Resolution on the working of Local Boards in Assam during 1939-40

Extract from the proceedings of the Government of Assam in the Local Self-Government Department, No.1588-L.S.-G.(B), dated Shillong, the 2nd June 1941.

READ:—

- (1) The Divisional reports from the Commissioner of Divisions on the working of Local Boards during 1939-40.
- (2) The report on the working of the Local Audit Department in Assam during the year 1939-40.

There was no change in the number or constitution of Local Boards in the province during the year under report. The total number of meetings—ordinary and special—increased from 204 to 219, although some Boards did not hold the prescribed minimum number of meetings. Only one meeting was abortive. The number of adjourned meetings was 11. There was a decrease in the attendance of non-official members. The highest percentage of attendance was held by Dhubri and the lowest by Sibsagar.

The following statement shows the total income and expenditure of all Boards for 1938-39 and 1939-40.

On the receipt side there are substantial changes under "Land Revenue", "Provincial rates", "Police", "Education", "Medical" and "Civil Works". Reasons for the variations are stated below :—

Land Revenue.—Realisation of arrears and sale of bazars at higher bids, better collection of revenue and credit of security deposits for the year 1940-41 made by transfer credit to a board's funds account for the increase under this head.

Provincial rates.—The increase in provincial rates is due to adjustment during the year under report of the difference between the amount of local rates credited to provincial revenues and the amount of compensatory grants received from Government during the preceding year.

Police.—The increase under 'Police' is due to increase of pound receipts.

Education.—The increase under "Education" is mainly due to increased Government grants.

Medical.—The decrease under 'Medical' is more apparent than real. The increase in the preceding year is accounted for mainly by the fact that the receipts for that year included a large amount of public subscriptions for the maternity ward of the Goalpara dispensary.

Civil Works.—The decrease under 'Civil Works' is mainly due to a heavy fall in the receipt under License fees on vehicles other than motor vehicles.

On the expenditure side there are important variations under "General Administration", "Education", "Medical" and "Civil Works", the reasons for which are detailed below :—

General Administration.—The increase under "General Administration" in the previous year was due to the General Elections held at the close of the year 1937-38.

Education.—The increased expenditure under the head Education is mainly due to larger expenditure on Middle Vernacular and Primary Schools and for taking over of venture schools.

Medical.—The decrease of expenditure under Medical is mainly due to less expenditure on account of "Epidemic charges".

Civil Works.—The decrease of expenditure under "Civil Works" occurred under the heads "Communications" and "Water supply", both original and repair works. This is mainly due to paucity of funds.

The progress made during the year is summarised below :—

Education.—Middle English Schools decreased by one in the Surma Valley. Middle Vernacular Schools increased by 1 and Primary Schools by 246. The increase of Primary Schools was due to larger grants from provincial revenues for the expansion of primary education. The demand for such expansion is on the increase and many venture schools await recognition. The local authorities slow to find means to improve their resources cannot meet the demand and look to Government for further aid, forgetting that there are other demands which have the first claim on provincial revenues. A tendency to play up to the popular demand even at the sacrifice of quality for quantity is noticeable. Instances are not wanting where untrained teachers have been preferred to trained ones.

Medical.—The number of dispensaries increased by three in the Assam Valley. The demand for more medical aid remained unsatisfied for lack of money. Generous offers from public-spirited gentlemen have provided some relief. The amount of subscriptions collected for dispensaries continued to be small although the system of levying a fee of one anna on new patients is reported to have been working well.

Epidemic cholera broke out in some parts of Sunamganj, but was checked by the timely action of the Subdivisional Medical Officer and the Public Health and Local Board staff. There were epidemics of small-pox in North Sylhet, Karimganj, South Sylhet and Sunamganj. Karimganj and Sunamganj employed temporary vaccinators.

Kala-azar and Leprosy cases continued to be treated in some Local Boards' dispensaries. The Leper Asylum at Barpeta is reported to be doing good work. Preparations were made for the establishment of a Tuberculosis clinic at Dhubri and His Excellency the Governor presented a donation. It is expected that the lead thus given will be followed by public-spirited gentlemen of the district. The recrudescence of *Kala-azar* in Golaghat caused dismay among the people. The Local Board and the Public Health Department arranged to check the disease. An indoor hospital was established at Government's expense and the headquarters of the Assistant Director of Public Health were also transferred temporarily to Golaghat.

Sanitation.—Progress in respect of improving the existing sources and providing fresh sources of rural water supply was maintained with the aid of the Government of India's grant for rural uplift. Some of the Boards took over for maintenance a number of ring and tube wells constructed from this grant. Vaccination and re-vaccination continued as usual.

Veterinary.—Veterinary work appears to have gained increasing popularity as is shown by the increase in the number of inoculations and treatments. The demand for service is beyond the capacity of the staff available, but it was not possible to add to the number for lack of money. There was no increase in the number of dispensaries except at Nowgong by two. A second Veterinary Assistant was appointed by the Hailakandi Board. Cases of cattle poisoning were reported at Sunamganj and the Board issued leaflets for distribution among the people to warn them against such poisoning. The Field Assistants—42 in number, appointed by Government—were reported to have given useful service.

Audit.—The accounts of all the Boards in the Surma Valley except North Sylhet and those of the Goalpara, Barpeta, Tezpur, Mangaldai, Nowgong, North Lakhimpur and Dibrugarh in the Assam Valley were audited during the year. The Examiner reports that the accounts were kept in good order. The financial position of Habiganj, Karimganj and Sunamganj was very bad. A case in which a tax collector kept back money, was detected by the Board's Office at Tezpur. The tax collector was dismissed. A case of mis-appropriation in connection with the purchase of postage and service stamps from the treasury was detected at Habiganj by the Examiner, Local Accounts. The clerk concerned was punished by the Board with reduction of pay and with stoppage of increment for two years. The procedure of drawing cheques in favour of the Chairman and obtaining cash for purchase of stamps, etc. which facilitated the mis-appropriation, etc., and Government must again indicate the need for watching the subordinate staff.

Inspection.—The Commissioner of Divisions inspected all the Boards in the province.

The Silchar and South Sylhet Local Board Offices were inspected by the Hon'ble Minister, Local Self-Government. The Hon'ble Premier and Hon'ble Ministers, Local Self-Government and Revenue visited the Sunamganj Local Board Office.

General.—The financial position of the Boards continued to be unsatisfactory. Government advise them to imitate the Silchar and Habiganj Boards whose members voted for increases of local rate by three pies and two pies in the rupee respectively. Government once again commend the example of those members and officers of various Boards who do not draw travelling allowance for attending meetings. They, however, regret to note that a proposal in the Tezpur Board to cease giving such an allowance was opposed by some members.

At some places especially at Jorhat and Tezpur, useful work was hampered by party faction.

Government appreciate the difficulties of Local Boards. To enable the Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen to discuss outstanding problems, two conferences—one at Gauhati and the other at Sylhet—were called, and were presided over by the present Hon'ble Minister, Local Self-Government. The informal decisions reached at these conferences will come up for consideration by the Boards in due course and it is expected that a common policy will be evolved in certain matters of interest.

Government thank the Commissioner of Divisions for his interesting report on the Assam Valley Local Boards and place on record their appreciation of the work done by the various gentlemen noted in the divisional reports.
