Note on Stamp Statements for 1903-04.

Statement I.—The rise of nearly a lakh in the gross receipts is divided in fairly even proportions between the Stamp Act and the Court Fees Act. It apparently indicates a continuation of the process of recovery from the temporary effects of the Punjab Alienation of Land Act.

Statement II.—The increase in the sales of judicial stamps for the Province as a whole is insignificant. The general impression of District Officers is that litigation has increased: the correctness of this opinion is doubtful and plague has produced the reverse effect in some Districts, e. g., in Ludhiána and Siálkot, and there is also a marked decrease in sales of judicial stamps in Kángra, which the Deputy Commissioner attributes to the operation of the Land Alienation Act. From Amritsar and Miánwáli it is stated that the Act causes money-lenders to have recourse to the Courts by preventing them from obtaining private settlements by sale or mortgage of land. The rise in Amritsar is only $6\frac{1}{2}$, and in Miánwáli only 5, per cent. on the figures of the preceding year.

Statement III.—The increase from Rs. 1,48,310 to Rs. 1,59,616 on account of one anna receipt stamps is very noticeable. Though special circumstances must have contributed to this sudden rise, there is undoubtedly a growing acquaintance with the law regarding receipt stamps which tends to the steady development of this branch of revenue. The Amritsar District reports that the agriculturist money-lender, who does a large proportion of the loan business there, keeps no account-book and therefore uses fewer receipt stamps and more impressed stamps. Even here, however, there is a very large increase in the income from one anna receipt stamps. The miscellaneous receipts in column 12 are on account of deficient stamp duty, fines and penalties. They have risen largely and are more than double what they were in 1901-02: a fact which apparently indicates closer attention on the part of the local Courts and officers to the requirements of the Stamp Law. Ludhiána, Ferozepore, Amritsar and Gujránwála show particularly large increases.

Statement V.—Shows that the Courts dealt with 2,755 cases against 1,588, and Collectors with 386 against 111.

Statement VI.—Prosecutions, however, show a drop from 15 to 7, a continuation of a steady diminution which has been going on for several years past.

Appendix.—In the letter of the Government of India, Finance and Commerce Department, No. 1714 S.R., dated 15th March 1904, instructions were given for the submission of a statement showing the extent of the business done in insurance policies. This is the outcome. It does not include the insurance business of the Postal Department, and is for other reasons of questionable completeness. Banks, or branches of Banks, situated in the Punjab, transact much business for Insurance Companies located outside the Province. Most of this business is probably excluded from the figures. One Bank acting on behalf of the Oriental Life Office protested against the requisition for particulars regarding renewals and re-insurance on the ground of the labour involved in compilation. The difficulties would be lessened by requiring each Province to furnish particulars in regard to those Companies only which have their registered offices within its area. But legislation on the English plan would be necessary to secure the submission of complete returns: as clerical labour for the compilation of official statistics is not voluntarily undertaken by men of business.
