# Annual Report on the working of the District Boards in the North-West Frontier Province, for the year 1940-41.

THE PROPERTY AND ACTOR

I. The year 1940-41 was marked by the supersession of two Boards those of Bannu and Hazara Districts. Government found it necessary to issue orders of supersession in September and November 1940 because these Boards were found generally inefficient. Bannu District Board was financially crippled to such an extent that a loan of Rs. 40,000 had to be raised out of the Provident Fund deposits of its employees to meet arrear claims and to balance the budgets for 1940-41 and 1941-42.

The Administration of the Bannu District Board was entrusted to the Treasury Officer, Bannu, working under the Deputy Commissioner.

In the Hazara District the administration of the Board was entrusted to the Deputy Commissioner but in order to give members of the public experience in the administration in local bodies, and to enable him to keep touch with public opinion, an Advisory Council of 27 nominated members was associated with him.

- 2. Twelve Congress members in Peshawar and eight in Mardan resigned their seats on the Boards in December 1940 and March 1941, thus reducing the total number of members of these Boards from 20 and 15 to 8 and 7 respectively. Bye-elections were held to fill up two vacancies in Lakki and Teri Wards of the Kohat District. The members from both these constituencies were elected un-opposed. The constitution of the remaining Boards remained unchanged during the year under report.
- of the District Boards held during the year was 28 and 18 against 25 and 18, respectively, in the preceding year. Of the 46 meetings held during the year none was adjourned for want of a quorum. The average percentage of attendance of members at meetings was lower than last year, viz. 74 against 86 per cent. This fall mainly occurred in the Peshawar District Board and was due to the existence of dead-lock.

4. The following activities are worthy of notice :-

(1)

(a) The Government grant to District Boards for education increased by about Rs. 42,000 with the result that many new schools were opened thus expanding the educational activities of the Boards.

(b) A Civil Dispensary and a Veterinary Hospital were opened at Lora in the Hazara District.

(c) Works costing about Rs. 2,000 each were financed by the District Boards of Hazara and Kohat for the improvement of water supply in their Ilakas.

(d) The Deputy Commissioner, Hazara, inaugurated a scheme to get routine repairs to District Board roads executed by the villagers themselves on payment of an annual grant which varies with the nature of the roads and the mileage within the village boundaries. The scheme is reported to have worked well.

(e) The District Board, Hazara, increased its allotment for subsidized bulls and rams from Rs. 1,500 to Rs. 3,000 thus equalizing it with the Government grant of Rs. 3,000.

5. Public Health on the whole was good. But in Hazara and Kohat Districts there were outbreaks of cholera and small-pox resulting in 936 cases and 425 deaths.

6. The total income excluding opening balance of all the District Boards in the Province rose from Rs. 16,45,887 in the preceding year to Rs. 16,99,920 and the total expenditure from Rs. 17,17,135 to Rs. 18,28,986.

The increase of Rs. 54,033 in income is due to the additional grant of a sum of Rs. 42,000 by Government for educational purposes and recovery of local rate arrears for the past year.

7. The expansion of Rs. 1,11,851 on the expenditure side is shared by all the District Boards except Mardan and occurs mainly under heads "Education" "Medical" and "Miscellaneous". The rise of about Rs. 45,000 in educational expenditure is counterbalanced by the Government grant of Rs. 42,000. The opening

of a new Civil Dispensary at Lora in the Hazara District involving an extra expenditure of Rs. 3,000 and the payment of arrear dues amounting to about Rs. 14,000 in respect of maintenance charges of lunatics for the years 1938-39 and 1939-40 by the Peshawar District Board account for the increase under head "Medical". The increase in expenditure under head "Miscellaneous" is due to the contribution of a sum of Rs. 1,000 towards the North-West Frontier Province Fighter Aeroplane Fund and purchase of Defence Bonds for Rs. 30,000 by the Peshawar District Board.

The expenditure incurred by the District Board, Peshawar, under head "Medical" and "Miscellaneous" is the highest in the Province. This is due to:—

- (1) opening of four new dispensaries and payment of arrears on account of maintenance charges of lunatics for the years 1938-39 and 1939-40, and,
- (2) purchase of Defence Bonds for Rs. 30,000 by that Board during the year under report.

9. The financial condition of the Reshawar and Dera Ismail Khan District Boards is deteriorating. The increase in the closing balance of District Board, Bannu is due to a loan from Provident Fund deposits of its employees; otherwise it would have had minus closing balance.

10. The fact that two Boards have had to be superseded is sufficient indication that the replacement of nomination by elections is not working altogether satisfactorily. Many of the persons elected have no knowledge of administration of public affairs and some are actually illiterate. Some of them carry party feeling and even private enmities and jealousies into the Board room. As each member wishes to do something to please his constituents, there is a natural tendency towards extravagance. Dispensaries and so on are not located where they are most needed, but for reasons of party politics. However much supersession may be regretted on other grounds, it appears to be popular with the public whose experience of elected Boards has on the whole been bitter. There has been a decided tendency for Boards to interfere with the appointment, promotion and punishment of employees, instead of leaving this as much as possible to the Secretary. The life of employees becomes difficult when they know that their prospects depend upon gaining favour with the dominant party on the Board. Secretaries have experienced difficulty in ensuring that Boards obey the orders of Government, especially as regards finance. There have been numerous instances where Boards have irregularly incurred expenditure which required the previous approval of the Revenue Commissioner or the Local Government. In order to finance popular projects, the "INCOME" side of the budget is sometimes fictitiously inflated. When actuals fall short of estimates, the difference has to be made up from the Board's accumulated balance or investments. The working of the Kohat District Board has been more successful than others. It is feared that the resignation of Congress Members from certain Boards may have reduced their numbers to appoint where these Boards will be unable to function satisfactorily and may have to be replaced by Administrators.
