REPORT

WORKING OF THE LAHORE MUSEUM

FOR THE YEAR 1908-09.

On Mr. Percy Brown's transfer to the Calcutta School of Art the temporary charge of the Lahore Museum was made over to Staff. Sardar Sahib Bhai Ram Singh and Mr. G. A. Wathen, from 2nd January 1909 to 19th February 1909, and from 20th February 1909 to the end of the year, respectively.

Mr. Wathen having fallen ill the temporary charge of the Museum has been given to me.

The total number of visitors during the year was 152,617. The numbers for the last year were 276,941. There is, therefore, a decrease of 124,324. The average daily attendance last year was 758, but during this year it was only 418.

This shows a decrease of 124,324 during the year as compared with the last year's numbers. It is evident from the daily returns that the severe sickness which prevailed during the autumn months of 1908 and continual prevalence of famine contributed to the falling-off. But even when these circumstances are taken into consideration, the decrease appears excessive. I have no reason, however, to distrust the numbers given by the turnstile.

The number of female visitors during twelve months in the year was 2,302 against 4,420 in the previous year. A comparative table of the last five years is as follows:-

There is thus a decrease of 2,300 in the female attendance from the last year's, and the above remarks are applicable to this falling-off also.

The conduct of the public has, as usual, been orderly Conduct of the Public. with the following two exceptions .-

- (1) A soldier No. 8904 of 2nd Royal Irish Fusiliers, Ferozepore, who smashed a glass and took out a silver necklace in broad daylight on the 3rd March, 1909, was prosecuted and punished by the Court with a fine of Rs. 25.
- Two specimens of electrotype copies of coins were stolen on the 18th February 1909. The culprit, who could not be traced, probably thought they were gold and sold them for a small sum. The British Museum has been asked to replace them.

ADDITIONS TO THE COLLECTIONS.

Archæological Department.—The museum is much indebted to Mr. J. H. Marshall, the Director-General of Archæology in India, for the keen interest he always takes in the Lahore Museum. Owing to his efforts and advice a large number of Graeco-Buddhist sculptures was received in the museum from Simla where they were lying in the godowns of Viceregal Lodge. These sculptures were collected by Lord William Beresford some years ago, but it is a pity that no clue as to their original locality could be ascertained among the Viceregal records.

Dr. J. Ph. Vogel, the Archæological Superintendent, also presented to the museum four inscribed clay sealings, sculpture and an inscription mentioned in the appended list of additions.

Coins.—The Museum has received additions of coins mostly under the Treasure Trove Act through the various Governments as shown in the statement given below:—

Besides these a number of coins was also received from the Delhi Museum which will be classified by Mr. R. B. Whitehead, as soon as he finds time to come over to the museum.

A note by Mr. R. B. Whitehead on the working of the Treasure Act as regards the acquisition of old coins in the Punjab during the year 1908-09 is herewith appended.

Art and Industry.—Among the articles received from the Delhi Museum the most important addition is a collection of old China-wares and enamel work which have made this portion of the museum most interesting and instructive.

Raw Products Section.—This side of the museum has been closed to the public for three years for want of proper accommodation for the specimens. The whole of this room has been now re-arranged, and great credit is due to Pandit Basant Ram, the museum Darogha, for carrying out this arduous task in a most scientific and intelligent manner within the very short period of 20 days, in preparation for the visit of His Excellency the Viceroy. For the improvement of the Economic Section, the Director of Agriculture has kindly expressed his willingness to make additions to the present collections of the Punjab cottons and wheats and the Director of Land Records, of the specimens of wools.

At the request of Mr. Wathen, then Curator of the museum, I over hauled, rearranged and provisionally classified the mineral specimens in preparation for His Excellency the Viceroy's visit. I am at present engaged upon the scientific classification, cataloguing and labelling of the collection. Since most of the localities have been lost, I am of opinion that the collection will serve a more useful purpose, if classified, as a general collection of mineral rather than as a collection of Punjab products.

The Forest Department is being consulted as to the best method of arrange ing the specimens of wood. Considerable additions will be made to this section all kinds of drugs, gums and resins, fibres, grains, etc.

Natural History.—It is very difficult to secure the services of an experience of the pay sanctioned is too small. In my opinion it would be much better if a man on higher pay be employed for a period of three years whose

duty should be to go out shooting. After bringing in fresh birds he will skin and mount them in the Museum. An attempt was made to get the old birds restuffed and mounted by a man from Ahmadpur. This was not a success as all the old birds are rotten and should be thrown away, as otherwise they will spoil the fresh ones.

Geology.—The entire collection of fossils in the Lahore Museum received back from the Geological Department after their being properly classified, labelled and catalogued up to recently have not been shown for want of proper accommodation. These have now been displayed, and a list of the specimens in each case is placed for ready reference of the visitors.

Loan Collection.—As mentioned in the last year's report a circular letter was issued inviting the chiefs and noblemen to lend excellent specimens of art and other objects in their possession. As the people of India are not accustomed to lend objects of art to the Museum the result was not satisfactory. The contributions to this collection were a specimen of flexible sand-stone and a four-barrel gun by His Highness the Raja of Jind and Sardar Jiwan Singh, C.S.I., of Shahzadpur, respectively. The latter specimen has been returned at the owner's request.

The matter of preventing the leakage from the museum roofs is being put in hand by the Public Works Department. They have now decided to cover the roofs with corrugated sheet. I cannot, therefore, comment on the work until it is tested in the forthcoming monsoon.

A complete set of photographs of Gandhara-Buddhist sculptures in the museum was supplied free of charge to Mr. Macdonell, Curator and Professor of Sanskrit, Oxford University. A few photographs of the important sculptures of the Buddhist period were forwarded to Dr. Gustave Le Bon of Paris for illustrating his book entitled "Les Monuments de L' India." Photographs were also furnished to Mr. Marshall, the Director-General of Archæology in India, of the collection of antiquities found in Shorkot in the Jhang District, mention of which, about their acquisitions, etc., was made in the Annual Report of the Lahore Museum for the year 1906-07.


A separate report on the art sale room has already been submitted for orders of the Local Government.

Report on the working of the Treasure Trove Act as regards the acquisition of old coins in the Punjab for the year 1908-09.

- 1. During the year two reports were made on 77 silver and 9 copper coins forwarded for examination. All were coins of the Mughal emperors. It was recommended that 22 silver coins should be acquired for the Lahore Museum only. These included a rupee of Farrukh Siyar of Alamgirpur mint, which appears to be annualished. None of the residue merited acquisition for other Museum on the residue merited acquisition
- 2. The year under report was almost barren of finds, and the results compare unfavourably for other Museums. with those of the preceding year.
