and C.

2. During the year under report, 301 accidents were reported to the Provincial Government under the Indian Mines Act of 1923, of which 22 were fatal and the rest were either serious or minor. In the factories coming under the purview of the Factories Act, 1934, there occurred 9 fatal, 62 serious and 1,764 minor accidents.

## REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1923 (VIII OF 1923), IN THE C. P. & BERAR, DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1946.

[The figures in brackets denote corresponding figures of 1945)

The number of Commissioners under the Act remained unchanged during the year under report.

#### RETURN A

- 2. Award of Compensation (under Section 10).—Thirty-three applications were pending at the commencement of the year, of which 15 related to fatal accidents, 17 to permanent disablement and one to temporary disablement. Forty-four applications were filed during the year, 14 relating to fatal accidents, 29 to permanent disablement and one to temporary disablement. Fifty-four applications were disposed of during the year; one was withdrawn, four dismissed for non-appearance, two summarily dismissed under rule 21, five admitted by the opposite party, 16 allowed in full, 14 allowed in part and 12 dismissed after contest by the opposite party. Twenty-three applications were pending at the close of the year.
- 3. Commutation (under Section 7), review (under Section 6) and recovery of compensation (under Section 31).—No applications were filed during the year under report.
- 4. Proceedings other than award of compensation and deposits (under Section 8).—No applications were filed during the year under report.
- 5. Deposits (under Section 8).—At the commencement of the year under report, 46 proceedings were pending. Ninety-one proceedings were filed during the year. Of these 137 proceedings, 103 were disposed of, leaving 34 pending.
- 6. Court-fees.—The amount of court-fees realized slightly decreased to Rs. 171-8-0 [Rs. 174-11-0].

#### RETURN B

7. Thirty-eight memoranda of agreements were pending from the previous year, 31 for payment of compensation for permanent disablement and seven for temporary disablement. One hundred and seventy-five memoranda were received during the year making a total of 213 memoranda for disposal. Of these 213 memoranda, 174 were registered without modification, two after modification, three not registered on account of other causes and 34 remained pending at the close of the year. The amount of compensation involved in the 174 [173] agreements registered was Rs. 60,413-0-9 [Rs. 33,951-13-6].

#### RETURN C

8. During the year under report, compensation was awarded in 132 [99] cases, of which 96 (92 men and 4 women) related to fatal accidents, 34 (27 men and 7 women) to per manent disablement and 2 (1 man and 1 woman) to temporary disablement.

- 9. Appeals and References.—Three appeals under Section 30 pending from the previous year remained pending at the close of the year. No new appeals were filed. No reference under Section 27 of the Act was pending from the last year and no new reference was made during the year.
- 10. Compensation deposited.—The opening balance was Rs. 60,013 [Rs. 29,529] and the amount of compensation deposited during the year was Rs. 86,799 [Rs. 94,686] including Rs. 35,503 [Rs. 22,380] from railways. In addition Rs. 20,431 [Rs. 8,903] was received from other Commissioners. Rs. 96,834 [Rs. 60,155] was awarded to dependants and Rs. 15,796 [Rs. 9,755] paid to workmen and Rs. 2,816 [Rs. 796] refunded to the depositors, leaving a balance of Rs. 51,797 [Rs. 60,013] at the end of the year.
- 11. Included in the amounts allotted (see paragraph 10) to women and persons under a legal disability were the following sums, invested as shown:—

Rs. 70,773 [Rs. 49,586] in Post Office Savings Bank; and
Rs. 2,441 [Rs. 2,476] in Post Office Cash Certificates.

The remaining amount has either been paid to the dependants or held in personal deposit account.

- 12. Employers' returns (under Section 16).—A summary of the annual returns furnished by the employers is annexed. The laxity on the part of employers in submitting the annual returns continues in spite of the fact that the provisions of Section 18-A of the Act are freely made use of. One return was received from the Insurance Company in Nagpur on behalf of their clients.
  - 13. The working of the Act is on the whole satisfactory.
