Alterations and additions to Part A of the Farrukhabad District Gazetteer bringing it up to date.

CHAPTER I.—GENERAL FEATURES.

Page 1, lines 1—4.

Delete Replace by "The district of Farrukhabad is, with Etawah, to the west of the Allahabad division. Both districts were transferred to the Allahabad from the Agra division at the end of 1911: then, also, Meerut division lost Aligarh district to Agra and the new division of Jhansi, consisting of Jalaun, Jhansi, Hamirpur, and Banda districts, was formed from the old Allahabad division.

Farrukhabad district lies along the Ganges, which forms its northern and eastern boundary except for the Aligarh tahsil."

Page 1, line 21.

After "by courtesy be called a hill" *insert* the words "save the 'Kheras,' which especially in Tirwa tahsil almost deserve that title."

Page 1.

Delete the footnote at the bottom of the page.

Page 6, line 4.

Delete "two miles" and write "one mile."

Page 6.

Delete the footnote at the bottom of the page.

Page 10, line 22.

Insert a comma between "Majhle" and "Umardah."

Page 14, line 4.

Delete "Rs. 9" and write "Rs. 10."

Line 12.

Delete "Rs. 8" and write "Rs. 10."

Lines 17 and 18.

Delete "Rs. 12 per 100 square feet" and write "Rs. 40 per 1,000."

Line 28.

Delete Rs. 25 per 100 square feet and write "Rs. 12-8 per hundred weight."

Page 14, line 34.

Delete "Rs. 3 for a full-grown female wolf, Rs. 2 for full-grown male" and write "Rs. 10 for a full-grown wolf, Rs. 2 for a wolf-cub."

Page 16, line 19.

"In 1913 the district board purchased a bull from the Kheri bull farm."

Page 17, line 23.

"The district board has owned a stallion since 1900. The present one serves some 35 mares a year."

Page 19, line 5.

Delete "32.444 inches" and write instead "31.99 inches."

Page 20, line 10.

Delete "During the last eight years the average mortality has been as high as 48.08 per mille" and write "During the decade 1901-10 the average mortality has been 47.44 per mille."

Page 20, line 17.

Delete "being 46.21 per mille during the last eight years" and write "being 44.35 per mille for the decade 1901-10."

Page 20, line 21.

Add 1909, 1910, and 1911.

Page 20, line 34.

Delete "The fall to 74.76 per cent. during the last seven years" and write "The fall to 77.94 per cent. during the decade 1901-10."

Page 21, line 6.

"In July 1913, regular preventive doses of quinine began to be given in 30 selected district board schools."

Page 21, line 24.

Delete "from 1901 to 1908 inclusive, being only 256" and replace "from 1902 to 1910 inclusive, being only 54. However in 1911 1,077 persons died of cholera."

Page 21, last line.

Delete "from that year till 1908 the death-rate has only averaged 120" and write "during the decade 1901-10 the death-rate has only averaged 96.7."

Page 23, line 10, add.—

In 1911 there were 136 insane.

Page 27, line 11, add.—

In 1911 there were 351 deaf-mutes.

Page 27, line 16.

Delete "Leprosy, on the other hand, would seem to be on the increase, as 193 lepers were enumerated in the district for 1901 as against 112 in 1891."

Page 23, lines 16, 17 and 18.

Delete "this is contrary to the experience, etc."

And *add* "There were 112 lepers in 1891, 193 in 1901 and 101 in 1911. The figures of 1901 were contrary to the experience of the provinces."

Page 23, line 22, and last sentence.

Delete "is worthy of note and indicates concealment," and the last sentence.

Add.—

"Was worthy of note in 1901 and indicated concealment. Of the district total of 1911, no less than 1,175 were males and the male lepers outnumbered the female ones by more than two to one. But in 1911 the disproportion was small: out of the district total of 2,538, 1,520 were males: it was most noticeable amongst the 351 deaf-mutes, of whom 224 were males."

CHAPTER II.—AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE.

Page 25, line 15.

[In 1911-12 (1319 fasli) the cultivated area was 645,999 acres.]

Page 25, line 29.

Taking the average for the four years ending in 1913 this area amounted to 248,420 acres.

Page 25, line 30.

Groves occupied 34,373 acres—new fallow covered 45,332 acres, while 738 acres were land prepared for sugarcane but not yet under a crop. There remain therefore 167,977 acres, of which 44,746 consist of old fallow and the remainder of culturable waste.

Page 27, line 21.

[The cultivated area from which more than one crop was taken in 1319 fasli was 102,798 acres.]

Page 27, last line.

[In pargana Pahara the area bearing more than one crop in 1319 fasli was 6,838 acres or 44·95 per cent. of the total cultivated area of 15,213 acres.]

Page 27, last line but one.

Delete "42·8 per cent." and write "49·2 per cent."

Page 28, line 2.

[In 1319 fasli it formed 18·85 per cent. in Tiwa tahsil: in Farrukhabad 17·38 per cent.; in Kanauj 16·43 per cent.; in Aligarh 15·7 per cent.; in Kaimganj 14·25 per cent.; and in Chhibramau 12·48 per cent.]

Page 28, line 19.

[In 1319 fasli (1911-12) the *rabi* area was 413,891 acres and the *kharif* area was 391,030 acres. In Kanauj only did the *kharif* area exceed that of the *rabi*; it was there more than twice as large. In the other tahsils the *rabi* slightly exceeded the *kharif* area except in Aligarh where the *rabi* area was more than double that of the *kharif*.]

Page 28, line 27.

[In 1319 *juar* alone and mixed covered an area of 81,571 acres or 25·41 of the *kharif* area. The proportion was highest in Aligarh tahsil, 34·6 per cent. of the *kharif* area and lowest in Kaimganj, 20·99 per cent.]

Page 29, line 3.

[In 1319 *bajra* alone and mixed covered a total area of 114,151 acres or 35·36 of the total *kharif* area. Aligarh tahsil returned the highest percentage, 56·51, and Tirwa the lowest, 22·92.]

Page 29, line 18.

The average of the area under maize during the last four years 1316—19 was 60,874 acres or 16·88 per cent. of the total *kharif* area.

Page 30, line 1.

Much rice-land has been thrown out of cultivation of late years owing to unfavourable rains.

[In 1319 fasli rice covered an area of 10,151 acres or 3·16 per cent. of the *kharif* total. In the same year the highest tahsil percentage of *kharif* area under rice was in Tirwa 7·49

per cent. whilst in Farrukhabad there was only 66 per cent. under rice.]

Page 30, line 28.

Cotton during the last four years 1317—1320 has covered an average area of 24,509 acres or 6.94 per cent. of the *kharif* area.

Page 30, last line.

The average area under sugarcane from 1317 to 1320 was 18,445 acres or 5.22 per cent of the total *kharif* area.

Page 31, line 6.

[In 1320 fasli there were 7,881 acres of sugarcane in Kaimganj tahsil or about 12 per cent. of the *kharif* area.]

Page 31, line 9.

The area under wheat alone in the years 1316—1319 fasli averaged 113,026 acres or 28.52 per cent. of the *rabi* area while wheat combined with other crops accounted for 76,619 acres or 19.33 per cent.

Page 31, line 11.

Barley came next with 67,250 acres by itself, i.e. 10.69 per cent. and 99,238 acres or 25.40 per cent. in combination with gram. Gram only covered 14,666 acres or 3.72 per cent. of the *rabi* area. Poppy covered 17,019 acres or 4.29 per cent. of the *rabi* area.

Page 31, line 28.

During the four years 1316—1319 fasli potatoes covered an average area of 13,010 acres or 3.30 per cent. of the *rabi* area.

Page 32, line 9.

(Note on the potato moth.)

“In 1912 the potato moth began to attack seed potatoes in this district. The moth was introduced into the United Provinces from Patna by way of Lucknow and Cawnpore. It is black and about one-third of an inch in length. It lays its eggs in clusters four or five upon the potato tubers. These eggs hatch out in about seven days and the caterpillars bore into the tubers and keep feeding for about 15 days. They then pupate inside or on the surface of the tubers, first enclosing themselves in a slight cocoon like spider's web. The moths come out of the pupae in about ten days, couple, and lay eggs for the next generation.

Page 32, line 9.—(continued).

These larvae or caterpillars not only injure the seed potatoes in the godowns but also the plants as they stand in the fields. The main stem and leaf stems are then bored into and the growth of the plant considerably checked. But the injury done to the seed potatoes in the godowns is much more serious and it is only here that preventive measures can be taken.

The methods to be adopted are these. First the seed potatoes should be dipped in a solution of crude oil emulsion, one pint to 12 gallons of water, and then thoroughly dried. One five gallon drum of this oil costs about Rs. 7 and is sufficient for 1,000 maunds of seed. This dipping of the potatoes destroys any eggs that may have been laid on them. If the potatoes have already got the larvae on them, they should be handpicked before treatment or the results will be unsatisfactory.

The storage godown should be well fumigated with sulphur. Sand, neither damp nor hot, should be placed on the floor about two inches deep: a layer of potatoes should then be put on it, then another stratum of sand completely covering the potatoes, and so on.

The sand prevents the moth from laying new eggs on the potatoes.

If the potatoes are at first carefully selected the treatment with crude oil emulsion may be omitted.

During 1912 there were several conferences of potato-growers in Farrukhabad tahsil and this method was explained to them by officers of the Agricultural department. They remained, however, sceptically inert and in 1913 the department hired a building at Bholepur and 100 maunds of seed potatoes were treated and stored. It is anticipated that this action will be an object lesson and pay its own costs as well."

Page 34, line 3.

"In 1319 fasli 162,332 or 25·13 per cent. of the total area cultivated that year, were irrigated. Out of this total irrigated area, 56,993 acres were irrigated from canals, 89,991 from wells, and 15,348 from other sources."

Page 34, line 12.

"In 1319 Tirwa showed the highest proportion with 47,113 acres or 39·72 of the cultivated area irrigated."

Page 35, lines 7 and 8.

Delete "two weeks in every three" and write "in alternate weeks."

Page 35, lines 9, 10 and 11.

Substitute "of this commanded area 20,914 acres or under one third has been irrigated on an average during the five years 1908—13, 7,282 acres in the *kharif* and about 13,632 in the *rabi*."

Page 35, lines 15 and 16.

Delete "720 cubic feet" and write "777 cubic feet."

Delete "70 to 10 cubic feet" and write "50 to 6 cubic feet."

Page 36, line 19.

And during the four years 1909—1912 it has irrigated on an average 13,774 acres in the *kharif* and 26,679 in the *rabi*.

Page 38, lines 1 to 5.

During the five years 1907 to 1912 they have irrigated an average of 4,623 acres in the *kharif* and 8,835 acres in the *rabi* or under a quarter of the commanded area, the maximum being reached in 1907-08 when 7,453, acres in the *kharif* and 12,044 in the *rabi* came under irrigation.

Page 56, line 23.

Delete "about Rs. 2 per maund" and write "from Rs. 3 to Rs. 4 per maund."

Page 57, line 2.

Delete "about Rs. 6" and write "about Rs. 9 per maund."

Page 57, lines 13, 14, 15.

Delete this sentence and write Farrukhabad city contains 19 saltpetre refineries. Those which used to exist at Nisai and Kaimganj in the district have been closed down.

Page 57, line 20 and 21.

The refineries use about 117,000 maunds, from which about 67,000 maunds of refined saltpetre and 22,000 maunds of salt are extracted. These figures are for the three years average between 1910 and 1913.

Page 57, line 26.

Delete "3 peons on Rs. 7" and write "3 peons on Rs. 8 or 9."

Page 58, line 24.

Rewrite the sentence as follows :—

During the three years 1910—12, the exports from the Farukhabad station of the Cawnpore-Achnera railway averaged 775,486

maunds. Of this total 16,130 maunds consisted of oil-seeds, 16,413 maunds of metals, 12,431 maunds of piece goods, and 1,174 of twist and yarn, the remaining 729,007 maunds being described as "other merchandise" and including grain, hides and tobacco for which no detailed figures are available.

Page 59, line 35.

The road from Sarai Miran to Tirwa has however been metalled with a break at the Isan river where there will shortly be a bridge. The Court of Wards in 1913 gave Rs. 44,000 for this Isan bridge from the Tirwa estate. Government has promised to loan an equal sum to the district board and the building of the bridge will soon begin.

Page 60, line 20.

Delete Muhammadabad and write Nibkarori (formerly Muhammadabad).

Page 60, line 27.

The provincial roads, of which there are 92 miles in the district, comprise a section of the Grand Trunk Road running from Aligarh to Cawpore with the Bareilly branch which meets it at Gursahaiganj, the Bewar to Fatehgarh Road, and a few short lengths of approach roads to railway stations.

Page 60, line 34.

Delete the words "from Fatehgarh to Bewar and Etawah."

Page 61, last line.

The Court of Wards is constructing an inspection bungalow at Tirwa.

CHAPTER III.—THE PEOPLE.

Page 64.—PARA. "CENSUS OF 1901."

Add "In 1911, the population was 900,022—a decrease of 2·8 per cent. since 1901."

Tirwa tahsil lost 9·9 per cent. of its population during this decade, Aligarh lost 3·6 per cent., and the Sadr tahsil 2·9; but Kanauj gained 2 per cent. and Kaimganj ·3.

The density of the population per square mile was 535. Of the six tahsils the most populous was Farrukhabad with a density of 721 to the square mile, Kanauj coming next with 647, and then Chhibramau with 527, while Kaimganj had 463, Aligarh 457, and Tirwa 427.

Page 66.—PARA. "SEX."

Of the total population 494,017 were males, and 406,005 females, the latter bearing to the former the proportion of 822 to 1,000. Excluding Dehra Dun and Naini Tal, where the conditions are peculiar, there are only three districts in these provinces where the proportion of females is smaller. In the provinces as a whole the proportion is 915 to 1,000 and in some of the eastern districts females preponderate.

Page 66.—PARA. "RELIGIONS."

788,623 persons or 87·62 per cent. of the total population of Farrukhabad district are Hindus.

Of the remainder 104·293 or 11·58 per cent. were Musalmans, 4,016 belonged to the Arya Samaj, 2,548 were Christians, 500 Jains, 35 Sikhs, and 7 Buddhists.

Pages 68, 69, and 73.

Re-arrange paragraphs on Kisans, Chamars, Ahirs, Brahmans and Kachhis in the following new order :—Chamars, Ahirs, Brahmans, Kachhis, and Kisans.

Page 68.—PARA. "KISANS."

Delete "first in point of numbers." *Add* "The fifth place was taken by Kisans with 64,238 or 8·24 of the total Hindu population. The number is remarkable, as only 12 members of the caste are found in the rest of the division."

Page 69.—PARA. CHAMARS, line 3.

Write "First in point of numbers come the Chamars, numbering 98,828 or 12·53 per cent. of the total Hindu population.

Page 69.—PARA. AHIRS, line 12.

Ahirs come second with 96,755 or 12·26 per cent. of the Hindu population.

Page 69.—PARA. "BRAHMANS."

"Thirdly came the Brahmans with 76,327 or 9·67 per cent. of the Hindu population."

Page 70.—"RAJPUTS."

"Rajputs or Thakurs numbered 60,371 or 7·65 per cent. of the total Hindus."

Page 70, line 21.

First in point of number come the Rathors with 8,497 members, forming 14·07 per cent. of the whole Rajput population.

Page 70.—LAST LINE.

“Chauhans with 7,527 representations or 12·46 per cent. of the Thakur population.

Page 71, line 9.

Gaurs, who numbered 5,053 or 8·3 per cent. of the Thakurs.

Page 71, line 17.

There are 6,541 Bais in the district mostly in pargana Paramnagar.

Page 71, line 21.

Sombansis, of whom 5,192 were enumerated.

Page 71, line 28.

The Gaharwars numbered 3,366.

Page 72, line 4.

The Panwars, Pramars, or Pomars, who numbered, 3,167.

Page 72, line 13.

Gahlots, who numbered 1,806.

Page 72, line 26.

The Parihars can now muster 990 representatives.

Page 73, line 5.

Kachhis with 69,776 representatives or 8·72 per cent. of the total Hindu population came fourth among castes in point of number.

Delete “After Rajput.”

Page 73, line 18.

Gadariyas, of whom there were 34,093 or 4·32 per cent. of the total Hindu population.

Page 73, line 24.

Put the paragraph on Kahars before that on Kurmis.

“Kurmis numbered 23,634 or 2·99 per cent. of the total Hindu population”

Delete “a figure which is not approached by any other district of the division.”

Page 73, line 35.

Kahars aggregated 32,820 or 4·13 per cent. of the entire Hindu population.

Page 74, line 3.

Banias were enumerated to the number of 18,899 or 2·39 per cent. of the total Hindu population.

Page 74, line 16.

“Telis (175,661)” is a misprint: *delete* and write “Telis (17,566).”

Page 74.

Rewrite lines 16 to 22 by the figures of 1911 as follows.—

Those exceeding 10,000 in number are the Dhanuks (18,678), Koris (17,840), Nais (16,267), Telis (16,028), Dhobis (14,390), Lohars (12,150), Bharbhunjas (11,071) and Kayasths (10,817). Next in order come the Barhais, Kumhars, Bhangis, Sonars, Behelias, Malis, Luniyas and Nats, all of whom exceed 2,000 in number. In the 1901 census Khatiks, Darzis, Faqirs, Chhipis, Patwas, Joshis, Bhats, Beldars, Kalwars and Tamolis all exceeded 2,000 in number. In 1911 there were no Beldars and no Joshis 20, Chhipis, 224 Faqirs and 414 Patwas: the other castes were between 1,500 and 2,000. The impossible variation in these five castes shows the fallibility of census returns. The Sadhs who exceeded 2,000 in 1901, were not enumerated separately in 1911, but included amongst the 3,457 persons of “Minor castes”.

Page 75, line 9.

In 1911 there were no Radhas in Farrukhabad and the Bhagats were not separately enumerated.

Page 75, lines 19, 20 and 21.

“In 1911 there were 5,627 Hindu Lalbegis and only 88 Musalman Bhangis.”

[*Delete* the present remarks about Lalbegis in the Gazetteer.]

Page 75, line 32.

“Pathans or persons of Afghan descent take the first place with 35,987 representatives or 34.5 per cent. of the total Musalman population.

Page 76, lines 6.

Sheikhs are 27,666 in number or 26.52 per cent. of the total Musalman population.

Page 76, lines 14 and 17.

Behnas or Dhunas in 1911 numbered 7,886, Saiyyids, 6,238, Julahas, 6,492, Faqirs 5,446, Darzis 2,802, Rajputs and Naumuslims 1,103.

Page 76, last line, and line 1, page 77.

Delete Bhangis, Mughals, and Tawaiifs, who in 1911 were each less than 1,000 in number.

Page 77, line 32.

According to the census of 1911 95·13 per cent. of the inhabitants of the district were returned as speaking Western Hindi, 4·80 as speaking Urdu or Hindustani, and the remaining ·07 per cent. spoke other tongues, mostly English or Gipsy dialects.

Page 78, line 30.

As many as twenty-two printing presses are in existence in the district of Farrukhabad while one newspaper and two periodicals are published.

CHAPTER IV.—ADMINISTRATION AND REVENUE.

Page 90, line 3.

Delete "Agra division" and write "Allahabad Division."

Page 90, line 19.

Correct Kawalganj into Kamalganj.

Add "At Samdhan in Chhibramau tahsil Saiyyid Abdul Aziz has honorary magisterial powers of the 3rd class and revenue powers as an Assistant Collector of the 2nd class."

Delete "criminal appeals lie to the Sessions Judge" and write "Criminal appeals lie in part to the District Magistrate and in part to the Sessions Judge."

Page 90, line 27.

After "Sub-deputy opium agent" *add* "and an assistant."

Page 90.

Delete the note at the bottom of the page.

Page 105.

Rewrite lines 3 to 7 as follows—

"In the Tirwa tahsil, there are stations at Indargarh, Thatia, and Saurikh. The new station of Indargarh has become the headquarters of the old Tirwa circle and the three circles have altered their boundaries by interchange of territory."

Page 105, line 8.

Delete "existing" and write "former."

Page 105, line 10.

Delete "is to surrender" and write "has surrendered."

Page 105 lines 12, 13, 14, and 15.

Rewrite the sentence—

"The Indargarh circle now comprises an area of 118 square miles; Thatia which previously was only 67 square miles, has

been extended to 136, while Saurikh has been diminished from 161 to 127 square miles."

Page 105, line 17.

The largest circle is that of Gursahaiganj

Page 105, line 18.

Delete 77,901 and write 82,401.

Page 105, line 19.

Delete 36,167 and write 32,325.

Page 105, line 25.

The civil police force includes 36 sub-inspectors.

Page 105, line 31.

The chaukidars number 2,069.

Page 107, line 11.

Delete "eight office hands" and write "eleven office hands."

Page 107, lines 11 and 12.

Write "58 intra mural and extra mural warders."

Page 107, line 13.

After two hospital assistants add "a compounder, four menial servants."

Page 107, line 16.

Delete the word "past" and write "during the decade 1891—1900."

Page 107, line 17.

"The daily average population during 1912 was 1,584, out of which 37 were females."

Page 107, line 20.

During 1912 tents to the value of Rs. 48,854 were manufactured and supplied to various Government departments, the total cash profit earned by the Jail factories in 1912 being Rs. 32,020 as compared with 16,688 during 1907.

Delete previous sentence.

Page 107, line 27.

The death-rate per mille in 1912 was only 6.94.

Page 107, line 30.

During 1912 the daily average of the prison population was 240.

Page 107, line 32.

The amount earned in this way during 1912 was Rs. 4,390.

Page 107, line 33.

On June 9th, 1910, there was a serious riot in the Central Prison: the Superintendent was assaulted and it was necessary to fire upon the rioters, who were endeavouring to break down the gates and escape; 8 were thus killed. Afterwards 71 were tried criminally, of whom 63 were convicted under various charges to heavy sentences. As a result of the riot, the Jail administration has been much improved and many further precautions have been taken.

Page 107, line 34.

The Farrukhabad distillery contains eleven stills, which in 1912-13 turned out nearly 50,000 gallons.

Page 107, line 4.

There were in 1913 80 shops licensed for the sale of country liquor.

Page 107, line 14.

During the decade 1901—1910 inclusive the averages have been 26,159 gallons and Rs. 1,25,221.

Page 107, line 21.

There were in 1913, four shops licensed for its sale.

Page 107, lines 23 and 24.

While during the next decade the average has been Rs. 1,339.

Page 107, line 30.

298 shops were in 1913 licensed for the sale of *tari*.

Page 109, line 1.

The average annual income of the decade 1901—1910 was Rs. 22,149.

Page 109, line 3.

Opium is sold both at the tahsils and at 12 licensed shops.

Page 109, line 18.

From 15 maunds 8 seers in 1891—1900 to 24 maunds 32 seers for the decade 1901—1910. While the average annual receipts for the corresponding periods have been Rs. 6,235 and Rs. 11,172.

Page 109, line 23.

There were 79 shops in 1913 licensed for their sale.

Page 109, line 29.

Between 1891 and 1900 the average annual consumption of *ganja* and *charas* was 113 maunds 11 seers and the receipts

averaged Rs. 13,729. The corresponding figures for *charas* only (*ganja* is not now sold) during the decade 1901—1910 were 64 maunds 7 seers and Rs. 52,558.

Page 110.

Delete the word "Stamps" opposite the second paragraph and "Income-tax" opposite the third paragraph. Opposite the third paragraph in the margin write *Stamps* and opposite the fourth paragraph write *Income-tax*.

Page 109, line 15.

While for the decade 1901—1910 the average has been Rs. 2,26,114.

Page 109, line 22.

From 76·1 per cent. in the first decade to 81·3 per cent. in the second.

Page 110, line 36.

While for the following eight years they were only Rs. 31,852. The city of Farrukhabad-cum-Fatehgarh contributes over 52 per cent. of the total for 1911-12, the Kanauj tahsil coming next with over 16 per cent.

Page 111, line 1.

In 1911-12 its total assessment was Rs. 613.

Page 111, line 12.

Delete the statistics on registration and write—

During the 10 years 1901—1911 the average receipts for the whole district were Rs. 11,851 and the average annual charges Rs. 6,254.
