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

SIR,

I am directed to submit the annual returns relating to the collection of Income Tax in the Punjab for the year ending 31st March 1903, in the forms prescribed in Government of India Resolution No. 83 S. R., dated the 14th January 1903: form No. IX has been omitted in accordance with Mr. Diack's letter No. 1693, dated the 8th July 1901. In paragraph 7 of their Resolution No. 2316 S. R., dated the 8th May 1901, the Government of India directed that brief comments only should be submitted with the prescribed returns, and the Financial Commissioner accordingly confines his remarks to the points noted in the following paragraphs.

2. The percentage of assessees of the lowest class works out at 42 as compared with 43 last year, and the amount paid by them at 14·47 as compared with 16·5 last year. The Financial Commissioner regards the continued decrease as a sign that the tax is working satisfactorily, but he observes that this is the last time that incomes of below Rs. 1,000 per annum will be subject to taxation, owing to the passing of India Act XI of 1903.

3. Total collections are Rs. 14,53,430 as against Rs. 14,26,862 last year (column 17 of Statement III) while final demand shews Rs. 12,19,521 assessed on 45,265 assessees as against Rs. 12,16,155 assessed on 45,141 assessees last year (columns 8 and 9 of Statement V). The differences are not considerable, and the Financial Commissioner does not propose to go into details, but he notices that Delhi District shews an increase of nearly Rs. 10,000 in demand mainly due to improvement in trade (which, as stated in last year's report, had been suffering from depression) and to certain operations undertaken in connection with municipal taxation which brought to light several incomes liable to this tax.

4. The difference between original and final demand was:—

Excluding the abnormal year 1900-01—as to which *vide* paragraph 4 of Punjab Government No. 2199, dated 7th September 1901—the difference is about average. In his note on the returns for 1900-01, Sir Lewis Tupper expressed the opinion that ordinarily not more than one-third of the assessees should be expected to object. Important variations from this standard occur in Siálkot, Gujrát, Gujránwála and Ráwlpindi. The Commissioner of Ráwlpindi notes, as regards Gujrát, that assessees who had been paying at the same rate for years appealed simply as a matter of routine, and, as regards Ráwlpindi, that matters connected with Income Tax collection and assessment have for some time been in a very unsatisfactory condition in the district. Before taking or suggesting any general action to correct these features of the administration,

the Financial Commissioner would prefer to see what effect the new Act XI of 1903, has upon the percentage of objections lodged. In two of the four districts mentioned (namely, in Siálkot and Ráwlpindi) the services of a special officer to revise assessments in the city and cantonments has been sanctioned, and this also should have an effect upon the number of objections.

5. *General remarks.*—The prevalence of plague and continuance of agricultural depression are again noticed by District Officers as disturbing factors in the administration, but there has been some improvement under the latter head and, as regards plague, there is, in the case of some parts of the country, much in what Mr. Alex. Anderson says when he remarks on the

One of the great difficulties we have to contend with is the fluctuations in income due to grain-gambling. A man makes a small fortune one year and loses it the next. Another difficulty is that of getting satisfactory estimates of income from branch shops in other parts of the country. A third is that of detecting bogus payments to agents and relations. The commonest form of attempt to swindle is the production of incomplete accounts, but that fortunately is easily detected.

Gurdáspur District report that the people are now indifferent about it and go on just as if it did not exist: though doubtless outbreaks affecting large numbers in the same locality are still accompanied by panic and depression of trade. Some pertinent remarks, made by Mr. J. P. Thompson in the Rohtak District report, as to the difficulties in arriving at correct assessments are quoted in the margin. Special assessments for the towns and cantonments of Amritsar, Batála, Siálkot, Ráwlpindi, Ludhiána, Jullundur and Ferozepore have been sanctioned. These have already been started in Amritsar and Batála, and arrangements for the deputation of an Extra Assistant Commissioner to the three last named places are now proceeding.
