



Review by His Excellency the Governor North-West Frontier Province, on the Annual Report of Hospitals and Dispensaries in the North-West Frontier Province, for the year 1951.

The shortage of Medical Staff particularly Assistant Medical Officers remained serious during the year. There were 121 A. M. O. posts in the cadre and of these 78 could not be filled. The reason for this is that Licenciates are no longer produced in West Pakistan, and Graduates who have obtained their M. B., B. S. are taken direct into service as Assistant Surgeons. It is likely, therefore, that the A. M. O's. grade will gradually die out. There clearly remains a need in the Medical Service for a class of officers not so highly trained, or at such expense, as M. B., B. S. degree holders.

The further important branch of the Service in which sufficient staff is still not available is the Nursing cadre. The post of Matron of the T. B. Sanatorium Dadar was vacant as were a number of posts of staff nurses. It seems probable, considering the conditions of service of the nursing staff in this Province, especially in the older Hospitals, that this shortage cannot be made good without substantially increasing the rates of pay.

The year under Review saw the inception of the various Social Uplift Schemes financed by a grant from the Central Government. The majority of these schemes will not be completed until 1952 or 1953, but nevertheless it is encouraging to see that during 1951, several major improvements in the Medical facilities in the Pronvince were made. For instance a completely new modern Hospital, containing 80 beds was opened by His Excellency the Governor-General in Kohat where the old Civil Hospital is being converted into a Zanana Hospital. A modern T. B. Clinic and T. B. Wards containing 80 beds were construsted at the Lady Reading Hospital, Peshawar, and a Class I T. B. Specialist placed in charge. Again the old T. B. Wards are being converted into female wards, and it is the policy of the Government to pay particular attention to the provision of Medical facilities for the women, hitherto somewhat neglected, at the same time as improving the facilities for men.

At the Dadar Sanitorium, which now ranks the premier institution of its kind in Pakistan, 16 bedded ward and 2 cottages were constructed during the year, and land was purchased upon which 14 new general wards are intended to be built during 1952. The Sanitorium remained full to capacity, and its popularity throughout Pakistan increases

At the close of the year 125 more beds were available in hospitals in the Province than at the close of the previous year.

The number of patients treated has shown a steady increase, both in the various hospitals of the Province and under the various disease headings, with the exception of Malaria, which appears to be decreasing although it remains the most wide-spread disease of the province. 5,82,000 Malaria cases were treated as compared with 7,23,000 during the previous year.

The number of major operations performed during the year, both in the Agencies and in the settled districts, was 5485 of which 1522 were in the Lady Reading Hospital and 702 in the Afghan Mission Hospital, Peshawar, the remaining hospitals in the Province showing considerably smaller figures.

The Provincial Government notes with regret the comparatively poor results achieved by the policy of conscription of doctors so far as this Province is concerned, only 11 allocated doctors from outside the North-West Frontier Province having reported for duty during the year. The shortages of staff is serious both in the ranks of the senior and more qualified men with sufficient sense of responsibility to take charge of large hospitals, and in the ranks of those who are less highly trained and who are so urgently required for the smaller rural hospitals and dispensaries which are now frequently left in charge of compounders. Considering these serious shortages the Provincial Government feels that good progress is being made in increasing the Medical facilities, and that the efforts to raise the standard of service in the hospitals are satisfactory and it takes this opportunity to thank K.B. Abdus Samad Khan, who held the post of Director of Health Services, North-West Frontier Province, during the year under Review, also the staff under him, for their work

Subject:—Annual Report on the Hospitals and Dispensaries in the North-West Frontier Province for the year, 1951.

Sir,

I have the honour to submit the Annual Report, in duplicate, on the hospitals and dispensaries in the North-West Frontier Province and Frontier Regions for the year 1951 for the information of Government.

2. Administration-

The post of Inspector-General of Civil Hospitals, (now Director of Health Services) North-West Frontier Province, was held by me throughout the year.

I. M. S. OFFICERS.

3. Personnel

No officer of the ex-Indian Medical Service was employed in any of the District/Agency or Civil Medical Institutions in the Province during the year under report.

4. Building-

A modern T.B. Clinic and 80-bedded T.B. Ward has been constructed in the Lady Reading Hospita, Peshawar at a cost of about 4 lakhs of rupees. The old T.B. Ward has been converted into a 30-bedded female Ward. Besides this 5 rooms in the Bolton Block of Lady Reading Hospital, Peshawar are also being extended for patients by conversion of the rooms at present occupied by the staff of the office of the Civil Surgeon, Peshawar. The total accommodation of Lady Reading Hospital, Peshawar will thus be incresased to 415 during the ensuing year.

The following works have also been sanctioned from the grant under Social Uplift for execution during 1951-52 and 1952-53.

- (1) Complexion of new 100-bedded Civil Hospital, at Kohat.
- (2) Opening of a Training School for Pharmacists and Compounders.
- (3) Improvements of present T. B. Clinic and Ward at Dera Ismail Khan.
- (4) Construction of 28-bedded Ward in Civil Hospital, Dera Ismail Khan.
- (5) Completion of T. B. Clinic and Ward at Mardan.
- (6) Construction of 20-bedded Ward at Civil Hospital, Tank.
- (7) Construction of a New Hospital at Lora.
- (8) Modernization of Civil Hospital at Darband.
- (9) Construction of a New Hospital at Balakot.
- (10) Construction of a New Hospital, at Kaghan.
- (11) Construction of a New Hospital, at Pabbi.
- (12) Opening of Lepers Colony at Balakot.
- (13) Opening of a 50 bedded Zenana Hospital, at Mardan.

Some of the above noted works are nearing completion while the others are in progress.

Similarly about 12 acres of ideal building site for expansion at Dadar Sanitorium has been acquired. Plans and estimates for new constructions have been prepared and work has been started on several new Wards. It is hoped that before the close of the ensuing year fourteen new general wards with accommodation for 132 persons would be ready for admission of patients. This would raise the total bed strength of the Sanitorium to 290. Plans and estimates for an up-to-date modern operation block, including eight recovery rooms and for the enlargement and improvement of the existing X-Ray department, are also ready. Funds for these works have also been allotted and it is hoped to have these important buildings ready within the next Calendar year.

5. Nursing Staff-

The Nursing Staff remained under strength as in the previous years. The post of Matron at T. B. Sanitorium at Dadar remained vacant during the year. The shortage of staff Nurses at the Sanitorium also continued.

SHORT NOTES ON STATEMENTS "A" TO "F"

6. Statement "A"-

There were 223 hospitals and dispensaries at the commencement of the year under report and 16 additional hospitals and dispensaries (including the Lepers Colony at Bolakot which was in-advertantly not shown in the previous reports) were opened. Seven hospitals and dispensaries were closed and thus there were 230 hospitals and dispensaries at the close of the year.

7. Statement "C"-

The following table shows the number of patients treated, their daily average number, death rate and number of beds etc., available during the year 1950 and 1951.

9. Statement "D"-

During the year 1951 the number of patients treated in all classes of hospitals and dispensaries was 3,053,912 against 2,764,235 during the previous year.

Cholera-

The province remained free from Cholera epidemic during the year.

Malaria-

The total number of patients treated for Malaria was 582,099 with 10 deaths as compared with 723,143 cases with 11 deaths in 1950. Treatment of Malarial cases was carried out with Quinine, Mepacrine, Quinacrine, Paludrine and Totaquiana etc., which were issued in sufficient quantities to all Civil Surgeons in the Province.

Tuberculosis-

During 1951 a total number of 8277 cases of T. B. of lungs and 5859 cases of other forms of T. B. received treatment in hospitals as against 7641 and 5364 respectively in the year 1950.

During the year 239 cases were treated in the T. B. Sanitorium, Dadar out of these 133 patients were remaining from the last year and 106 patients were admitted during the year and 111 were discharged leaving 128 patients under treatment at the end of the year.

The lowest average number of patients for any month in 1951 was 130.06 in the month of December, 1951 and the highest 157.74 in the month of August, 1951.

Excellent work is being done in this Institution which is gaining its popularity on account of its Medical Superintendent Khan Bahadur, Dr. Saeed Ahmad Khan. It ranks as the premier T. B Institution in Pakistan.

A 16-bedded General Ward and 2 cottages have been constructed during the year. Necessity for the construction of residential quarters for the staff of the Sanitorium still stands and it is hoped that accommodation will be provided to all during the financial year 1952-53.

Each general ward has now got a Radio Set of its own mostly provided by private donations through the efforts of the patients themselves. The library has now 1306 books.

Typhus Fever-

794 cases of Typhus Fever with 2 deaths occurred in the following districts/Agencies of the province:—

Necessary preventive measures were taken by the respective Civil and Agency Surgeons and mass in-oculation against Typhus Fever was carried out.

10. Statement "E"-

The total number of Surgical operations performed during the year was 102,702 of which 5,485 were major and 97,217 minors as compared with 93,969 (Major 5,484 and minor 88,485) in 1950. The total number of patients operated was 111,897 of which 66 died (list attached).

Number of surgical operations performed in the Afghan Mission Hospital, Peshawar is 1246. Good work is being done in this hospital. Figures of the Pennell Memorial and other Mission Hospitals are not available.

The total receipt during 1951 under the various sub-heads such as Contributions from Government and Local Bodies, fees recovered from patients, Charitable collections and other Miscellaneous recoveries amounted to Rs. 23,15,994 against Rs. 18,44,297 in 1950. The total expenditure for 1951 under various items such as Salaries to the staff, Medicines, Diet Charges, Buildings, apparatus, etc., amounted to Rs. 23,15.994 as against Rs. 18,44,297 in 1950.

12. General Remarks-

A total number of 518 patients received treatment in the Frontier Mental Hospital, Peshawar during 1951. The daily avrage attendance were 345 against 355 in the preceding year.

The Lady Reading Hospital, Peshawar which is the Largest Provincial Hospital continues to maintain its efficiency and popularity. The following are the statistics of work done in this hospital in 1951:—


