READ—

Report on the Administration of the Stamp Department for the year 1894-95 with the remarks of the Financial Commissioner thereon conveyed in his Secretary's letter No. 413, dated the 3rd July 1895.

REMARKS.—A full report on the revenue and administration of the Stamp Department during the three years ending with 1895-96 will be due next year; the report for the past year is therefore brief and calls for little remark.

2. The net revenue fell from nearly 39 to nearly $37\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs of rupees, a decrease of a lakh and a quarter divided almost equally between the heads "Judicial" and "Non-Judicial." The revenue from Judicial stamps was higher than that of any previous year except 1893-94, while the Non-Judicial stamp income fell to the lowest point touched since 1886-87. The year, like its predecessor, was a prosperous one for agriculturists, and possibly the explanation which was put forward to account for the increase and decrease respectively in the court fee and general stamp collections of 1893-94 is true also of the year under report. A further increase in sales of one-anna receipt stamps is satisfactory.

3. There was a very considerable increase, nearly 10 per cent., in sales of ordinary postage stamps.

4. The thanks of the Government are again due to Messrs. T. G. and G. C. Walker for their efficient administration of the Department during another year.

SIR,

I am directed to submit the annual statements of the Stamp Department, Punjab, for the year 1894-95, together with a brief note on the administration of the Department by the Superintendent of Stamps.

2. The office of Superintendent of Stamps was held by Mr. G. C. Walker from the beginning of the year till the 4th of August 1894, when the permanent incumbent, Mr. T. G. Walker, returned from leave and resumed his work.

3. The principal financial feature of the year is the considerable decrease in receipts from both judicial and non-judicial stamps as compared with the previous year. The decreases are almost equal amounting to over Rs. 64,000 in each case. In the preceding year the receipts under the former head had risen by Rs. 1,76,523, and those under the latter fallen by Rs. 1,53,899, and the explanation offered and accepted by Government was that in years of agricultural prosperity money-lenders sue for the recovery of past debts, while their clients contract fewer new debts. The year under report was again one of good harvests, and the further, though smaller, decrease in the demand for non-judicial stamps may thus be accounted for. And as regards judicial stamps, although there has been a falling off, as noted above, in the income derived from their sale, still the receipts from this source have been considerably higher than in any previous year except 1893-94.

4. It is satisfactory to note that the income from the sale of one anna receipt stamps continues to expand, and sales of Postage and Telegraph stamps have also increased, the rise under ordinary Postage stamps alone amounting to over a lakh of rupees. The decrease in expenditure was mainly under the head discount on sales, and requires no comment.

5. With reference to the remark contained in para. 3 of the Government Review on the last annual report, it appears that the number of stamp vendors shown in the Montgomery district in the returns of 1893-94 was erroneous, having included persons temporarily entrusted with stamps for the convenience of litigants attending the courts of officers out in camp.

6. Inspections of district and tahsil stamp offices by the Superintendent of Stamps and his Personal Assistant have been satisfactory.

For the year 1894-95.

It was remarked in the Note of last year that the receipts (1893-94) were the highest on record. The figures of the past year show a very considerable contraction of the revenue, amounting to Rs. 1,26,793, or more than 3 per cent. as compared with the previous year. The total income of the year of report is less than that in each of the three preceding years, but greater than in 1890-91. The figures (in thousands of rupees) for the last seven years may be given in order to show the fluctuations:—

The decrease of the year of report is almost equally divided between Judicial and Non-judicial. The striking features of the returns of 1893-94 were a very large increase in the revenue under the former, and an almost equally large decrease under the latter head.

3. The amount realized from the sale of Court-fee stamps in 1893-94

Sale of Court-fee Stamps. was Rs. 1,76,523 in excess of the receipts of the preceding year, while the figures of the past year show a falling off from this, which amounts to Rs. 64,149, the revenue of 1894-95 thus remaining upwards of a lakh of rupees ahead of that in 1892-93, and well in advance of all years except 1893-94. Comparing the details of the two past years by districts we find the following results:—

Next year, when a full report is written for the period 1893-96, the fluctuations under this head will no doubt be examined with special reference to the remarks in paragraph 5 of the Punjab Government Review of the Report of 1890-93. It need only be remarked here that the figures given above show both the decreases and increases to be distributed indifferently over the Province, from which fact the inference to be drawn is probably that they are not due to any special causes.

4. The recoveries of dues in Pauper Suits (Appendix B) were better

There are still rather startling inequalities in the district figures ; but the proportion of realizations is probably as high as can be expected.

5. The decrease in revenue under the head Non-Judicial has occurred entirely in the receipts from the sale of Non-Judicial stamps. The year 1893-94 showed a falling off of Rs. 1,53,899, or 11 per cent. under this head as compared with the preceding year, and in the year of report there has been a further decrease of Rs. 64,757. The figures of the last five years (in thousands of rupees) are as follows :—

With regard to the first two items it is only necessary to say that the increase in the income from the sale of one-anna receipt stamps, which has been a very satisfactory feature of late years, is maintained.

The increase in the receipts from the sale of Hundi paper has occurred principally at the centres of Ludhiána, Ferozepore and Amritsar.

6. In the Note of last year was recorded a decrease of Rs. 1,63,332, Non-Judicial Impressed or 12 per cent. in the revenue derived from the sale sheets. of non-judicial impressed sheets. The figures of the year of report show a further decrease of Rs. 69,885. The revenue from this source in the four years between 1887-88 and 1890-91 varied little. Since then the figures have been :—

The receipts of the year of report are greater than those of 1886-87, but less than in any succeeding year. These results are rather perplexing ; but it does not appear necessary in this Note to enter into a detailed discussion of the causes at work. The districts which show the largest decreases are the following :—

So far as any connection can be established between agricultural prosperity and stamp revenue, one would be inclined to say that the effects of favourable seasons would be observed in reduced revenue from both Judicial and Non-judicial stamps; but as a matter of fact a large increase under the former head in 1893-94 was accompanied by a decrease under the latter, while in the past year there has been a decrease under both. The figures may be repeated here:—

Comparing the district figures given above with those in paragraph 3, it will be seen that Umballa and Jullundur together contribute more than one-half of the decrease in receipts from Judicial and nearly one-third of that from Non-judicial stamps. There seems to be little room for doubt that the same causes have been at work in both these districts. Thus the Umballa district note of the past year contains the following passage:—

“There is a decrease of Rs. 9,045 under this head (Non-judicial Impressed sheets), which gives rise to the hope that the measures adopted in the district generally for the reduction of expenditure on marriages and funerals are gradually becoming effective. Such reduction of course causes a corresponding falling off in the business of the money-lender, or, in other words, a decrease in the number of bonds executed.”

In the Jullundur note Mr. Douie makes the following remarks with regard to (a) the falling off in the number of civil suits instituted, and (b) that in the receipts from Non-judicial stamps:—

(a) “The small falling off in 1894 may be the result of the special efforts made by Mr. Gladstone to reduce litigation, and of the extremely sickly character of the year.”

(b) “The cheapness of food-grains has probably a good deal to do with this decrease, and something may be due to the establishment of committees for the diminution of marriage and funeral expenses among the people.”

7. The amount realized on account of impressed labels affixed and *Stamp duty taken in cash.* skeleton forms stamped in the office of the Superintendent of Stamps was—

Details of the receipts from stamp duty and penalties realized by the Courts and by Deputy Commissioners under Sections 30, 34, 37 and 38 of Act I of 1879 will be found in columns 14 to 20 of Appendix A. There is a considerable difference in the figures of the last two years under column 15 (duty realized by Deputy Commissioners under Section 37) viz. :—1893-94, Rs. 3,443 ; 1894-95, Rs. 345. In the former year the Mooltan district alone contributed Rs. 2,996, which was apparently (although the matter was not noticed in last year's report) realized in a single case.

8. Details of the charges in each of the past two years will be found in the abstract statement given in paragraph 2. Under the heads of “Discount on sales” there have been decreases corresponding to the decreases in receipts noticed in paragraphs 3 and 6. The smaller amount paid in refunds of the value of Non-judicial stamps spoilt or not required for use (column 34) is probably the result of the falling off in the value of the stamps sold during the last two years. The increased expenditure under the head “Miscellaneous” has occurred principally in the districts of Dera Ismail Khan and Ráwalpindi. In the former it is due to a greater outlay on carriage of stamps in consequence of our complying with a requisition by the Post-master-General, Punjab, for a very large additional supply of postage stamps, envelopes, &c., to meet the requirements of the Waziristan Expeditionary Force.

10. Appendix C gives full details of the proceedings in the matter of adjudication by the Collector, impounding and dealing with instruments not duly stamped, and prosecutions for evasion of the law. The variations shown by this statement are so small as to require no special comment. The corresponding receipts (Chapters III and IV) are noticed in paragraph 7.

11. Appendix D shows the usual details of the district arrangements for stamp vend. The details of vendors of Court-fee stamps in Kangra and Montgomery have now been given correctly. The figures of 1893-94 for these districts included persons accompanying officers on tour who were temporarily entrusted with the necessary stamps for the convenience of parties. The appendix otherwise does not seem to call for remark.

12. Mr. G. C. Walker officiated as Superintendent of Stamps up to 14th August 1894 and for the rest of the year I have held charge. The following inspections were made in the year:—

13. The departmental figures were as usual compared month by month with statements furnished by the Accountant-General. Fractions of a rupee are excluded from the annual district (departmental) figures, and this always causes some slight differences in the final comparison. The differences discovered in the final comparison between the two sets of figures for the past year are all due to this cause.
