


PREFACE.





CUTCE.

Area and Population.—The State has an area of 7,616 square miles (exclusive of 9,000 square miles in the Rann belonging to the State). The area was increased from 6,500 miles in 1901-02 to accord with the measurements of the survey which has been in progress since 1873. It contains 948 villages with 125,044 houses and a population as under :—

Of the total population, 295,436 or 57.5 per cent. are Hindus, 126,133 or 24.6 per cent. Musalmans, 62,298 or 12.7 per cent. Jains, 80 Parsis and 63 Christians. There are 42,088 literates of whom 1,438 are able to read and write English, and 4,755 females. The distribution of the population by occupations is :—

Agriculture and Land Revenue.—Survey operations have been in progress since 1873. The revenue is collected by *Bhágbatai*, i.e., in kind.

The State possesses five water-works, and 8,728 wells for irrigation purposes. There is also a forest Nursery at Bhúj containing 847 plants. The *Rakhals* or grass preserves number 44 extending over about 300 miles and yielding 582,285 mannds, which are either consumed by the Darbári animals or sold to outsiders. The amounts of

There are 573 vessels belonging to Natives of different towns in State. The State chiefly exports gold-thread, *Kinkhab*, Cutch-er-work, silk embroidery, decorative arms, alum, different kinds of and building stones. There are five Ginning factories and 13 ton presses in the State.

Important Public Works.—The total length of metalled roads open for traffic is 173 miles, on which tolls to the amount of 15,640 are levied annually.

Famine.—The State suffered very severely from famine in 1899-1900. Relief measures were commenced in October 1899 with daily average of 14,000 persons receiving relief. The number on relief rose to 44,022 in March 1900, exclusive of 3,787 persons in receipt of gratuitous relief. Rs. 24,10,000 inclusive of Rs. 2,77,34 of Tagātā were expended on relief measures by the State during this famine.

Plague.—Plague first appeared in the town of Māndvi in September 1896 and led to a severe epidemic in the following April 1897. The mortality has amounted to close on 22,000 persons as shown below :—

Besides there were 677 imported cases during the period, of which 516 proved fatal.

General.—The State pays a subsidy of Rs. 2,00,000 (Sicca) to the British Government for the expenses of the British subsidiary force. The police force in the State numbers 720 maintained at an annual cost of Rs. 1,69,093. There is a mint maintained at a cost of about Rs. 4,200 a year. It coined 51 Panchias in 1910-11. Besides Panchias, kories and half-kories are coined. The present value of these coins is:—

There are 11 Darbári stallions which served 36 mares in 1910-11. The State has its own Printing Press. There are nine Libraries containing over 11,000 volumes.

There are 12 Telegraph offices in the State, *viz.*, at Bhuj, Mándvi, Anjar, Mundra, Rapar, Jakhau, Bháchau, Nalia, Kothára, Tera, Lákadia and Tuna. The total length of Telegraph lines is 257 miles.

There are 107 Post offices in the State, of which 1 is Head Office, 11 are Sub-offices and 95 are Branch offices.



PÁLANPUR.

Area.—The estimated area of the Agency is 6,393 square miles.

Survey.—Survey operations were commenced in 1892, but have not been completed owing to the severe famines of 1899—1902, and subsequent lean years. Upto the year 1910-11, 342 out of 511 villages in the Pálapur State have been surveyed. In the Rádhanpur State the survey work was completed in 1898-99, but new rates of assessment have not been introduced. The survey operations in the Thara Jághir were commenced in 1909-10, and upto the end of 1910-11, 10 villages have been surveyed.

Trade and Manufacture.—There are three cotton ginning factories at Sami, Lolada and Munjpur under the Rádhanpur State. Good leather work is turned out at Suigam, a village near the Runn. The chief articles of export are rape-seed, rice, sesamum and cutlery.

Important Public Works.—The following important works have been constructed since 1875 in the Pálapur Agency :—

1. Scott Canal at Rádhanpur.
2. Road from Roh to Ambaji within the Pálapur State limits ($7\frac{1}{2}$ miles).
3. Road from Rádhanpur town towards Pattan.

6. Pálapur High School.
7. Jail at Pálapur.
8. Mausoleum of His Highness Dewan Jorawar Khanji Saheb, Pálapur.
9. Huzur Offices at Rádhanpur.
10. Harris Clock Tower at Rádhanpur.
11. Mrs. Scott Girls' School at Pálapur.
12. Scott Hospital at Pálapur.
13. Merewether Hall at Sihori.
14. Traveller's Bungalow at Deodár.
15. Mohtajkhána at Pálapur.
16. The Agency Jail.

The Pálapur-Deesa branch, joining the main line of the Rájpútána-Málwa Railway at Pálapur, 18 miles in length, has been working since 1893, and has added considerably to the prosperity of the Agency. The Pálapur State share of the net yearly earnings of this branch exceeds Rs. 10,000. The Durbár originally invested Rs. 1,85,000 in the undertaking.

Famine and subsequent lean years.—The whole Agency suffered severely from the famines of 1900-02. Relief measures were commenced in September 1899 and were closed in October 1902. The highest daily average number of persons in receipt of relief was 92,348 in July 1900. It decreased to 73 in April 1901 and again rose to 14,000 in February 1902. Over 20 lakhs of rupees were spent on famine relief in the year 1899-1900. The following famine loans were borrowed by the State from Government:—

In December 1906, the late crops of cotton, rape-seed and castor-oil suffered considerably from severe frost, but the outturn, on the whole, was fair. In the three subsequent years the crops were good but in the year 1909-10 the late crops again suffered from frost in the month of January. Plague.—In the year 1895-96 and 1896-97 the Agency suffered from cholera and small-pox, which carried off over 2,500 and 400 souls respectively. In the latter year plague first appeared in Pálanpur town and in some villages of the State. It again broke out in 1903 in Pálanpur and spread over the Deesa Cantonment and Pálanpur State villages, and has reappeared every year up to the year 1909-10. It was of a virulent type in 1908-09, in which year the number of deaths in the Agency was 536. Plague has caused the deaths of over 3,147 persons altogether in the Agency as given below.

General.—There is a Government stallion at Pálanpur and State stallions at Pálanpur and Rádhanpur. There are nominally five Municipalities at Pálanpur, Rádhanpur, Deesa, Tekra and Rájpur, the latter two being suburbs of Deesa Cantonment under the jurisdiction of the Pálanpur State. They are practically a department of the State to which sanitary work is entrusted. The cost is met by an octroi duty supplemented by contributions from the State revenues.



MAHI KA'NTHA.

Area.—The estimated area of 9,300 square miles entered in Official Reports until the year 1890-91 was reduced to 3,528 square miles in 1891-92 to accord with the G. T. sheets, but even this figure is only approximately correct, and the probable area of the Agency is 3,124 square miles.

Survey.—There has been no survey settlement except in a portion of the Idar State, none of the other States and Tálukas in the Agency having yet been surveyed in detail for revenue purposes.

Trade and Manufacture.—The chief industry in the Agency is the dyeing of cloth in Vasna and Pethápur, which yearly export dyed cloth of the value of Rs. 14,000 and 50,400 respectively. There are two cotton ginning factories—one at Himatnagar in Idar State and another at Jhotana in Katosan Táluka.

Since the year 1897 the Viramgám-Mehsána, Ahmedabad-Parántíj and Kalol-Vijápur branch railways have been constructed in the Agency, and the latter has greatly developed the Pethápúr, Mánsa and Warsoda Tálukas. The Ahmedabad-Parántíj Line, which was constructed in 1896-97 and opened for traffic in 1897, was extended to Khed-Brahma in the year 1909-10. The extension has developed the State of Idar, the Táluka of Ilol and the Tálukas under the Sáber Kántha Thána Circle. To connect Sádra, the head-quarters station of the Agency, with the Ahmedabad-Parántíj Khed-Brahma railway, a partly metalled road from Sádra to Dabhoda and an unmetalled road from Sádra to Parántíj have been made. The Kalol-Vijápur railway though not actually in the Agency limits has stations at Limbodra and Randhaja, Makakhad and Lodra which serve the Mahi Kántha towns of Mánsa, Pethápúr, Warsoda and Sádra. Limbodra is also about four miles from Sádra, the head-quarters of the Agency. The Mehsána-Kherálu branch line was extended by His Highness the Maharaja of Baroda to Taranga Hill station in 1910. This line too, though not actually in the Agency limits, serves the Táluka of Sudasna and the Tálukas comprised in the Gadhwáda Thána Circle. The Ambaji-Taranga Light Railway from the Taranga Hill Station which will develop the Gadhwáda Thána Circle, and the Dánta State is under construction.

Famine.—The whole Agency suffered from famine in 1899-1900. Relief measures were commenced in December 1899 and were closed in November 1900. The highest daily average number on relief works was 30,000 in July 1900, and those receiving gratuitous relief numbered 6,000. The total amount spent during the year for famine relief amounted to Rs. 4,76,967. The next year again there was scarcity, and the whole Agency suffered from the famine of 1901-02. The daily average number of relief workers was over 13,000 in June 1902, which decreased to 1,200 in October. The Idar State borrowed famine

loans of Rs. 3,50,000 from Government; and the amounts borrowed by other States in the Agency was Rs. 3,77,780 in all. The whole Agency suffered from fodder famine in 1911-12. Tagávi was advanced to cultivators to sink new wells, to grow fodder as also to purchase the fodder imported by the Agency in large quantities, and thus the lives of many cattle were saved. The percentage of cattle which died was 7·6. There being no human distress, no relief works had to be opened. The Idar State contracted famine loans of Rs. 1,68,000 from Government; and the amount borrowed by other States in the Agency was Rs. 3,11,256 in all.

Plague.—The Agency remained free from plague up to 1901-02. Bávishi Thána in the Agency was first infected by plague in 1902-03, when 37 persons died. In all there occurred over 4,900 deaths up to the end of May 1910.
