

Proceedings of the Punjab Government in the Local Government (Boards) Department.

No. 2636-Bds.-41/34086, dated the 24th June, 1941.

READ :—

Reports of Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners on the working of District Boards for the year 1939-40.

THE total number of members of District Boards remained 1,203 (the same as in the previous year) of whom Constitution. 864 were elected and 339 appointed including 136 appointed ex-officio. The number of ex-officio members was reduced further by four during the year. The District Boards of Rohtak, Gujarat and Gujranwala continued to have elected non-official Chairmen, but the District Board of Multan which had a non-official Chairman for some years resolved in favour of an official Chairman to be appointed by Government. The attendance of members at meetings was generally satisfactory, the average percentage being 82. The system of sub-committees helped considerably in the disposal of complicated matters, thereby saving the time of the plenary bodies to an appreciable extent.

2. General elections of three Boards, namely, Karnal, Lahore and Montgomery, were held during the year and Elections. only about half the seats were contested. The

elections did not arouse much interest in the Montgomery district where only 9 contests took place and 42 per cent of the votes were polled. Elsewhere a certain amount of keenness and enthusiasm was evinced by the electorate ; but on the whole members try to settle matters amongst themselves and save the expenses of a fight. It is a matter for satisfaction that no untoward incident or corrupt practice was reported in connection with the elections.

3. The total income of all District Boards, excluding the opening balance rose from 222·4 lakhs in the preceding year to 239·1 lakhs. The increase Finance.

is due mainly to an increase of 17 lakhs in Government grants for relief of famine which continued to afflict the south-eastern districts of the province. It was remarked last year that a decrease of 5 lakhs had occurred in the ordinary income; the position has remained unchanged and a further fall has been arrested. The cost of collecting Haisayat-tax in the Ambala division is somewhat high compared with income, and the arrears everywhere are considerable. It has, however, to be remembered that conditions in Hissar, Rohtak and Gurgaon districts of this division have been abnormal owing to the scarcity that has been prevailing there for some time. The financial position of Lyallpur District Board has not shown any improvement, though it still continues to be the richest Board in the Province.

4. The total expenditure increased from 227·2 lakhs to 241·5 lakhs, the increase this year again being mainly due to famine relief operations in the Hissar district. The neighbouring District Board of Rohtak had to impose a cut of 5 per cent on the salaries of its employees to reduce expenditure, but conditions are expected to improve when the suspended local rate amounting to 1 lakh is recovered. The similar cut of 7½ per cent imposed by the District Board of Hoshiarpur reported last year still continues. There appears to be scant justification for the continuance of this cut, especially as there has been increase in the other recurring expenditure of the Board. It should find it possible to explore other avenues for reducing expenditure and increasing income. However on the whole the finances of District Boards are sound.

5. The Boards spent 116·2 lakhs, i. e., about 62 per cent Education. of their ordinary income on education. This sum includes substantial grants by Government amounting to 76·5 lakhs ; 9½ lakhs were received from fees. Government view with considerable satisfaction the increasing attention

which District Boards are paying to female education, expenditure on which this year has gone up from 6.35 lakhs to 6.53 lakhs. The campaign against illiteracy is also slowly but steadily gathering headway. Both indicate the growing sense of responsibility which members feel towards the needs of their constituents.

Almost all District Boards have continued to give such facilities as grant of fees concessions and scholarships to children of depressed classes and have contributed generously towards the purchase of books and writing materials for them. At a few places teachers belonging to the depressed classes have also been appointed which is a step in the right direction. Another satisfying feature is that District Boards are now becoming alive to the importance of medical inspection of school children.

6. The year was comparatively free from infectious diseases and Public Health. this is reflected in the expenditure on public health showing an all-round decrease, except on vaccination, from 9.17 lakhs to 8.49 lakhs. Only a few deaths occurred from cholera and no case of plague was reported. In spite of widespread vigorous vaccination campaigns, smallpox has not yet disappeared from the Province and broke out in epidemic form in the Gurgaon district and to a lesser extent in the Montgomery district. In all, it took a toll of over four thousand lives, about 50 per cent being children. Famine conditions in the south-eastern districts lowered the resistance of people to disease and accounted for more than the usual number of deaths, but on the whole public health remained satisfactory throughout the year.

7. As reported last year, the effective help given by District Boards to Government departments in the cause of Rural reconstruction. continues and is producing good results. Efforts were made to improve the sanitation of rural areas by health propaganda through *safai* weeks, magic lantern lectures, rural fairs, etc., and active encouragement was given in the form of prizes to villagers. A sum of 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs was also allotted by Government out of the Special Development Fund for sanitary works in villages such as the paving and drainage of village, streets construction of proper platforms and parapets for wells, etc., to be carried out through the agency of District Boards. The villagers have made equal contribution in money, labour or materials and this betokens their eagerness to improve the conditions under which they live.

8. The number of veterinary and outlying dispensaries is increasing. Veterinary and Stock Breeding. One-day cattle fairs and shows which are frequently held give impetus to cattle breeding. To check foot-and-mouth disease in cattle, a considerable number of footbaths were constructed. The continuance of famine in Hissar, however, proved a serious setback to the Hariana breed of cattle and Government had to make a generous provision of fodder for saving the breed from destruction. Subsidies in equal shares were also given by the Rohtak District Board and Government to a large number of selected cows. The failure of the monsoon resulted in heavy mortality among sheep and goats in the Thal areas in the western part of the Province. Dhanni Cattle Breeding scheme which is in force in almost all the districts in the Rawalpindi division, is, however, giving good results and proving profitable to the breeders. Buffalo and camel breeding is also receiving the attention of some District Boards.

9. During the year under report Government contributed 3.08 lakhs compared with 3.63 lakhs in the previous year for the maintenance and development of roads. The expenditure incurred by District Boards also decreased correspondingly from 18.5 lakhs to 17 lakhs. Government hope that Boards will give increased attention to means of communication in the areas subject to their authority and improve the conditions of roads so that they may stand modern heavy traffic. Famine

appears to have been a blessing in disguise so far as road communications in the Hissar, Rohtak and Gurgaon districts are concerned where several unmetalled roads were made by famine labour. The monopoly system with regard to 'bus traffic' is in force in some District Boards and they are earning considerable profit from this source.

10. Government are pleased to note that on the whole District Boards have worked well and made fair progress during the year under report. No doubt, District Boards in the Ambala division suffered again on account of a complete failure of the monsoon resulting in severe famine conditions and heavy arrears of taxes, but generally speaking the financial position of the Boards remained satisfactory. It is, however, a matter for regret that there has been no improvement in the recovery of taxes, particularly haisayat and profession taxes.

In conclusion, Government associate themselves with the appreciation expressed by Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners of the good work done by non-official Chairmen, Vice-Chairmen and members of the District Boards.

Order.—Ordered that copies of this review be forwarded to all Commissioners of Divisions and Deputy Commissioners in the Punjab, the Accountant-General, Punjab, the Secretary to Government, Punjab, Public Works Department, Buildings and Roads Branch, and the Secretary to Government, Punjab, Electricity and Industries Departments, and be submitted to the Government of India, Department of Education, Health and Lands.

Ordered also, that the review be published in the *Government Gazette, Punjab*, and that copies be supplied to Deputy Commissioners for the information of District Boards.
