

REVIEW ON THE STAMP STATEMENTS OF THE PUNJAB FOR THE YEAR 1952-53

Receipts—The receipts under the Stamp Act and the Court Fees Act during 1952-53, compared with those of the preceding year are shown in the table below:—

As would appear from the figures shown in column 4 above, there was a net increase of Rs. 1,78,539 in receipts under the Stamp Act and the Court Fees Act during the year under review. This increase is mainly due to an increase in transactions of immovable property and a corresponding increase in civil and criminal litigation.

2. The important fluctuations in receipts on account of the sale of judicial and non-judicial stamps is recorded below:—

^{3. (}a) Charges—As compared with last year there has been an increase of Rs. 8,662 in the amount of discount allowed to stamp vendors on the sale of stamps. This is due to the increased sale of judicial and non-judicial stamps during the year under review.

(b) Refunds—There has been a negligible increase of Rs. 69

under this item which is of a fluctuating nature.

(c) Cost of stamps supplied from the Central Stamp Stores, Karachi—An increase of Rs. 3,396 is registered under this head which is due to the larger number of stamps sold during the year under review.

4. Stamp Audit Agency—The Stamp Auditors have been more energetic and thorough in their inspections. During the course of the year they detected deficiencies of Court Fee Stamp duty and penalty amounting to Rs. 1,79,835 of which a sum of Rs. 44,555 has been recovered.

- 5. Prosecutions—There was no prosecution under the Stamp Act. Only six licences of Stamp Vendors (four in the Rawalpindi district and two in the Jhelum district) were cancelled on account of breach of the conditions of licence.
- 6. Pauper Suits—As before, heavy arrears of stamp dues in pauper suits continue to be outstanding in the Lahore, Sialkot, Gujranwala, Rawalpindi, Montgomery, Lyallpur and Multan districts. The Deputy Commissioners of these districts have been directed by their respective Commissioners to pay special attention to this work and to clear the arrears as early as possible.

General—In spite of the general slump in trade there was a steady increase in Stamp Revenue. With the return of normal conditions and the much desired expansion of industry within the province, the income is expected to increase appreciably.
