
3. The manufacturing operations were on the whole satisfactory and profitable, and there were large balances at credit of several operations.

4. It may here be mentioned that the manufacture accounts include a suspense account of depreciated stock materials belonging to Rupar Workshops in the Ludhiana Division, Sirhind Canal. This account had a credit balance of Rs. 41,543 at end of March 1888, chiefly made up of the profits on the workshop jobs. The account will be finally adjusted when the shops are closed and all materials belonging thereto disposed of.

The item of Rs. 180 on account of loss of stock represents value of 2780 c. ft. Boulders washed away by the flood in river Ravi and charged to repairs to Kaniwal bund under the authority of Joint-Secretary's No. 5214A.I., dated 18th November 1887.

II.—STOCK PURCHASES AND SALES.

The balance Rs. 11,698 at debit of this head at the end of last year has been reduced to a credit balance of Rs. 3,674 at the close of this year, and this is due to the payments made in advance for stock having all been recovered and a further liability of Rs. 3,674 incurred during the year.

6. There is a decrease of Rs. 2,113 under this head which is chiefly due to the adjustment of the outstandings noted below, *viz* :—

The amount of advances to members of the Department has also diminished by Rs. 423.

7. Of the items held at debit of the Miscellaneous Advance account under head "Miscellaneous" the under mentioned deserve special notice.

(a). Pay of Hospital Assistant and Compounder, disbursed by the Delhi Division, Rs. 100.

This sum was paid at the request of the Civil Surgeon, Delhi, during November and December 1887, February and March 1888, and debited to the Civil Department, but the item having been rejected by the Accountant-General, Punjab, was written back in the accounts of that Division for March 1888 and has since been adjusted.

(b). Excess expenditure over estimate by Bir Singh, Sub-overseer, in the Swat River Canal Division, Rs. 132.

The item was reported to Local Government in the objectionable items statements for December 1887, to February 1888, and the final orders passed in Joint Secretary's No. 3850I., dated 16th June 1888, decide the recovery of the amount from the Sub-overseer's up country allowance, which is being effected beginning with the salary for June 1888.

(c). Amount lost by a Sowar in the Lower Sutlej and Chenab Division, Rs. 109.

This is the balance of Rs. 159 lost by the Sowar in October 1887, and placed in Miscellaneous Advances. The case was reported to Government and in Joint-Secretary's No. 5707, dated 15th December 1887, recovery of the amount from the sowar was directed by a monthly instalment of Rs. 10 which is being regularly effected.

(d). Value of uniform in the Ferozepore Division, Sirhind Canal, Rs. 372.

Under orders of the Local Government uniform was provided for all the petty and inferior revenue establishments, and this sum was spent in anticipation of receipt of the cost from the parties concerned; of this amount Rs. 365 has since been recovered and the balance is in course of adjustment.

(e). Unauthorized payments to Khalasis, &c., in the Chiniot Canal, Survey party Rs. 158.

This is composed of a number of petty items, some of which were disbursed in anticipation of audit and others were excess payments all of which have, however, been adjusted in the accounts for June 1888, under the special sanction of the Local Government conveyed in Joint-Secretary's No. 4551I., dated 23rd July 1888.

8. Of the amounts advanced to contractors and charged to works it is only necessary to notice that the item of Rs. 721 in the Indus Inundation Canals Division, is insured by securities in landed property, while the items of Rs. 104 in the Chenab Canal Division, consists of several petty over payments of which the recovery is certain.

Item (d).—Are chiefly deposits on account of earnest money by Mill Contractors.

11. The balances at credit of "Zar-i-nagah," and the contribution for small works for Native States, stand on 1st April 1888 at Rs. 87,937 and Rs. 42,071, respectively.

VII.—TACAVI ADVANCES.

12. The decrease of Rs. 733 has resulted from the amount due for works executed in the last year, having been realized during the year.

13. The Hansi Division, Western Jumna Canal, was abolished from 1st April 1888, and in the supplementary accounts for March 1888, the Suspense Balances of that Division were incorporated with those of the Karnal Division, Western Jumna Canal, with which it has been amalgamated.
