
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Annual Administration Report, for 1949-50, of Settlements, Survey and Land, Records Department.

## GOVERNMENT OF SIND. REVENUE DEPARTMENT. Resolution No. P-4-H/51.

Sind Secretariat, Karachi, dated 17th March, 1952.

Letter No. L-4096, dated the 1st October 1951, from the Commissioner of Settlements, Survey and Land Records, Sind, ferwarding the Annual Administration Report on the working of the Settlements, Survey and Land Records Department for 1949-50.

RESOLUTION.—While noting that there has been some improvement during the year, and directing that the Report should be recorded, Government are pleased to make the following observations.

- (i) Inspite of several Circulars issued by the Revenue Commissioner for Sind to the District Officers to direct the Sub-Divisional Officers and the Mukhtiarkar to check the entries of the Record of Rights in V. F .-VII-B and certify them after due verification before such entries are incorporated in V. F. VI and V. F. VIII-A, there is no appreciable improvement and the Record of Rights continues to be maintained in a most unsatisfactory condition. Government, therefore, direct that all the Revenue Officers concerned should pay proper attention to this important work and see that the Record of Rights is brought up-to-date.
- (ii) The City Survey work still continues to be unsatisfactory as no fresh city survey work has been started during the year under report except in respect of Matli town. The recovery of Sanad fees is also extremely bad and it seems that real efforts have not been made to recover them except at Hala and Shahdadkot. The income from the City Survey offices is inadequate and these offices, which are supposed to cover their own expenses, are running under a heavy loss. The Commissioner of Settlements, Survey and Land Records, should impress upon the City Surveyors that real efforts should be made to recover the sanad fees.
- (iii) There has been practically no improvement in the matter of detection and removal of encroachments except at Sakrand and Ratodero where some encroachments have been removed. Although a certain number or encroachments were detected and recorded at Hyderabad, which is the most important town in the Province, not a single encroachment has been removed. The District Officers should ask the Municipal authorities to see that encroachments pointed out by the Commissioner of Settlements, Survey and Land Records, Sind, are removed without delay; otherwise there will be serious congestion in streets and loss of revenue both Government and Municipal.

Subject:—Annual Administration Report of the Settlement, Survey and Land Records Department for the year 1949-50.

I enclose herein, in duplicate, the Annual Administration Report of the Settlement, Survey and Land Records Department for the year 1949-50.

- 2. The following officers held charge of the Department during the year under report:—
  - Mr. Mahomed Ramzan C. K. Shoro, B.A., from 1st August 1949 to 15th August 1949.
- (2) Mr. A. M. Channa, B.A., from 16th August 1949 to 14th March 1950.
  - (3) Mr. Altaf Hussain Tirmizi, B.A., from 15th March 1950 to 31st July 1950.
  - 3. I shall deal with each section separately.
    - (1) HEAD RECORD OFFICE AND THE DEALINGS.

This office mainly deals with-

- (1) Corrections in Survey records maintained by it.
- (2) Supply of information relating to the records to the various officers in the Province,

- (3) Issue of field books to Revenue Department and Public Works
  Department officers as and when demanded.
- (4) Supply of maps relating to dehs, talukas, divisions, districts and the Province to officers of the various departments and the public.
- (5) Reproduction of maps and replacement of the old ones.
- (6) Maintenance of the old records in good condition.

The statements A and B hereto attached show the amount of work done at the Head Record Office during the year. The important variations under the various heads as compared with the figures of the preceding year are explained hereunder:—

#### STATEMENT A.

- (i) The cases necessitating correction in Survey records numbered 1917 as against 817 in the preceding year. After transfer of the Survey measurement work from the district staff to the Survey Parties of this Department the things are moving at a quicker speed and this large increase in corrections is due to the fact that a large number of Survey papers prepared by the Survey Parties was received in the Head Record Office for incorporation. All the papers were disposed of during the year except 50 cases which have also been cleared off since.
- (ii) The Number of requisitions on which information was supplied from the Survey record (column 14) was 455 as against 350 of the previous year. The increase calls for no comment as this Number always varies according to the requisitions received. All the requisitions received were disposed of during the year under report.
- (iii) The Number of copies of field books supplied during the year (column 18) was 1013 in 393 cases as against 1069 in 168 cases during the preceding year. There are no special reasons for decrease or increase in the Number of copies supplied and that of cases respectively as it all depends upon the indents received from the Revenue and Public Works Department Officers. All the indents received were disposed of during the year.
- (iv) The total Number of maps supplied during the year under report (columns 20 to 27) was 12,340 as against 17,172 supplied in the previous year. The decrease is due to the fact that last year the Rehabilitation Department was supplied with two copies of each deh map for the purpose of refugee rehabilitation.
- (v) The Number of maps prepared for reproduction (columns 23 and 29) was 237 as against 363 in the preceding year and the total number of maps prepared to replace the old office copies of maps (column 30) was 189 as against 183 during the previous year.

In addition to this work, the mapping establishment made corrections in black ink in 1627 maps as against 808 in the previous year. The increase is due to the fact that last year the Karachi Printing Press stopped printing of the maps and with a view to meet the demand the office establishment had to attend to the heavier correction work. This year, however, the Pakistan Murree Printing Press has undertaken the printing work.

(vi) The Barrage Officers were supplied 390 maps during the year under report as against 310 supplied during the previous year. The increase is due to more demand from these officers.

- (i) The amount of work shown in this statement is comparatively greater than that shown in the statement of the preceding year. This is due to a larger No. of Survey papers having been received from the Survey Parties for incorporation in the records of the Head Record Office. The percentage of measurement papers returned without entry for necessary correction was 15.9 this year as against 41.7 last year. It was due to the fact that the Survey tapedars who replaced the old experienced Hindu Survey Tapedars in Survey Parties have now gained experience and are able to do the work more correctly. The arrears shown in column 6 pertain to the papers received during the last 2-3 months of the year and have since been cleared off.
- (ii) Repairs to old Survey registers, field books and bundles of 365 dehs of different talukas were carried out during the year as against 225 dehs in the preceding year. Besides this, several old issue books and files were also repaired and kept in good condition in the records.
- (iii) Copies of old and worn out field-books and bundles prepared during the year under report as compared with the last year are given below:—

In addition to this work, indices to field books of 15 dehs were also prepared and kept on record. All this work was done by special establishment of 6 clerks sanctioned for the purpose.

The mistakes and omissions detected were pointed out to the District Officers by means of Inspection notes and they were requested to impress upon the village establishment, the necessity of correct and prompt compliance with them. These inspections disclosed a very unsatisfactory condition of the Record of Rights as the village staff do not take due interest in this work. Inspection notes of several years are still pending with the taluka offices and the attention of the Collectors is being drawn to this state of affairs in the district from ime to time.

## (3) CITY SURVEY WORK.

- (i) City Survey already extends to 21 towns in the Province and its record is fairly well kept though in some cases for want of trained hands due to the exodus of non-muslim subordinates, beats have been increased and kept in charge of 11 City Surveyors as against 18 in times past. For the same reason no fresh City Survey operations could be carried out, in any town in the Province nor was any separate maintenance staff employed for the lastly City Surveyed towns of Sanghar, Tharushah, Umerkot and Pir-jo-goth during the year under report but Sanghar was attached to Tando Adam beat, Tharushah kept in charge of City Surveyor Nawabshah, Umerkot in charge of Mirpurkhas Surveyor and Pir-jo-Goth was tagged on to the City Surveyor in charge of Sukkur and Rohri. The conditions have, however, now improved to some extent and with a trained staff getting to be available, separate maintenance staff will be appointed for towns where urgent necessity will be felt. City Survey operations in the town of Matli have also been sanctioned by the Government and the necessary work will be finished in 1950-51.
- (ii) The details of work done and the income and expenditure in connection with the City Survey work are given in the accompanying statements B-I and B-II. The details of encroachments detected on

Government and Municipal lands within the City Surveyed areas are embodied in the accompanying statement C. As no original City Survey was introduced in any town during the year, the statement C-I is blank Statement C shows that there is a large number of encroachments yet existing as no adequate measures have been adopted by the Municipal and Revenue authorities to get them removed. These authorities need a strong word from Government so as to pay greater attention to the task

### (4) SURVEY WORK.

The following four Survey Parties were employed during the year under report for conducting Survey work in the Province:—

- (1) Survey Party for doing Sub-rectangulation of Naclass and Nakabuli lands in the Lower Sind Barrage Area.
- (2) Survey Party for doing Land Acquisition and Routine work in Upper Sind Districts.
- (3) Survey Party for doing Land Acquisition and Routine work in Lower Sind Districts.
- (4) Survey Party for doing Land Acquisition in Lower Sind Districts and checking of the boundary marks stones in Lower Sind Barraga Area.

The decrease in case of Serial No. 1 is clear as last year there were 2 Parties while this year only one Party was engaged. The increase in case of No. 2 is due to the fact that the staff has now got training and become better acquainted with the work. Sub-rectangulation of the area under the command of the Lower Sind Barrage is in progress and is likely to be finished by the

end of 1951-52. The Sub-rectangulation Survey of lands commanded by the Upper Sind Barrage and the Survey of lands in the Mahal Kohistan is to follow next. These two later schemes alone cover an area of 33,10,000 acres of land to be surveyed. It will thus appear that the Survey work will still require a Number of years to come to completion.

### (5) TAPEDARS' TRAINING SCHOOL.

The School is being run on temporary basis with Headmaster of the Mukhtiarkar's grade assisted by a 6 teachers drafted from the Kanuga staff. In February 1949 on account of dearth of trained hands owing to exodus of non-muslim subordinates in the regular Revenue Department, in addition to the normal course, Special course was also sanctioned by Government for a period of 12 months from 1st February 1949 to 31st January 1950. This year, however, the conditions having improved only normal course was held in which 69 students out of 112 were declared successful in the examination held in May 1950 and all of them were given the usual final examination certificates. The discipline and general working of the School were on the whole satisfactory.

# (6) TRAINING OF THE REVENUE DEPARTMENT OFFICERS IN THE

## SURVEY WORK. A H bas softe and softe

During the year under report 2 Probationary Deputy Collectors and 10 Mukhtiarkars attended the Survey course at Hyderabad. They were given the requisite training and granted necessary certificate after usual test.

### (7) BARRAGE SURVEY PARTIES.

Two Survey Parties were employed for doing the measurement work concerning Barrage Department as under :—

- (1) Land Acquisition work on account of Road Development and Water Courses, Channels etc., in the Lloyd Barrage Area.
  - (2) Land Acquisition work on account of buildings, Feeders etc., in the Lower Sind Barrage Area.

The funds were provided by the Revenue Officer, Barrage and the Parties worked under the control of this Department.

The figures of work done during the year under report are sub-joined.
