





KOLHA'PUR PRINCIPALITY.

KOLHÁPUR PRINCIPALITY.

Area.—The Kolhápúr territory has an area of 3,217·1 square miles, of which 2,124·6 belong to Kolhápúr proper and the rest to the feudatory jághírs lying in the state.

Survey.—The survey settlement was first introduced into Kolhápúr territory about the year 1867. The revised settlement was commenced in 1895, and has been extended to almost the whole principality excepting the Baroda Jághír. There are also some 41 villages scattered over various talukás of the state, which have not been yet subjected to revenue survey at all, as their respective holders do not consent to the measure. The new rates of assessment are generally 25 per cent. in excess of the old. The original and revised settlement rates are given below :—

Trade and Manufacture.—The principal exports from Kolhápúr are dyes and tans, fruits and vegetables, grain, hides and skins, oil-seeds, tobacco and jágri. The chief imports are cotton, grain, hemp, oil, salt, spices and refined and unrefined sugar. A spinning mill has recently been erected at Kolhápúr. The number of spindles working in 1910-11 was 11,388 and the daily average number of hands employed was 217. There are also four ginning factories and a dyeing factory at Ichalkaranji.

Famine.—The state suffered from famine in 1896-97. Relief measures were commenced in December 1896 and closed in November 1897. The number of relief works was 110 in all. Over 6 lakhs of rupees were spent on account of famine during this period. Of this amount Rs. 4,14,000 were devoted to relief works, 76,000 to gratuitous relief, 30,000 to poor houses and 42,000 to grain compensation to low-paid servants. Further Rs. 75,000 were distributed as loans to agriculturists. In 1899-1900 the state again suffered from famine. Relief works were opened in February 1900 and closed in September. The highest daily average of persons on relief works was over 5,000 in April, nearly 40,000 rupees being spent on famine relief measures and Rs. 1,25,000 distributed as loans to agriculturists.

Plague.—In spite of the usual precautionary measures, such as inspection of railway passengers, etc., plague broke out at Manerajiri and detached villages under the Ichalkaranji State in 1897. Since then it has caused over 120,000 deaths. The mortality from plague during the last decade ending 1910-11 was as follows:—

General.—The area under reserved forest is 380 square miles and under protected forest 180. There is a tea plantation at Nándgaon in Panhála Petâ under the control of the Forest Department. About 70 lbs. of tea were produced in 1910-11. The annual outturn of *hirdás* is over Rs. 24,000. The total income from forest in 1910-11 was Rs. 1,23,016.



Jamkhandi.—With the exception of a few *Inám* villages the whole of the Jamkhandi State has been brought under Survey Settlement. The terms of the settlement extend to 1911 in Kundgol Táluka and to 1913 in other Tálukas. By the Survey Settlement the total assessment was raised by Rs. 42,859.

Kurundvād (Senior).—The Survey Settlement was introduced in 1896-97 excepting in the two *Inám* villages of Kurundvād and Ganeshpur. The survey of these villages was commenced in 1911 and is nearly complete.

Kurundvād (Junior).—The Survey Settlement was completed in 1896 and the new rates were made applicable in 1898 to all the *Dumala* villages with the exception of Sulge where an objection was raised by the Inamdar.

Miraj (Senior).—The Survey Settlement introduced in 1867-68 is still in force. Some villages belonging to the Sub-Saranjamdars were surveyed and classified but have not yet been assessed. Ropla Khurd and Ghatne are still unsurveyed.

Miraj (Junior).—The Survey Settlement of the three tálukas Kavthe, Gudgeri and Kurote, was completed in the years 1891-92 1901-02 and 1896-97 respectively. By the Survey Settlement the total assessment was raised from Rs. 1,35,591 to Rs. 1,47,719.

Mudhol.—All lands including the *Inám* villages have been brought under the revision Survey Settlement, since the year 1895-96. The revenue of the revised settlement has increased by Rs. 71,213.

Rámdurg.—The whole of the State was surveyed in 1890 and the period of settlement guaranteed for 12 years expired in 1902; it is however intended to continue the settlement until the revision survey, which is under contemplation, is finally carried out.

Sa'ngli.—The original survey in the Sa'ngli State was completed in 1890 and the revision survey in 1908. The present rates of Mangalwedba and Shábápur Tálukas are to remain in force till 1912 and those of Miraj Pránt, Kuchi and Terdul till 1915 when the revised rates will be introduced. Revised rates have been introduced in the Shirhatti Táluka from 1910-11. Of the 41 Inám and Sub-Saranjam villages 9 have not yet been brought under the Survey Settlement. Survey Settlement has also not been introduced in one of the four Mukta villages in the Shábápur Táluka. By the Survey Settlement the total assessment on land was raised from Rs. 5,91,943 to Rs. 6,32,269.

Trade and Manufacture.—Cotton, groundnuts, turmeric, tobacco, jágri and the principal food grains are the chief articles of export. Dyeing and weaving flourish in parts of Jamkhandi, Sàngli and Rámdurg. Coarse blankets are made in Miraj (Junior), Jamkhandi and Sàngli. "Khádi" cloth is woven in some villages of Jamkhandi and is largely exported. Copper and brass-ware is manufactured in the towns of Sàngli and Terdal and the village of Hangandi. Glass bangles are made in 3 villages of the Sàngli State. Rabkavi and Sháhápur in the Sàngli State export cotton piece-goods, coloured and uncoloured cotton, and silk yarn to a large extent.

There is a State ginning factory with a hydraulic press attached to it at Jamkhandi and six private gins at Kundgol. There are two ginning factories and one press at Budhgaon (Miraj Junior) and a ginning factory at Gudgeri. The value of the cotton ginned and pressed at Budhgaon every year is estimated at Rs. 2,00,000. There is a State ginning factory with a press at Mudhol. A tanning factory has been opened at Machha in the Kurundvád (Junior) State and is in a flourishing state. Two ginning and three turmeric factories are working at Sàngli and 3 ginning factories have been recently opened in Shirhatti Táluka. The opening of the Sàngli State Railway in 1907 has contributed to an increase of trade at Sàngli.

Famine.—*Jamkhandi.*—Owing to short rainfall signs of distress were visible in 1896-97 and relief measures soon became necessary. The first work was opened on the 3rd November 1896. The daily average number on relief works was highest in January 1897. Uncooked rations were distributed to those unfit for work. Again, in 1899-1900 the rainfall was scanty in Jamkhandi and Bidri Talukas and a little less than normal in Kundgol Taluka. Relief measures became necessary. Besides some minor works, two large works of tank construction were started, on which Rs. 1,06,000 were spent. The rainfall of the year 1900-01 was meagre and the relief works of the previous year were therefore continued. The expenditure on account of relief works amounted to Rs. 69,000, and on the poor house to Rs. 2,122. The year 1901-02 being equally unfavourable these measures were continued at a cost of Rs. 32,106. The highest daily average number relieved was 3,219 including non-working children in September 1901.

Kurundvád (Senior).—The scarcity of the rainfall in 1896 led to a failure of the crops, and relief works became necessary. The maximum number of relief workers was 840, and the amount spent on relief, Rs. 9,628. The effects of drought were again felt during the period of two years commencing from 1900, and relief works were in operation, at a cost of Rs. 8,044.

Kurundvád (Junior).—Owing to the failure of the rains in 1896 relief works were contemplated, but were not found to be required by the people. Tagávi to the amount of Rs. 6,000 was however advanced to the cultivators to enable them to tide over the bad season.

Miraj (Senior).—The rainfall in 1896-97 was scanty and irregular, and some ten villages of the State suffered scarcity. Rs. 12,000 were spent on relief works. It was found necessary to continue these relief measures till November 1897 at a cost of Rs. 32,808. In 1899-1900 the rainfall was again irregular and scanty. Relief works were started and Rs. 48,447 spent. Gratuitous relief to the amount of Rs. 8,459 was also granted. The effects of drought continued till the following year and the total cost of the relief works amounted to Rs. 19,841 inclusive of the sum spent on gratuitous relief. The years 1905-06 and 1906-07 were famine years during which relief works were opened.

Miraj (Junior).—The effects of famine were felt more or less during the years 1896-97 and 1899-1901. Relief works were opened; the total amount spent thereon was Rs. 77,131, and the number of persons relieved was 228,938. The harvests of 1904-06 were poor and fodder was scarce. Tagávi and remissions of revenue were granted. Test works were opened in 1905-06 but were found to be unnecessary.

Rámdurg.—The rainfall of the year 1899-1900 was insufficient and badly distributed. Rs. 40,000 were expended on measures of relief. The years 1904-06 and 1908-09 were years of scarcity but there was not much distress owing to the great demand for labour.

Sángli.—In the year 1896-97 the rainfall of the year was deficient and relief works were started. In all 8 works were opened, the amount expended thereon up to 5th June 1897 being Rs. 94,670. The highest average number on the works was 4,798 in May 1897. These measures were continued next year, Rs. 1,33,769 being spent in 1897-98. The daily average number was highest in July, viz., 5,602. The average number gratuitously relieved was 4,270. The rainfall in 1899-1900 fell short of that of 1896-97, and relief works were resumed. The amount spent on relief was Rs. 1,24,611 and the average attendance of relief workers, 14,731. In 1900-01 relief measures were continued, and Rs. 21,853 were spent. In 1901-02 the rainfall was abundant, but not well distributed and over Rs. 72,000 had again to be spent on relief. The average daily attendance was 5,202 in this year. Owing to the scanty rainfall there was considerable distress during the year 1905-06 in the Terdál, Kuchi and Miraj Prant Talukas. The area affected was 407 square miles with a popula-

Mudhol.—The only rains of June and July 1896 were neither timely nor sufficient. Relief works were therefore opened and over Rs. 6,000 spent by the end of the year 1897-98. In 1899-1900 the rains again failed, and relief works were opened in January 1900. The total number of labourers on works was about 50,000 and the total sum debited to the famine account amounted to Rs. 20,000. The year 1900-01 was one of scarcity and relief works were continued at an expenditure of Rs. 57,823. In 1901 the rains were insufficient and the relief measures, which had been discontinued, were re-opened in March 1902. The expenditure incurred on relief works during the year was Rs. 68,374. Over 13,000 and 25,000 persons were relieved by village doles and poor houses respectively.
