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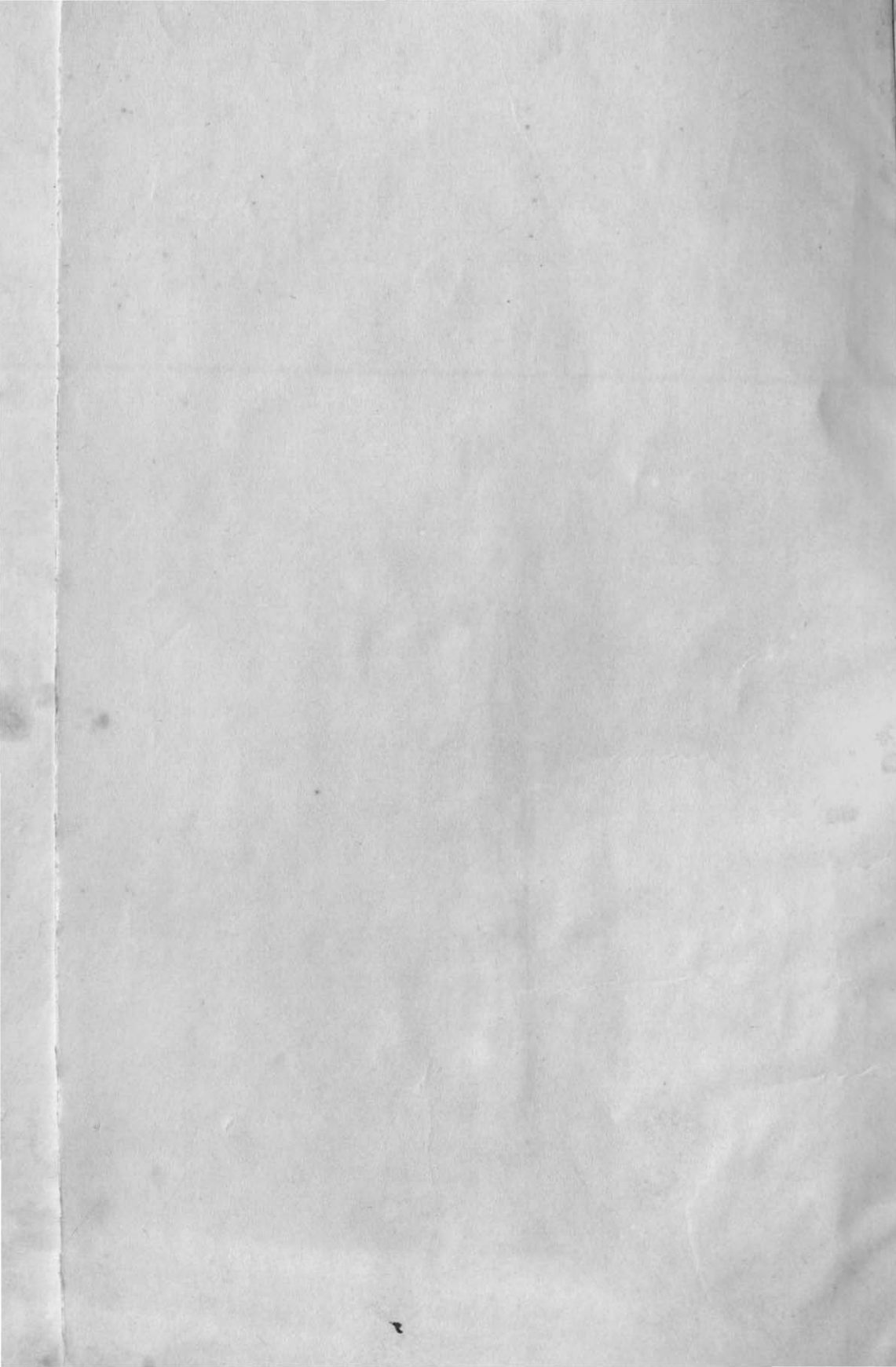

Subject :—Annual Administration Report of the Settlement, Survey and Land Records Department for the year 1948-49.

The Annual Administration Report of this Department is forwarded herewith in duplicate.

2. The charge of the Department was held during the year as under :—

From 1st August 1948 to 4th February 1949 Mr. Mahomed Hashim H. R. Abbasi.

From 5th February 1949 to 10th April 1949 Mr. Mahomed Ramzan C. Shoro.

From 11th April 1949 to 2nd June 1949 Mr. S. M. Kazi.

From 3rd June 1949 to 31st July 1949 Mr. Md. Ramzan C. Shoro.

3. The accompanying two statements A and B show the amount of work done at Head Record office, Hyderabad during the year under report. The important increases and decreases under the various heads as compared with the figures of preceding year are explained hereunder :—

(i) The cases necessitating correction in survey records, during the year under report, numbered 817 as against 2,014 in the preceding year. This large decrease is mainly due to two factors *viz.* reduction in the number of survey parties from 6 to 4 and recruitment of inexperienced staff because of the migration of trained non-Muslims. In spite of all these handicaps, the paper were disposed of during the year except 72 cases, which were cleared off soon after.

(ii) The number of requisitions in which information was supplied from the survey records (column 14) was 350 as against 303 of the previous year. The increase is not big enough to call for any remarks.

(iii) During the year under report 1,069 copies of field book were supplied to various Government Departments as against 2,221 during the last year. The demand from Revenue and Public Works Department was less, hence the decrease. The staff engaged for purpose was utilized for preparing maps, for which there was great demand from the Rehabilitation Department for rehabilitation purposes.

(iv) The total number of maps supplied during this year was 17,172 as against 3,094 prepared in the previous year. The large increase is due to the fact that the rehabilitation Department was supplied with two copies of each deh map for the purpose of Refugee rehabilitation.

(v) The number of maps prepared for reproduction was 362 as against 321 in the preceding year and the total number of maps prepared to replace the old office copies of maps was 183 as against 254 during the previous year. The increase and decrease is not big enough to call for any remarks.

(vi) In addition to the above maps the Barrage and the Public Works Departments were supplied 3,363 maps as against 6,602 supplied during the last year. The decrease is due to the less demand from these departments.

(i) The following are the comparative figures of the work done by the Head Record office in connection with the survey measurement during the last and current year :—

The percentage of measurement papers returned without entry for necessary correction was 41.7 as against 19.1% in the past year. It was due to the fact that the survey tapedars who replaced the old experienced hindu survey tapedars in survey parties, being mostly refugees and ostensibly new to the job, could not do full justice to their work. Hence the survey papers being incomplete, had to be returned for necessary correction. Efforts to improve the calibre of the staff were also made.

(ii) Repairs to the old Record Registers and field books and Bundies of 225 dehs of different talukas, were carried out during the year under report as against 450 dehs in the preceding year. Besides several old useful maps and files were also repaired and put in better condition.

(iii) Copies of old and worn out field books and bundies prepared during the year under report as compared with the last year are given below :—

This work is mostly done by the clerical establishment. Previously the number of clerks engaged for the purpose was 12 whereas during the year under report, it was reduced to 6 *vide* Government Orders No. R.-4418-H(a), dated 2nd August 1948. Hence the decrease is due to the retrenchment in the staff.

CITY SURVEY WORK.

Owing to the dearth of trained staff and the exodus of Non-Muslim property holders from big towns, no fresh city survey operations were carried out in any town in the Province of Sind. Also no maintenance staff was employed for the following five city surveyed towns.

- (1) Sanghar
- (2) Matiari.
- (3) Tharushah.
- (4) Umerkot.
- (5) Pir-jo-goth.

The conditions have not improved to such an extent so as to conduct city survey operations in the new towns of Bاده and Digri etc. during the year under report. But proposals for maintenance staff of the above five towns had been submitted separately for sanction.

(ii) The details of work done and the income and expenditure in connection with the city survey work are given in the accompanying statements B-I and B-II. The number of encroachments detected on Government and Municipal lands within the city surveyed areas are embodied in the accompanying statement C. As no original city survey was introduced in any town during the year, the statement C-I is blank. Statement C shows that there are still huge encroachments and no measures are adopted by the Municipal and Revenue Authorities to get them removed. These authorities may specially be warned by Government to pay more attention to the matter and take special efforts to have the encroachments removed.

SURVEY WORK.

The following four survey parties were employed during the year under report for conducting survey work in the Province, *vide* Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 11884-H(a)/48 of 6th December 1948.

The reasons for such a decrease in case No. 1 are that the area to be sub-rectangulated were wide spread and spasmodic with the result that the survey parties had to spend more time on journeys than on the actual measurement work. Secondly the staff being raw and un-acquainted with the environment failed to cope up with the situation. Efforts are being made to train them up and bring them to the level where they ought to be.

TAPEDARS' TRAINING SCHOOL, HYDERABAD.

The school is being run on temporary basis. There was a great dearth of trained hands owing to exodus of Non-Muslims throughout the Province ; therefore in addition to the normal course, Government also sanctioned Special course for a period of 12 months with effect from 1st February 1949 to 31st January 1950.

There were in all 321 students in the Normal as well as the special course, out of whom 196 passed the final examinations held in May 1949 and in January 1950 respectively.

All the successful candidates were given usual final examination certificates. The number of tapedars will be adequate in all other districts except Tatta and Tharparkar. Consequently no special course has been started.

The discipline and general working of the school were on the whole satisfactory.

Training of the Revenue Department officers in the survey work.

During the year 1948-49, probationery Assistant Collectors and Mukhtarkars attended the survey course at Hyderabad. They were given the requisite training and passed the prescribed test.

Barrage survey parties.

Two survey parties were employed for doing the following work in Barrage zone :—

(1) Land Acquisition work on account of Road Development and water courses, channels, etc. in the Barrage area.

(2) Land Acquisition party for doing Land Acquisition work in Lower Barrage Sind.

The funds were provided by the Revenue officer, Barrage and the parties worked under the control of this Department.
