Proceedings of the Governor of the Punjab in the Local Government (Boards) Department, No. 942-L. G.-37/21998, dated the 29th May, 1937.

READ—

The Commissioners' and Deputy Commissioners' reports on the working of District Boards for the year 1935-36.

THE total number of members of District Boards remained unchanged at 1,193, of whom 857 were elected and 336 nominated, 3 seats which were previously nominated having been thrown open to election in Sheikhupura District. The number of official members was 139, and there were only 15 European or Anglo-Indian members. There were non-official elected Chairmen in Gujranwala, Gujrat and Multan, Deputy Commissioners being the Chairmen of all the other Boards. Out of 253 meetings held during the year 6 were adjourned, but no meeting was abortive for want of a quorum. The average percentage of attendance of members at meetings was 81. The reports show that all Boards held a satisfactory number of meetings, that the system of sub-committees worked well almost everywhere and that members generally take a keen interest in their duties.

2. General elections were held in nine districts and as usual a large proportion of circles returned members unopposed, following Elections. the tendency of candidates to arrange things among themselves in order to avoid a contest. This is perhaps partly due to the increasing cost of elections. The Commissioner of Multan remarks that certain candidates in Lyallpur district were reported to have spent more than Rs. 5,000 each on election expenses. He adds, "Expenditure on this scale if not arrested is calculated not only to corrupt voters, but to prejudice members after election in honest and impartial performance of their duties." On the other hand, the number of election petitions reported is not large and in Sialkot the elections were said to have been singularly free from bitterness and corrupt practices. Popular interest in the elections was generally keen and the percentage of voters who went to the poll where there was a contest was in most districts high, reading the figure of 72 per cent. in Gujrat.

The receipts other than Government grants, the total income and the closing balance were higher for the year under report than for any of the previous five years. The increase in income over the previous year was, however, due to sale of investments and to a higher figure of advances and deposits under suspense accounts, the total ordinary income having fallen from 199.12 lakhs in 1934-35 to 197.69 lakhs for 1935-36. Local rate fell from 62.72 lakhs to 61.16 for uncontrollable reasons, and profession and haisiyat taxes from 7.08 to 6.40 lakhs. The decrease in the latter case is mainly due to the fact that an

abnormal amount of arrears was collected in 1934-35. The system of appointing special officers for the assessment and collection of these taxes is gaining favour and where it has been introduced the results are almost invariably satisfactory. There are still heavy arrears in many districts and these are frequently due to delay in assessment. In one district the levy of haisiyat tax was sanctioned in 1930, but assessments were not completed till 1935. The advice which Government would give to Boards with regard to these taxes is first that a profession tax is much simpler in operation than a haisiyat tax and for this reason to be preferred, and secondly that it is rarely possible to make a haisiyat tax a success without employing special haisiyat tax officers, who should, if possible, be officers to whom the powers of an Assistant Collector can suitably be given.

Expenditure has increased from 197·6 lakhs to 203·3 lakhs and has reached the highest figure since 1930-31. The total ordinary expenditure has increased from 189·3 lakhs to 194·7 lakhs, the increase being spread over all major heads except district works. The distribution of expenditure over the various heads during the past 6 years is shown in the following statement :—

The figures indicate a steady progress evenly distributed over the various departments since 1932-33.

4. As shown above the total closing balance shows an improvement of nearly two lakhs over the previous year. The total investments General financial position were Rs. 14,14,792, as against Rs. 16,30,382, shown for the previous year. The latter figure, however, is misleading as a sum of Rs. 3,35,000 representing provident fund investments was included under this head by the District Board, Rawalpindi, in 1934-35 and has now been excluded. The correct total for 1934-35 should, therefore, have been Rs. 12,95,382 and the total for the present year shows an increase of a little over a lakh. The Commissioner of Lahore, Mr. Mitchell, remarks "By a comparison with the figures for 1928-29 it will appear that the Boards have very nearly returned to the level of prosperity which had been reached before the economic depression set in". This is generally true of the province as a whole, but there are certain Boards whose financial position continues to give anxiety. Mianwali is still one of the weakest Boards financially and finds great difficulty in making its income cover its expenditure. Hoshiarpur has been meeting its liabilities with the aid of the collection of arrears of profession tax and now that these have been cleared off is faced with the necessity for retrenchment. Jullundur, in view of the excess of expenditure over income has been obliged to make retrenchments for the year 1936-37. On the other hand Dera Ghazi Khan whose financial position three years ago was precarious has now a satisfactory closing balance and investments of Rs. 67,962, and Gujranwala whose financial position has caused anxiety for some years was able to meet its expenditure without the aid of the capital receipts which it was previously using as ordinary revenue. The District Board of Lyallpur shows a closing balance of Rs. 5,65,610 against three lakhs for the previous year, and it is not clear why some of this money has not been invested. This is the richest Board in the province, but the Commissioner points out that its local rate will be liable to violent fluctuations in future under

the new sliding scale system of assessment and it will have to consider carefully how to maintain its financial stability. Multan District Board shows a closing balance of Rs. 4,70,060 in addition to the investments of over 2½ lakhs, and should consider the alternatives of extending its services to the tax-payer or reducing taxation.

5. The expenditure on Medical services and dispensaries was Rs. 23,69,351, showing little change from the previous year.

Medical. Out of this Rs. 7,08,012 was met from Government grants.

It is a universal complaint that the 12½ per cent. cut in the grant for rural dispensaries makes it very difficult for Boards to maintain these dispensaries on an adequate scale. No new dispensaries were opened except at Ali Raza Abad in the Lahore district, where the dispensary which had been closed in the previous year was re-opened. The system of appointing a trained dai at each rural dispensary is gaining ground and the number of such dais is rapidly increasing. Both in Lyallpur and Attock districts the experiment of subsidised dispensaries where a private practitioner is installed and is expected to provide for the needs of the locality with the aid of an annual subsidy, is reported to be a failure. The medical officers are said to be dissatisfied and the people to resent having to pay for treatment. This is unfortunate as in the other parts of India similar systems have succeeded and have made a large extension of medical services possible at a small cost.

6. The sum spent on roads was Rs. 22·55 lakhs compared with Rs. 21·69 lakhs in the previous year. Of this amount Government Communications provided 3·63 lakhs in grants. As remarked by one Com-

missioner, District Works remain the most starved department. Little has been done beyond maintaining existing roads and in some districts these have been allowed to deteriorate. In Ambala district particularly the metalled roads have been allowed to fall into a dilapidated state and the Commissioner has recommended that some mileage should be taken over by the Public Works Department. The Hoshiarpur roads are also said to be in a deplorable condition. Progress in tarring metalled roads has been made in some districts and in Lyallpur 47 miles were tarred. Rawalpindi and Jhelum are the only districts which derive any substantial income from lorry monopolies. It is important that such income should be spent on the roads in question and should not be used to relieve the District Board of responsibility for its normal expenditure on communications. The Jhelum Board with an income of Rs. 28,000 from monopolies in addition to the Government grant could perhaps have spent more than Rs. 35,780 on its unmetalled roads. The new system of scheduling roads will doubtless increase this source of income in other districts in the future. A novel scheme for the improvement of unmetalled roads for districts where ample water is available is described by Mr. Hayes, D.E., Lyallpur, in a note attached to the report from that district, and the experiment will be watched with interest.

7. The total expenditure on Education increased from Rs. 118·06 lakhs in 1934-35 to Rs. 114·75 lakhs in the year under report,

Education. and the Government grants from Rs. 76·98 lakhs to

Rs. 77·52 lakhs. The total number of boys schools decreased from 7,704 to 7,479 and the average attendance at such schools decreased from 5·69 lakhs to 5·56 lakhs. It can hardly be considered satisfactory that the expenditure should steadily increase while the number of scholars declines. On the other hand the number of boys primary schools increased by 72 partly owing to the reduction of unsuccessful middle schools and partly to the conversion of successful branch schools. The reports show that most District Boards are realizing that in view of their limited resources expansion is becoming impossible and that the problem is how to make the best use of available funds. Inefficient schools must be closed down, but Boards find difficulty in doing so owing to the pressure brought upon members by the people of the villages concerned and are not always ready to listen to the advice of the District Inspectors.

Figures showing the total number of female scholars in District Board schools are not available, but the increase in the number of such scholars in all schools in the province was over fourteen thousand and it is clear that the District Board schools had their due share in this result. All the Commissioners' reports show that Boards are showing an increasing interest in girls education. Thirteen new girls schools were opened in Gurgaon district; in Kangra 22 girl
