SEASON AND CROP REPORT OF THE CENTRAL PROVINCES AND BERAR FOR THE YEAR ENDING THE 31ST MAY 1945.

[NOTE.—Figures in brackets represent the corresponding figures of the previous year.]

1. The area to which these returns relate is 38,014,788 acres in the Central Provinces (38,010,115) and 11,378,699 acres (11,378,667) in Berar and covers all villages surveyed for land records purposes. The total provincial area shows a small increase of 4,705 acres which calls for no explanation.

2. Light to moderate showers of rain were received in the first fortnight of June in parts of several districts. In the second fortnight, although there were moderate to fairly heavy showers of rain almost all over the province, the monsoon was not well established. The total rainfall received till the end of the month was much below the normal in many districts and was insufficient for agricultural purposes. Broadcast sowing of paddy was taken up in parts of the Chattisgarh division in the first half of June but the regular sowings of kharif crops such as paddy, cotton, juar and groundnut were retarded by about a fortnight. With the timely and well-distributed showers over the greater part of the province in the last week of the month, sowings were taken up on a large scale. In July, the monsoon became active and yielded moderate to heavy and generally continuous rain everywhere, with occasional short spells of sunshine towards the end of the month in the cotton tract. High floods also occurred in the third week of July in the Harsud tahsil (Nimar). Sowings of paddy and cotton which were hampered to some extent could only be completed by the end of July. Sowings of juar, kodon-kutki, til and minor kharif crops were prolonged even after the close of the month. Germination was, on the whole, satisfactory save some resowing of cotton and juar over areas adversely affected by excessive rain or floods. A break with bright sunshine was needed everywhere to push through field operations and to stimulate the growth of crops. During the first three weeks of August, the weather was cloudy with moderate to heavy and continuous rainfall throughout the province while in the last week the rainfall was light with useful spells of sunshine. Sowings of juar, late kutki, jagni and til continued in some districts. The areas damaged were ploughed up and partly resown with kharif crops and partly left for rabi. Transplantation and thinning operations were done in time but weeding and intercultural operations were delayed owing to excessive precipitation and could only be carried out during the short breaks. As a result, the standing crops were stunted in growth and suffered a considerable damage, especially in low-lying and water-logged areas. In September, moderate to heavy showers were received with longer breaks and bright sunshine at intervals which enabled the crops to be properly weeded and intercultivated. The standing crops also thrived well and a continuance of the seasonable weather was all that was required for the reaping of a good harvest. October was partly clear and partly cloudy. Precipitation was light to moderate with fairly heavy showers towards the end of the month. Except for slight damage to paddy, cotton and juar in Chanda, to cotton in Nagpur and to cotton and juar in the Nimar districts, the condition of kharif crops showed a steady improvement. Harvesting of early paddy, groundnut and other minor crops continued. Sowings of rabi, though interrupted in parts of many districts owing to rains, were in progress. Except for some rain in the beginning of November and in the third week of December in certain districts, the weather during these two months was clear and cool. Sowing of rabi was completed and the condition

of the growing rabi crops was satisfactory but wheat plants on light soils withered to some extent on account of lack of moisture in the soil. Picking of cotton and harvesting of other kharif crops were in progress. In January, the weather was cold and mostly cloudy with light to heavy rain almost throughout the province. The rain was accompanied by light hail in parts of the Saugor, Jubbulpore, Hoshangabad, Nimar, Drug, Bilaspur and Buldana districts, causing slight damage to crops at places in the Hoshangabad district. A cold wave passed through Wardha and Chhindwara districts in the beginning of January and caused damage to pulses in flower in the latter district. Rust also made its appearance on wheat in the irrigated and embanked fields in parts of the Jubbulpore division and also on linseed in places in the Jubbulpore and Chanda districts. Picking of cotton and threshing of other kharif crops were in progress. Harvesting of linseed, gram and minor rabi pulses commenced in a few districts. During February the weather was clear and cool with a gradual rise in day-temperatures. Light rain fell in parts of the Chhattisgarh division and in the Mandla and Chanda districts. Rust developed on and caused considerable damage to wheat in the Saugor and Hoshangabad districts and to a lesser extent in other districts of the Jubbulpore division and Nagpur division, particularly in low-lying, irrigated and late-sown areas. Insects also caused some damage to gram and lakh in the northern districts. The standing rabi crops were otherwise in a fairly good condition. The kharif harvest was gathered. Harvesting, threshing and winnowing of rabi crops had commenced. During March the weather was clear and warm while in April and May the sky was more frequently overcast with clouds and there were light to moderate showers of rain in many districts. The showers were accompanied by high winds and hail in a few districts. These caused slight damage to garden and fruit crops in the Nagpur district. Threshing and winnowing of rabi crops were completed and the usual summer field operations were in progress. On the whole, the season was not favourable to both kharif and rabi crops with the exception of paddy.

For the Central Provinces the total outturn of all crops as given by the Deputy Commissioners in comparison with the normal area and normal outturn stood at 80 per cent (86 per cent) and in Berar 69 per cent (83 per cent) of the normal.

3. The areas sown with kharif or autumn crops in the Central Provinces and Berar together declined from 19,596,144 acres to 18,714,007 acres or by 4.5 per cent as compared with the previous year and 0.4 per cent as compared with the average of the last five years; while that under rabi increased from 8,512,671 acres to 9,049,565 acres or by 6.3 per cent as compared with the previous year and by about 9 per cent with the average of the previous five years. The area under kharif crops declined in almost all the districts in the province which is due to excessive rainfall of the early monsoon which necessitated ploughing up of some areas, particularly under cotton and juar. The expansion under rabi area is partly owing to favourable conditions at sowing time and partly to the sowing of rabi where cotton and juar were ploughed up. The areas under kharif and rabi taken together show a slight fall of 1.2 per cent. Variations in the areas under the important crops are as follows:—

- (i) Rice increased by 148,505 acres or by 3.0 per cent.
- (ii) Juar and juar-tur decreased by 494,611 acres or by 8 per cent.
- (iii) Cotton and cotton-tur decreased by 418,968 acres or by 12 per cent.

- (iv) Til (sesamum) decreased by 59,858 acres or by 14 per cent.
 (v) Wheat and wheat-gram rose by 120,437 acres or by 4 per cent.
 (vi) Linseed and linseed-gram decreased by 5,120 acres or by 0.4 per cent.
 (vii) Kodon-kutki declined by 250,546 acres or by 14 per cent.

5. Prices.—The prices of the principal crops ruling at harvest time at each district headquarters station in the province show that on an average the wholesale prices of rice, juar, wheat and gram declined by 5, 9, 14 and 16 per cent, respectively, while those of til and linseed rose by 20 and 32 per cent when compared with the harvest prices in the previous year.

Prices of short staple cotton ruled between Rs. 123 and Rs. 135 (between Rs. 95 and Rs. 134), of jarilla between Rs. 135 and Rs. 180 (between Rs. 150 and Rs. 163), of verum between Rs. 147 and Rs. 155 (between Rs. 135 and Rs. 155) and of cambodia between Rs. 128 and Rs. 150 (between Rs. 130 and Rs. 163). The price of buri cotton was Rs. 143 (Rs. 167) at the Khandwa market.

6. The approximate total valuation of certain important crops, such as rice, wheat, juar, gram, til, linseed, cotton, tur, kodon-kutki and masur based on the harvest prices ruling on 28th February 1945 in the case of kharif crops and on 31st May 1945 in the case of rabi crops, is compared below with the value of these crops in the previous year and also with the total land revenue.

7. **Agricultural prosperity or deterioration.**—The condition of agriculturists continued much the same as in the preceding year. There was no agricultural deterioration in any part of the province despite the fact that conditions were not altogether favourable to the crops except rice. The comparatively poor harvest of the year was compensated by the prevailing high prices of all agricultural commodities.

8. **Condition of agricultural population.**—The general increase in the cost of living consequent on the abnormal rise in the prices of the necessaries of life, did not tell upon the economic condition of the agriculturist, to any remarkable extent for the reason stated in the preceding paragraph. Taccavi loans were given to the tenantry on a liberal scale in connection with the Grow More Food scheme for the purchase and distribution of seeds, manures, construction and repairs of wells, embankments and for other land improvement purposes. The agricultural labourers had sufficient employment on high wages throughout the year.
