



^{6.} English is not taught in the Oriental College, as there are several English not taught in the Schools in the city and a Government College in which that language is taught. Any student of the Oriental College, who, in addition to his Oriental studies, desires to learn English, is allowed to do so in one of those institutions.

There were five students of the Oriental College on 31st March 1883, who also attended the Government College; and two students of the latter institution, who attended the Oriental College. Sixteen students of the Hakim Class of the Oriental College attended the Medical School. Four students of the Medical School attended the Oriental College for the purpose of learning the Native Systems of Medicine. Two students of the Training College attended the Oriental College. Sixty-eight students of the Veterinary School attended the lectures of the McLeod-Kapurthala Natural Science Fellow at the Oriental College. Thus the Oriental College co-operates with several other institutions in the station.

- Some provision should be made for training the Vaids of the Oriental College in the Allopathic System of Medical School is, that there is no provision in the latter for teaching the Vaids through the medium of Hindi, their own vernacular, they being generally ignorant of Urdu, in which language lectures are delivered to the vernacular class in the Medical School. But as it is indispensably necessary for the Oriental students of Medicine to have a thorough knowledge of the Allopathic System in addition to that of their own system, before they can pass the Vaid or the Hakim Examination of the Punjab University, some provision will have to be made, as early as possible, for giving, at least, some preliminary instruction to the Vaidyas of the Oriental College in the Allopathic System in the Medical School.
- 9. The Oriental languages, Sanskrit, Arabic, Persian, Gurmukhi, and
 Pushto, are taught in the College up to the highest standard of the Punjab University. Urdu and Hindi are at
 present taught up to the Entrance standard only: hence provision may have to
 be made for teaching these vernaculars up to the High Proficiency standard
 as lately sanctioned by the Senate.
- 10. Muhammadan students of the Shia sect study Arabic up to the The Shia Class.

 Proficiency standard in a separate class under a Shia teacher, for Shia Law and Literature can only be taught by a Maulvi belonging to that community.
- More Muhammadans than Muhammadans than Hindus, in the College. This is the majority of them belong to the sacerdotal class, can, by combining their knowledge of Arabic with that of Persian and Urdu, obtain public appointments, whereas the Hindu students of Sanskrit belong entirely to the sacerdotal class, and, therefore, they rarely or never study Persian and Urdu, which are alien to Sanskrit. It is a significant fact that the Oriental College is perhaps the only institution of all educational institutions in the country, not established exclusively or chiefly for the Muhammadans, which is so largely resorted to by Muhammadan students. This proves the popularity of the College with a class of the population which is generally backward in education.
- 12. Although there are few students who profess exclusively the Sikh faith, yet there are a good many among the Hindus who regard the Sikh Scriptures with veneration and read Gurmukhi; they are, therefore, properly speaking, partly Sikhs, although classified in the statistical return as Hindus.
- 13. There was one Native Christian student on the rolls who drew one of Bishop French's Sanskrit Scholarships during a part of the year, but he left the College before the Examination.
- Average cost of educating each scholar in the Oriental Average cost of educating each scholar. College has been Rs. 146.81 in the College Department and Rs. 21.64 in the School Department; the figures in the Government College and English secondary schools being Rs. 498.15 and Rs. 69.15, respectively.

Why the percentage for the Entrance and the B. O. L. Examinations are the Entrance and B. O. L. Examinations are apparently smaller in comparison with those of the Government College and Schools, for the reason that the students in the former have to prepare themselves not only for one kind of examination as in Government institutions, but for two and oftentimes for more than two examinations simultaneously. For instance, a Maulvi may be preparing himself simultaneously for an Arts Examination, an Oriental Examination in Arabic, another Oriental Examination in Persian, the Hakim Examination and the Law Examination, and a Pandit may be similarly preparing himself for an Arts Examination, an Oriental Examination in Sanskrit, another Oriental Examination in Gurmukhi or Hindi Literature, the Vaidya and the Law Examinations. The Oriental Examination, it should be borne in mind, is held not only in a language, but in almost all subjects, whether scientific or literary, on which books exist in that language. And in this respect it differs vastly from the Oriental Language Examination of the students of the Government College and Schools.

The Library of the Oriental College contained at the end of the year 627 to volumes, viz., 98 in the English language, 158 in Sanskrit, 45 in Hindi, 8 in Gurmukhi, 21 in Bengali, 115 in Arabic, 65 in Persian, 101 in Urdu, 6 in Pushtu, and 10 in other languages. A catalogue of these books is in course of preparation. The Library is very poor as yet; it is, therefore, very desirable that liberal provisions be made in the University budgets for enriching it until, at least, such time as all the standard works in the Oriental languages and general subjects have been procured.

It is to be regretted that the books and periodicals in the College Library not much used Library have not yet been much used for want of a separate Library and Reading-room, but as now the gallery of the Government College Library Hall has been kindly permitted by the Principal of the Government College to be used as a reading-room, a great want of the teacher and students of the Oriental College will be removed to some extent; still the defect, that the papers and books in the gallery which cannot be kept locked up are not quite safe, will remain unremedied until a separate reading-room is available.
- 27. It is intended to hold, in future, a weekly meeting of the students in Literary lectures and one of the rooms of the College after the College hours for lectures and debates on literary subjects under the supervision and guidance of their teachers, in order that their intellect be developed and their general knowledge be promoted, instead of confining their attention to cramming, as is natural to all who are expected to pass the prescribed examinations within a limited time.
