

KA'NARA.

Area.—The area of the district has been increased from 3,910 (1881-82) to 3,945 square miles mainly to accord with the measurement of the survey carried out since 1875. Some internal changes occurred in the district between 1891—1901. An area of 196 square miles was transferred from Sirsi to the Yellápur and Siddápur tálukas. The complete táluka variations are :—

Recent Settlements.—A revision settlement was introduced into two tálukas, Haliyál and Kárwár, in 1909-10 and 1910-11 respectively, but effect has not yet been given to the latter settlement. Proposals for the revision of Ankola and Kumta tálukas are under consideration. The work of revision settlement of the Honávar táluka has been completed. The total culturable area of the district is 335,968 acres and the assessment on the Government occupied land is Rs. 9,98,153.

The rates now in force and other details of assessments, dates, etc., are given in Table XV.

Important Public Works.—The Southern Marátha Railway, which was opened for traffic in 1886, crosses the north-west angle of the district, two stations, Tinai Ghát and Castle Rock, being in the Supa petha. In 1910-11 there were 371 miles of metalled road and 822 miles of road suitable for fair weather traffic only. The new roads and works of importance constructed since 1875 are as follows :—


