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**Proceedings of the Governor of the Punjab in the Local Government
(Boards) Department, No. 1981-Bds-39/16271, dated 3rd April, 1940.**

READ—

The Commissioners' and Deputy Commissioners' reports on the working of District Boards for the year 1937-38.

THE total number of members of District Boards was 1,202 of whom 859 were elected and 343 nominated, including 144 appointed *ex-officio*. The Constitution. Chairmen of the District Boards of Gujrat, Gujranwala, Multan and Rohtak continued to be elected non-officials. In other Boards Deputy Commissioners were the Chairmen. Of the 242 meetings held during the year only two were adjourned and none proved abortive for want of a quorum. The attendance of members at meetings is reported to be generally satisfactory, the average percentage being 83.

2. General elections were held in five districts, namely, Ambala, Ludhiana, Gujranwala, Jhelum and Attock. Elections.

It is remarkable that only three seats out of twenty-seven were contested in the Jhelum district and only six out of thirty in the Ludhiana district. It is not unusual for candidates to settle matters amongst themselves by negotiation to avoid the expense of fighting the elections ; but in some places the inference can be drawn that the number of persons interested in democracy in the sphere of local government in rural areas is small and that the electorate is controlled or swayed by an oligarchy. On the other hand, in some places the voters were jealous of their right of franchise and evinced considerable enthusiasm in elections. For instance, the District Board elections of Gujranwala proved the keenest in the history of the district ; as many as 25 out of 30 seats were contested compared with 11 in 1931 and 15 in 1934, and 70 per cent of the total number of votes were polled.

3. The total income of all District Boards in the province, excluding the opening balance, rose from Rs. 202.5 lakhs in the preceding year to Rs. 208.8

lakhs and the total expenditure from Rs. 202.5 lakhs to 209.4 lakhs. The increases should not, however, be regarded as representing a sudden accretion to the revenue or a sudden increase in the activities of District Boards. They are largely due to transactions in the suspense accounts and on the expenditure side also to the investment of a larger sum in the purchase of securities. The ordinary income increased by Rs. 2 lakhs only and the increase in ordinary expenditure was Rs. 1 lakh.

4. The principal source of income of District Boards, apart from Government grants, is local rate. Of the total ordinary income of Rs. 200 lakhs Government contributions amounted to Rs. 103 lakhs and receipts from local rate approximately to Rs. 60 lakhs. The income from local rate was Rs. 2 lakhs less than in the previous year, mainly because the sliding scale of land revenue assessment in the Lyallpur district, which was introduced in kharif 1936, remained in force for both harvests during the year under report. On the other hand, the grants made by Government were Rs. 3 lakhs more.

5. The finances of all the Boards are reported to be sound and they all closed their accounts with a balance bigger than the prescribed minimum of 10 per cent of the net income.

6. It is gratifying to note that considerable interest was taken Rural Reconstruction. everywhere in the work of rural reconstruction. "Safai weeks" were organised throughout the province and much attention was paid to the removal of rubbish heaps, digging of manure pits, opening of ventilators and other sanitary improvements in villages. In the Ferozepore district over 20,000

ventilators were fitted and 150,000 cart-loads of manure were removed from the village *abadis*. In several districts radio sets were purchased for use in rural areas. The District Board of Gujrat set a commendable example in constructing *bunds* to save large areas of agricultural land from the depredation of hill torrents.

7. The amount spent on education was Rs. 114.31 lakhs, two-thirds of which was provided by Government grants.
Education.

The income from fees was less than Rs. 9 lakhs. While the expenditure on female education was almost exactly the same as in the preceding year and only 26 new girls' schools were opened, the number of girl students in rural areas increased noticeably from 45,251 to 50,382. This is a most welcome indication of the fact that even in villages the parents are beginning to be alive to the necessity of educating their daughters. Government hope that girls' education will continue to spread still further, as it is the essential foundation of any scheme for permanent rural reconstruction. They trust that if there is a growing demand, the District Boards will not be found wanting in providing the necessary facilities. Should there be any financial difficulty in opening new schools for girls, it could be met by introducing, if possible, the co-educational system, which is reported to have been very popular in the Amritsar district.

8. The year was healthy except for smallpox which broke out in an epidemic form in certain areas. In preventing the disease from assuming serious proportions the District Boards spent Rs. 50,000 more on vaccination than in the preceding year. For the first time after 40 years there was no case of plague. Sporadic outbreaks of cholera which were due to infection having been imported from outside the province, particularly from Hardwar, were checked by the prompt action of the Public Health Department.

The total expenditure on public health rose from Rs. 6.34 lakhs to Rs. 8.30 lakhs, the increase being mainly due to a sum of over Rs. 1 lakh, which the District Board of Hoshiarpur had received as a grant-in-aid from Government, being transferred to the Public Works Department for the execution of the Bet Ilaqa Water Supply Scheme. An admirable example of self-help was set by the Hoshiarpur district where a sum of Rs. 38,000 was contributed by the public for sanitary improvements to be carried out under the direction and supervision of the Public Health Department. In the Sheikhpura district evidence of the interest of the rural population was furnished by the participation of no less than 240 villages in a sanitation competition, for which challenge cups, prizes and sanads were awarded to the winners.

9. The District Boards appear to be devoting increased attention to maternity and child welfare work the total expenditure under this head having risen from Rs. 52,000 to Rs. 61,000. In the Attock district there were three health centres and ten sub-centres where 83 *dais* had been trained and 68 were under training. A new centre was opened at Narowal in the Sialkot district. Apart from the paucity of funds, a more rapid progress in this direction does not appear to be possible; for if the demand for trained lady health visitors suddenly grew, it could not be met.

10. There is room for more veterinary dispensaries everywhere but finance is the limiting factor. Three new Veterinary and stock breeding. dispensaries were opened in the Multan district; and one was opened in the Gurdaspur district through the generosity of a private gentleman who constructed the buildings at his own expense. The number of bulls increased in all districts of the Ambala division except in Rohtak where 112 were struck off the register on account of death or old age. In the Ferozepore district the scheme of charging half the cost price of a bull from the villagers proved most successful and 100 Hissar bulls and 7 Montgomery bulls were purchased during the year under report. In the Lahore division zail committees

were formed for the registration of suitable bulls with a view to improving cattle breeding. The zamindars of the Attock district are reported to have sold bulls produced under the Dhani Cattle Breeding Scheme at very good prices to breeders from the North-West Frontier Province and other districts in the Punjab.

11. For the maintenance and development of roads Government gave a grant of Rs. 5 lakhs to District Boards, Communications.

compared with Rs. 3½ lakhs in the preceding

year. The total expenditure on metalled roads was approximately Rs. 11 lakhs—one lakh less than in 1936-37; while the expenditure on unmetalled roads rose from Rs. 6·35 lakhs to Rs. 7·52 lakhs. The decision of Government gradually to take over the maintenance of all Class II roads themselves will afford considerable financial relief to District Boards which should then be able to effect a more noticeable improvement in the condition of Class III roads.

12. The general impression left by the reports is that the District Conclusion. Boards managed to maintain their public services as well as could reasonably be expected

within the means at their disposal and also preserved a sound financial position. In some districts they are reported to have allowed the collection of profession and haisyat taxes to fall into arrears. As the sources from which District Boards derive their income are limited, the necessity of realising the dues promptly and regularly cannot be too strongly emphasised.

In conclusion Government have great pleasure in adding their own appreciation of the work of non-official chairmen, vice-chairmen and other members of District Boards who have been commended by Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners.

Order.—Ordered that copies of this review be forwarded to all Commissioners of Divisions and Deputy Commissioners in the Punjab, and the Accountant-General, Punjab, the Secretary to Government, Punjab, Public Works Department, Buildings and Roads Branch, the Secretary to Government, Punjab, Electricity and Industries, and be submitted to the Government of India, Department of Education, Health and Lands.

Ordered also, that the review be published in the *Punjab Gazette*, and that copies be supplied to Deputy Commissioners for the information of District Boards.
