

# Review on the Stamp Statements of the Punjab for the year 1949-50

Introductory—This is the second review on the Annual Stamp Report for the year 1949-50 after the partition of the Punjab and shows a marked increase in stamp revenue as compared with the previous year 1948-49. The increase in revenue is chiefly due to improved commercial and industrial business, increased registration of conveyance deeds and civil litigation. As anticipated in the previous year the enhanced rates of stamp duty enforced with effect from the 1st June 1948, added substantially to the stamp revenue during the year under review.

2. Receipts—The following comparative table indicates the difference in the figures of receipts under the Stamp and Court-fees Acts, during the year 1949-50 and the previous year:—

Column (4) of this table shows a net increase of Rs. 7,42,758 in receipts under the Stamp and Court-Fees Acts for the year 1949-50 as compared with those of the year 1948-49 after excluding payments on account of Motor Taxation and Copying fees realised in Court-fees stamps.

- 4. Charges—(a) 'Discount' allowed to stamp vendors on the sale of stamps has increased by Rs. 8,817 on account of increase in the sale of stamps.
- (b) 'Refunds' show an increase of Rs. 49,959 as compared with the figures of the previous year. This charge fluctuates from year to year.
- (c) Cost of stamps supplied from Central Stamp Stores has increased by Rs. 1,814 due to regular and increased supply.
- 5. Stamp Audit Agency—The Stamp Auditors continued to be helpful to the presiding officers of the Courts and Offices and their subordinates in the efficient administration of the Stamp and Court-fees Acts. Besides detecting deficient stamp duty, they are also entrusted with audit of the District Copying Agencies, Arms Licences and Motor Taxation accounts. The periodical audit of the offices and courts by them has in effect made the general public more conscious of the necessity of ensuring that the proper stamp duty has been paid on the instruments executed by them. During the year under review, the auditors were personally responsible for pointing out deficiencies in stamp duties and court-fees amounting to Rs.1,15,931-9-3 of which a sum of Rs. 6,637-4-0 has been recovered up to the end of the financial year 1949-50.

The Stamp Auditors have instructions to take particular interest in the recovery of deficient stamp duty wherever they discover such shortages in the course of their audits, and to impress upon all presiding officers the importance of effecting prompt recovery.

- 6. Probate cases—The High Court has been prompt in sending notice of applications filed for grant of probate or letters of administration together with inventories and statements of final accounts submitted by the applicants. This has been helpful to Collectors of districts in verifying the valuation of the property involved and in recovering the deficiency of stamp duty on account of any undervaluation of the property. A deficiency of stamp duty amounting to Rs. 5,154 was recovered in one probate case during the year under review.
- 7. Prosecutions—No prosecutions under the Stamp and Court-fees Acts was made during the year.
- 8. General—The stamp revenue during the year under review was generally satisfactory. It is anticipated that this revenue will increase with the improvement of economic conditions and industrialisation of the province.
