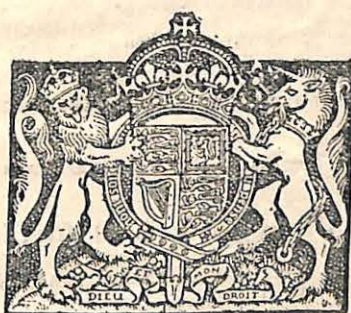

# ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

## OF THE

### Prince of Wales Medical College, Patna, 1935-36.

The college entered on its eleventh session on the 16th July 1935.

*The Governing Body.*—The members of the Governing Body appointed by the Government for the year 1935 were as follows:—

1. The Commissioner of Patna Division, *President ex-officio*.
2. The Principal, Medical College, Patna, *Vice-President and Secretary ex-officio*.

The Governing Body met on the 26th July 1935, to consider the recommendation of the Sub-Committee regarding the selection of students and to pass the college accounts for the year 1935-36. The selection was confirmed and the accounts were passed.

*Inspection of the Medical Council of India.*—The inclusion of the college in schedule I of the Indian Medical Act 1933 (XXVII of 1933), which includes all recognized institutions in India has already been referred to in the last Annual Report. Efforts have since been made to raise the standard of teaching and special stress is given on the practical side of medical education. The college curriculum is in the course of revision so that it may be brought into conformity with the requirements of the Medical Council.

It is a matter of great satisfaction that the M.B., B.S., degree of Patna University has been recognized by the General Medical Council of Great Britain.

The question of transferring the pre-Medical subjects viz., Botany and Zoology, to the Science College, Patna, and thus decreasing the period of the present medical curriculum from 6 to 5 years is engaging the attention of the authorities.

(1) *Administration.*—A detailed report of the receipts and expenditure during the year is furnished in Table E.



(2) There has been no trouble with the Cold Storage Plant during the period under review.

(3) The replacement of the old gas pipes which suffered damages during the earthquake of 1934, at a cost of Rs. 2,600 has been very satisfactory in its results.

(4) Constant supervision is made in the collection of fees and other dues. With a view to meeting the requirements of the University with regard to students who failed to appear at or pass an examination, special revision lectures have been arranged and revision fees have been charged for these extra lectures. This, apart from increasing contributions to the State and satisfying the University requirements, has been a benefit to backward students.

(5) The College Council met on seven occasions during the year. It is, however, considered that the college council, as it is constituted at present, is an unwieldy body. It is desirable that the membership should be limited only to the Heads of Departments.

2. Anatomy.—

Mr. H. Hyderali Khan, Professor of Anatomy, resigned on 15th July 1935.

Dr. Sanatan Pajari was appointed as Offg. Professor from 16th July 1935.

Dr. G. K. Ghosh, Demonstrator of Anatomy, was appointed as Lecturer from 16th July 1935.

Dr. Masudul Haque was appointed as 1st Demonstrator on 16th July 1935.

Dr. Baldeo Prasad Singh was appointed as 2nd Demonstrator from 2nd October 1935.

3. Obstetrics.—

Rai Sahib Dr. A. N. Sarkar officiated as Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology till 8th October 1935.

Lt.-Col. G. H. Mahony, I.M.S., joined as Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology on 9th October 1935.

4. Physiology.—

On the expiry of contract of Dr. R. K. Pal, Dr. B. Narayan, a Lecturer in Physiology, was appointed as Professor of Physiology with effect from 30th July 1935.

Dr. S. Prasad was appointed as Lecturer in Physiology from 30th July 1935.

Mr. H. N. Banerji, the Demonstrator of Physiology, was appointed as Lecturer from 28th March 1936.

Dr. S. S. Mahmood Shah was appointed as Demonstrator of Physiology from 28th March 1936.

5. Pharmacology.—

Dr. M. A. Hai, Lecturer in Pharmacology, was granted study leave from 16th July 1935 and Dr. P. A. P. Singh was appointed as Lecturer in Pharmacology from 16th July 1935.

6. Ophthalmology.—

Dr. M. Husnain was Lecturer in Ophthalmology till 15th April 1935. He was appointed as Professor of Ophthalmology from 16th April 1935.

Dr. D. Ram was appointed as Lecturer in Ophthalmology from 16th April 1935.

7. Hygiene.—

Lt.-Col. S. L. Mitra, I.M.S., went on leave on 21st October 1935.

Rai Sahib Dr. A. N. Chatterji took his place from 22nd October 1935.

8. Organic Chemistry.—

Rai Saheb Dr. K. N. Bagehi was transferred to the Government of Bengal on 11th September 1935.

Mr. M. N. Rudra officiated as Lecturer from 12th September 1935 to 11th December 1935.

Dr. T. N. Seth was appointed as Lecturer in Organic Chemistry in addition to his own duties from 12th December 1935.

9. Radiology.—

Dr. P. B. Mukherji, Lecturer in Radiology, was granted leave, Dr. S. K. Sahay was appointed as Lecturer in Radiology from 19th April 1935.

*Staff Club.*—The Staff Club and Common Room continued to promote contact, on the one hand, between the members of the teaching staff, and on the other, between the staff and the students of the college. The monthly social gatherings of the members of the college and hospital staff have been a very popular feature of the Staff Club.

A contribution of Rs. 240 has been made by the staff club, to the Medical College Students' Mutual Aid Society.

STUDENTS.

1. *Admission.*—There were 91 applications up to 31st of May 1935, the last date gazetted for receiving applications. The 13 late applications which were incomplete were not considered. Out of the applications considered 40 were selected. The total admission was 40.

*Table A* indicates classification according to preliminary general education of students admitted or re-admitted during the year in the Prince of Wales Medical College, Patna, during 1935-36.

*Table B* shows the number of students in each class, their religion and place of residence, in the Prince of Wales Medical College, Patna, during the year 1935-36.

2. *Students on the roll.*—A statement showing the number of students on the college roll is given in *Table C*.

3. *Withdrawal.*—Two.

4. *Attendance and cost per student.*—

(i) Average daily attendance—219.6 out of 267 against 236.6 out of 266 in 1934-35.

(ii) Average cost per student Rs. 939.1 against Rs. 905.3 in 1934-35.

5. *University examinations.*—A statement showing the number of students who appeared and passed examinations during the year is appended—vide *Table D*.

6. *Medals, Certificates of Honours and Scholarships.*—A list of students who have been awarded medals, certificate of honours and scholarships during the year is furnished in *Table G*.



7. *Hostel*.—Out of 267 students on the college roll—

(i) 140 students resided in the college hostel.

(ii) 31 students resided in hostels under the Students' Residence Committee.

(iii) 96 students lived with parents or guardians.

The necessity of extending the college hostel has become very acute. Out of a total of 267 students only 140 could be accommodated in the college hostel. The rest had either to go to hostels under the Students' Residence Committee or reside with parents or guardians due to limitation of accommodation in the college hostel.

It has also been observed that our students find great difficulty in getting accommodation in hostels under the Students' Residence Committee owing to limitation of seats. Students staying far from the college experience difficulty in attending lectures in the college and carrying on duties in the hospital. Constant supervision by the college authorities which is most necessary is not possible and discipline becomes slack. The question of extension of college hostel or provision of rented houses in the vicinity of the compound as a temporary measure should be taken in hand at once.

8. *Health, Disease and Death*.—The health of the students in general was good.

One of the students developed mental trouble and had to be allowed long leave for treatment in the Indian Mental Hospital, Kanke.

There were no deaths.

9. *Discipline*.—The discipline on the whole has been satisfactory.

10. *Students' Association*.—The Prince of Wales Medical College Students' Association which started in the beginning of the academic session 1934-35 has worked satisfactorily. It has conducted and controlled the various sections of the students' activities which ran independently before. It has contributed a sum of Rs. 100 towards the College Mutual Aid Fund.

*Athletics* :—

At the beginning of the session office-bearers and captains for the various sections were elected. The students have shown activities in practically all the games.

The absence of a suitable playing ground for the students in the college compound or in its vicinity is a great disadvantage. It is necessary that a play ground should be provided as early as possible.

The Annual Sports held on the College Re-Union day was a great success. There was a large and distinguished gathering. The general standard has improved considerably.

*Teaching* :—

In compliance with the suggestions made by a conference of representatives from the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge and London, the Royal College of Physicians of London, the Royal College of Surgeons of England, and the Society of Apothecaries of London recommending important changes in the medical curriculum and while awaiting the completion of a new medical curriculum embodying the recommendations of the General Medical Council every effort is being made to ensure that the teaching is essentially of a practical nature and that the subjects taught in the laboratories, e.g., Pathology and Pharmacology as well as Anatomy and Physiology, are being applied at the bedside.

Efforts to promote a closer liason between the various departments are being made e.g., the Professor of Anatomy has been asked to prepare a specially dissected specimen of the female pelvis so that he in conjunction with the Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology may impress on the students the anatomy of this part as an introduction to the lectures on Obstetrics and Gynaecology.

The Professor of Pathology has also consented to demonstrate the technique of such complicated tests as the Aschheim-Zondak and Freidman's test to the students attending the lectures in Obstetrics.

A request to the Superintendent of the Radium Institute is being made to demonstrate to students the treatment of malignant uterine diseases and other female complaints by radium.

The following additions have been made and the following improvements effected in the Departments :

*Biology* :—

The much needed expansion of the department has become possible by transfer of the Organic Chemistry Department to the Physiology Block.

*Anatomy* :—

A separate section of the Museum for Osteological specimens has been added; and special galvanised troughs have been made to preserve complete dissected parts for the use of Revision students and Tutorial classes.

A large number of dissected specimens has been added to the Museum and labelled photographs of the transverse sections of the body have been completed.

The Band Saw machine for cutting serial section has been received and installed.

Eight pieces of special show cases for Osteological section of the Museum have been added.

*Chemistry* :—

The Department of Organic Chemistry has been transferred to the Biochemical Laboratory and the rooms hitherto occupied by the Department of Chemistry have been handed over to the Department of Biology.

The staff, the equipment and the stores of the department of Organic Chemistry have been amalgamated to form the Department of Medical Chemistry, which, for the purposes of teaching and administration, now forms an independent unit.

*Pathology*—

The following new equipment has been added :—

5 more Zeiss Microscopes for the students.

6 wax models.

Cenco Hyvac Pump.

Seitz Bacteria Filter.

Translux Spenser Screen.

70 wet specimens have been added to the Pathological Museum.

*Obstetrics and Gynaecology*—

A complete set of Histological slides has been purchased for the Department.

The Maternity scheme continues to be satisfactory.

*Research and Publication*.—An original research paper entitled "Distribution of Vitamin C in different parts of common Indian Food-stuffs" has been communicated by the Department of Organic Chemistry to the Biochemical Journal of England for publication.

Abstracts of the following papers were communicated from the Department of Physiology to the Indian Science Congress held at Indore :

(1) Observations on the action of Ergotamine.



(2) An investigation on the action of Evipan Sodium on the blood sugar of rabbits.

**Library.**—Sixty-nine books were added during the year under review bringing the total number of volumes to 16,44 in the Library. The total number of journals subscribed for was 47.

Previously the books used to be issued to the student on loan slips. This procedure appeared to be unsatisfactory as the total number of books issued during a year could not be ascertained. The Librarian has been instructed to maintain a register in place of loan slips.

**Mutual Aid Fund.**—With a sum of Rs. 500 sanctioned by the Hon'ble Minister of Local Self-Government a nucleus of the Prince of Wales Medical College Mutual Aid Fund was formed in the beginning of the last academic session. Subsequently the contributions of the Patna University towards the Poor Boys' fund were incorporated with the Mutual Aid Fund by permission of the Syndicate.

A sum of Rs. 589-12-0 being unspent balance of Central Co-operative Kala-Azar Committee started in 1925 by the Hon'ble Minister, Local Self-Government, was received from Rai Sahib Dr. K. N. Bagchi, the Honorary Secretary of the Committee for contribution to the Mutual Aid Fund by the permission of the Hon'ble Minister.

Contributions have also been made by the members of staff and the students.
