

SIR,

I am directed to submit, for the information of Government, the Stamp
Returns for the year ending the 31st
March 1913. In accordance with the
instructions conveyed in your letter No. 316 S., dated the 2nd of June last, the
statistics relating to the old district of Delhi up to the 30th September 1912
have been included in the Punjab returns, and those relating to the portion
of the district which has been constituted the new Province have been excluded, after that date.

2. The total receipts during 1912-13 exceed those of the previous year by Rs. 2,66,614. The total expenditure has increased by Rs. 25,651, the principal increase being due to refunds on unused stamped forms belonging to Marriage and Relief Funds and Insurance Companies which ceased to exist during the year. The winding-up of many of these was the result, as mentioned in last year's Note, of the legislation for their control and supervision.

The net receipts are Rs. 2,40,963 more than in 1911-12, notwithstanding that the figures for the old Delhi district for the first six months of the year only are included.

3. The income from court-fee stamps is Rs. 2,26,972 in excess of that Receipts from sale of judicial stamps (State-for 1911-12. Increases are shown in twenty-four districts, and are generally attributed to increased litigation to the institution of civil suits of high values and to the amendment of the Court Fees Act in 1912, which raised the valuation of land suits for court-fee purposes from 5 to 10 times the land revenue (section 7 of Punjab Act I of 1912). The increases in Rohtak and Gurgaon are mainly due to the transfer of the Sonepat and Ballabgarh tahsils from Delhi to those districts, respectively. In Hoshiarpur the increase of Rs. 21,853 is attributed to the institution of several cases in respect of boundary limits and also to a considerable number of applications for copies of old settlement records, in connection with the settlement operations now in progress. In Gujrat also a part of the increase is said to be due to the currency of settlement operations. Though not mentioned by the Deputy Commissioners, it is possible that the increases of from Rs. 17,844 to Rs. 30,726 in the Ferozepore, Gujranwala, Shahpur and Amritsar districts are, to some extent, due to the same cause.

Decreases are noticeable only in five districts. The decrease in Delhi is merely nominal, for the reasons explained in paragraph 1. The only decrease that calls for any notice is that in Mianwali, which is attributed to a lull in civil litigation in consequence of unfavourable agricultural conditions.

4. The net increase in the income from the sale of non-judicial stamps, as compared with the receipts of the previous year, is Rs. 34,751. An increase of Rs. 88,994 is shown under non-judicial impressed stamps or sheets, spread over twenty-three districts. The usual explanation is given, namely, the execution of a larger number of bonds, deeds, &c., of higher values. The increases exceeded Rs. 10,000 in three districts only, namely, Ferozepore, Lahore and Lyallpur, and are said to be due, respectively, to the substitution of deeds for account book entries in cases of mortgage and sale, to the sale of stamps of high values to residents of districts other than Lahore, and to an increase in the number of sales and mortgages by the colonists on acquisition of proprietary rights in their holdings. The large decrease (Rs. 48,708) shown against Delhi under this head is due to the cause already explained in paragraph 1, as is also the decrease in the sale of hundis and foreign bill stamps.

The most important decrease shown in statement III is that under the sub-head "Impressed Stamps, as defined in section 2 (13) (a) of the Stamp Act." This decrease of Rs. 64,025 is almost entirely due to the closure of Insurance Companies, &c., referred to in paragraph 2 above.

The other fluctuations call for no special notice.

- 5. The total number of unstamped or insufficiently stamped documents dealt with during the year was 2,611, on which the duty and penalty realised amounted to Rs. 26,113, or about Rs. 4,000 more than in 1911-12.
- 6. All differences between the departmental returns and the Accountant-General's statements were reconciled.
