

The cost of stamps from the Central Stamp Store also decreased by Rs. 11,224.

4. The stamp auditors continued to do useful work. By their appointment officials not only have become more careful in checking documents, but have also become better acquainted with the rules and instructions on the subject. The Commissioner, Multan Division, observes that the work of the stamp auditor has proved extremely useful in bringing to light irregularities in the numerous outlying courts in the Dera Ghazi Khan district. The stamp auditors were personally responsible for the realization of Rs. 34,942, while the Courts and Collectors, etc., have, as a result of greater stimulus, recovered Rs. 1,22,207.

In 1932 the stamp auditors unearthed in the Hoshiarpur district a systematic stamp fraud consisting of the sale of used court-fee adhesive stamps. A number of prosecutions were launched under the Indian Penal Code, and those decided were mentioned in the report for 1932-33. Six more prosecutions, lodged during the year under report, are pending in the Court of the Additional District Magistrate, Hoshiarpur.

The case regarding the fraudulent re-use of courtfee adhesive stamps by an agent of the Co-operative Execution of Awards Union, Ltd., Kasur, in connivance with a court-official was decided during the year. Each accused was sentenced to six months' rigorous imprisonment.

A case of fraud on court-fee stamps by a liquidator of the Co-operative Societies in the Rohtak district was also detected by the stamp auditor and the accused was sentenced to 15 months' rigorous imprisonment.

In the Jullundur district a licensed stamp vendor was prosecuted at the instance of the stamp auditor for having sold illegally stamps of the value of Rs. 180 which was beyond the limit authorized by his license. The accused was convicted under 'section 69 (a) of the Stamp Act and sentenced to three months' imprisonment; the sentence being reduced on appeal to a fine of Rs. 20.
