## Note on the Stamp Statements for the year ending 31st March, 1938.

As will be observed from the following table, the receipts under the Stamp and Court-fees Acts during the year 1937-38 show an increase of Rs. 40,584, as compared with those of the previous year :-

While receipts under the Stamp Act have increased by about Rs. 69,000, chiefly on account of the extension of the provisions of certain sections of the Transfer of Property Act to all Municipalities and Notified Areas in this Province, the income under the Court-fees Act still continues to fall owing to decrease in civil litigation on account of the introduction of the following Acts :-

(1) The Punjab Regulation of Accounts Act, 1930. (2) The Punjab Relief of Indebtedness Act, 1934.

(3) The Punjab Debtors' Protection Act, 1936.

Sale of court-fee stamps	+3,13,805	The increase of Rs. 3,13,805 really represents a deficit of Rs. 27,998 if the income from court-fee stamps sold for payment of motor taxation and copying fees be excluded. The fall is attributed to the causes already explained in paragraph 1 above.

3. Charges.—Discount allowed to stamp vendors on the sale of stamps has increased by Rs. 3,741 which is a natural consequence of the increase in income.

Refunds show a decrease of Rs. 6,474 as compared with the figures of the last year. The charge fluctuates from year to year. The increase of Rs. 4,719 under 'Cost of Stamps supplied from Central Stamp Store, Nasik' is due to increase in the demand for stamps of lower denominations.

4. The stamp auditors continued to do useful work and were personally responsible for the recovery of Rs. 62,513 on account of deficient court-fees, stamp duty and penalty. In addition to their duties of audit and inspection of all courts and offices, the auditors have been entrusted with the duty of auditing the accounts of the copying agencies in the province with effect from the 1st October, 1937. This has greatly increased their work and proposals for extra staff required to cope with the additional duties are under the consideration of Government.

The check exercised by the stamp auditors is salutary and has made the Presiding Officers of courts and their subordinates more vigilant and the general public more cautious in regard to the proper stamping of instruments.


5. Prosecutions.—(i) In the Kangra district, 2 cases were reported under the Stamp Act; one resulted in conviction and the other in acquittal.

The accused in the case reported last year was also acquitted.

- (ii) In the Sialkot district there was one prosecution under section 62 of the Stamp Act and the accused was convicted.
- (iii) Two cases of insufficiently stamped instruments (Section 64 of the Stamp Act) were brought to light in the Montgomery district. The accused in one case was convicted and sentenced to pay a fine of Rs. 400. The other case is still pending.
