

#### Review of the Annual Report on the Administration of Estates under the Court of Wards in the Punjab for the year ending 30th September, 1934.

Proceedings of the Governor of the Punjab, in Council, No. 2064-R., dated 24th July. 1935.

The number of estates under the Court of Wards is now 62, as against 64 at the close of last year, 4 having been taken under superintendence and 6 having been released during the year under report. The principal estate released is that of Mamdot, which remained under control for 43 years. During this period, a debt of Rs. 4½ lakhs was liquidated, and the area of the estate increased from 53,610 to 69,435 acres. Rupees 39 lakhs were spent on improvements and securities worth Rs. 3,40,000 were held by the estate at the time of release, in addition to other assets worth Rs. 7½ lakhs. These figures are a remarkable tribute to good management. The other released estates call for little comment. Of the 62 estates now under control 29 are owned by minors while 26 belong to families of political or social importance, incapable of managing their own affairs.

Both gross and ordinary incomes show satisfactory increases, from Rs. 23·21 to Rs. 29·05 lakhs in the former instance, and from Rs. 16·94 to Rs. 19·89 lakhs in the latter. There were extensive sales in order to discharge liabilities in certain estates, but the main increase is derived from cash rents and sale of grain, clearly a sign of better times than the recent past. Expenditure increased similarly from Rs. 19·83 to Rs. 31·07 lakhs, due in the main to repayment of debts amounting to Rs. 12·70 lakhs. Ordinary expenditure only rose by Rs. 54,000. Cost of management absorbed 13·7 per cent. out of the total ordinary income, as against 15·7 per cent. last year. Total assets increased from Rs. 7·10 lakhs to Rs. 7·23 lakhs. Sales were considerably in excess of acquisitions: on the other hand liabilities were reduced from Rs. 81·86 to Rs. 70·22 lakhs. The estates of Jagadhri and Rai Bahadur Boota Singh were conspicuous in realizing no less than Rs. 1,81,394 and Rs. 4,62,817 worth of immovable property by way of debt reduction. Taken as a whole these figures indicate a considerable advance on last year. The worst of the depression would seem to be over and the Court of Wards should be among the first to recover.

Liabilities to the extent of Rs. 12.88 lakhs were discharged during the year, as compared with Rs. 2.25 lakhs in the year preceding. No less than Rs. 7 lakhs are accounted for by the management of the late Rai Bahadur Boota Singh's estate, which is now almost clear of debt. The Sheikhupura estate is also now entirely clear of debt, amounting originally to Rs. 1.88 lakhs. Many other estates show improvement of the same kind, but in a lesser degree. Recoverable arrears of rent have, on the other hand, slightly increased from Rs. 9.24 to Rs. 10.56 lakhs. Actually they have been reduced on the 47 estates which remained under superintendence for the last two consecutive years, and no less than Rs. 2.80 lakhs of the total is accounted for by 2 out of the 4 newly adopted estates. The average rate of cash and batai rents has increased from Rs. 3-11-7 to Rs. 4-6-5. Batai rents are still preferred, although cash rents bring in nearly as much the income obtained by sale of grain.

In spite of the more promising economic situation, not much has been done by way of permanent improvements. The Governor in Council notes, however, with satisfaction, that the Court of Wards has played an active part in the campaign for pure seed distribution and rural reconstruction generally. In this respect credit is due to the administration of the Moti Bagh, Kartarpur estate, Jullundur district, while the Behk estate in the Ferozepore district has a flourishing agricultural improvement society to which leading zamindars belong. The Jahanian Shah estate, district Shahpur, is self-supporting in the matter of improved wheat seed and has purchased 25 Meston ploughs. Veterinary hospitals

at Jalalabad and Kartarpur have proved very beneficial to the public, and cattle breeding receives active encouragement everywhere. It is the policy of the Court of Wards to introduce expert agricultural knowledge into the administration and no efforts will be spared in future to this end.

The education of wards and dependents, both male and female, is advanced by all proper means. Results appear in paragraph 10 of the report and are very satisfactory. It would appear that 8 girls are receiving education in acknowledged institutions or by private tuition. More could be done in this direction and the Governor in Council hopes for better reports next year. He is glad to hear that there are wards who participate with success in the management of their estates, and he endorses the recommendations bestowed upon certain Managers, who deserve honourable mention. It is a good omen there should be 3 estates in Spahpur under the management of an Agricultural Assistant, who has done well so far. More attention has also been given by Deputy Commissioners to this branch of the administration in spite of their many other pre-occupations.

For the year ending 30th September, 1934.

1. Estates under management, released and taken over .- At the close of the last year there were 64 estates including the estate of Bhai Sher Jang Singh, younger ward of the Sidhowal estate. Four more estates were taken under superintendence and the following 6 estates were released, thus leaving in all 62 estates under superintendence at the close of the year under report.

Estate of Sardar Jaswant Singh.—The estate of Sardar Jaswant Singh in the Ludhiana district was taken under superintendence under section 6 of the Court of Wards Act, in the year 1929. As the ward attained majority, the estate was released from superintendence in October, 1933. The debts amounting to Rs. 10,031 were paid up during the period of superintendence.

Mandot estate.—This is the biggest estate and has remained under superintendence for over 43 years, the longest period on record. It was taken over in 1891, before the passing of the Court of Wards Act, 1903, and was released from superintendence in August, 1934. At the time of superintendence the Statement no. VI. estate was indebted to the extent of about 4½ lakhs; its income amounted to Rs. 2.03 lakhs; and it bad an area of 53,610 acres. During the long period of superintendence the entire debt has been wiped off. The ordinary income at one time rose to Rs. 6.54 lakhs and the gross area at the time of release was 69,435 acres. The large increase in the area was due mainly to the purchases effected from time to time from the surplus funds. At the time of release the estate held securities worth Rs. 3.40 lakhs in addition to other assets worth 7½ lakhs. It is gratifying to note that during the period of superintendence a sum of over Rs. 39 lakhs was spent on effecting permanent improvements.

Estate of Shamsher Ali Khan.—The estate of Sahibzada Mian Shamsher Ali Khan, nephew of Begum Mehar Bano of Mamdot, was taken over under section 6 of the Court of Wards Act, in September, 1925. The estate was administered by the same agency that managed the Mamdot estate. Owing to the release of the Mamdot estate and owing to the fact that the estate could not afford a separate staff, it was decided, in consultation with the Begum, that she should be appointed the grandian of the minor and the estate should be released from ed the guardian of the minor and the estate should be released from superintendence of the Court of Wards. At the time of release the estate held securities worth Rs. 89,300 and other assets amounting to over Rs. 9,000.

Buttar estate.—The Buttar estate was taken under superintendence in March, 1926, under section 5 (2) (a) and (d) of the Court of Wards Act. The debts at the time of assumption of charge, which amounted to Rs. 1,23,895, rose to Rs. 1,34,987 on 1st January, 1934,-the date of release. The increase in liabilities is due to the fact that the ordinary annual income of the estate which was over-estimated at the time of assumption of charge did not suffice to cover even the recurring expenses of the estate.

Malout estate.—This estate was taken under superintendence in October, 1925, on application of the wards under section 5 (1) of the Court of Wards Act. The estate was released on 1st February, 1934, with the consent of the wards, as it was found that the liabilities could not be liquidated within a measurable distance of time. At the time of assumption the liabilities of the estate which amounted to Rs. 1,39,186 rose to Rs. 1,45,170 by the accrual of interest.

Estate of Khan Bahadur Nawab Mohammad Jamal Khan Leghari, Dera Ghazi Khan.—This estate, which was taken under superintendence in August, 1927, under section 5 (1) of the Court of Wards Act, was released in November, 1933, as the ward was anxious to have his estate released and settle his debts with the creditors personally. At the time of assumption the total liabilities amounted to Rs. 1,76,654. During the period of superintendence Rs. 90,138 were paid up, leaving a balance of Rs. 1,04,169.

2. Income and expenditure.—The total gross income during the year under report was Rs. 29.05 lakhs as against Rs. 23.21 lakhs last year. The increase is mainly due to income from large sales of property of the encumbered estates of Jagadhri (Rs. 1,81,394), Rai Bahadur Sardar Boota Singh (Rs. 4,62,817) and Baba Harbans Singh Bedi (Rs. 78,625), for the discharge of liabilities.

Ordinary income.—The total ordinary income of the estates under superintendence amounted to Rs. 19.89 lakhs against Rs. 16.94 lakhs last year. The increase in the ordinary income is chiefly due to the income of the Mazari estate (13 lakhs) for which figures were not available last year. The income of the 47 estates which remained under superintendence for the whole of the last year and the year under report also shows an increase from Rs. 11.83 lakhs to Rs. 13.29 lakhs. This increase is partly ascribed to better management and partly to the sale of unsold stocks of grain held over last year. The ordinary income of the estates under management is made up as follows:—

While there has been an increase in the income under cash rents and sale of grain, there has been a decrease of Rs. 34,000 in the jagir income. The estates of Sidhowal, Buria, Ramgarh, Dada Siba, Kartarpur and Sheikhupura account for the decrease in jagir income.

Expenditure.—Total expenditure has risen from Rs. 19.83 to Rs. 31.07 lakhs during the year under report. This increase is in the main due to the repayment of debts amounting to Rs. 12.70 lakhs. The increase in ordinary expenditure, however, amounts to Rs. 54,000. In the 47 estates that remained under superintendence for the whole of the last and the present year, the ordinary expenditure increased from Rs. 10.23 to 11.06 lakhs. The following table shows the comparative expenditure under certain heads:—

Cost of management.—The total cost of management amounts to Rs. 2.73 lakhs as against Rs. 2.66 lakhs last year. This represents 13.7 per cent. of the total ordinary income as against 15.7 per cent. last year.

In the 47 estates that remained under superintendence during the last two years, the cost of management has increased from Rs. 1.63 to Rs. 1.74 lakhs. This is due to the fact that the management of the United Provinces portion of the Jagadhri estate also has been made over to the Deputy Commissioner of Ambala and this accounts for an increase of Rs. 12,000. If this increase is excluded, then the cost of management comes approximately to what it was last year. It is not proposed to discuss the figures of the cost of management in respect of those estates, which were taken over and released during the year under report. In 16 out of the remaining 58 estates the cost of management was less than 10 per cent. of the ordinary income. In 28 it was between 10 and 20 per cent. and in 10 it was between 20 and 30. In the remaining 4 estates of Rai Bahadur Boota Singh Dharek, Bahtar and Batil, the cost of management was over 30 per cent. The increase in the cost of management of estate of the heirs of the late Rai Bahadur Boota Singh is due to the employment of a highly paid Government official as manager. The increase in the sister estates of Dharek and Bahtar in the Attock district is on account of the fact that the income was comparatively low as rabi grain was withheld from sale owing to low prices. The cost of management in the Batil estate has been reduced from Rs. 31.4 to 31.1 per cent.

3. Assets and liabilities.—Total assets have been valued at Rs. 723 lakhs as against Rs. 710 lakhs last year. Excluding the assets of the 4 estates taken over during the year under report and the assets of the Mazari estate, for which figures during the last year were not reported, the assets show a decrease from Rs. 611 to Rs. 608 lakhs.

The Behk estate in the Ferozepore district purchased 17 acres of land for Rs. 2,427 and the estates of Sardar Manzur Ahmad Khan Qaisrani and Khosa spent Rs. 3,823 and Rs. 3,734, respectively, for the purchase of land. Jharauli estate purchased house property worth Rs. 2,500 and Buria worth Rs. 5,066.

During the year under report sales were very extensive as compared with acquisitions. Immovable property worth Rs. 1,81,394, Rs. 4,62,817, Rs. 40,455, hs. 74,375 and Rs. 15,100 was sold by the estates of Jagadhri, Boota Singh, Kallar, Harbans Singh Bedi, and Walidad Khan for the liquidation of their liabilities.

Buria, Ber Khurd, Rani Chhaunian, Nowshera Nangli and Batil estates purchased Government securities worth Rs. 48,430, Rs. 3,400, Rs. 7,100, Rs. 29,000 and Rs. 15,500, respectively.

Liabilities.—The total liabilities have been reduced from Rs. 81-86 to Rs. 70-22 lakhs during the year under report. The total amount of money lying in the treasury at the close of the year amounted to Rs. 5-62 as against Rs. 8-46 lakhs last year.

4. Reduction of debt.—It is gratifying to note that liabilities to the extent of Rs. 12.88 lakhs have been discharged during the year under report as compared with Rs. 2.25 lakhs last year. A large sum of Rs. 7 lakhs was paid towards the reduction of debt by the estate of the heirs of the late Rai Bahadur Boota Singh, with the result that almost all the debts of the joint estate have now been cleared up.

The future of the Jagadhri estate is still uncertain. Claims worth Rs. 2,11,648 have been liquidated during the year under report, but the progress of liquidation has been greatly hampered by the fact that the Patiala State Bank, one of the creditors, had attached property worth Rs. 20 lakhs in execution of its decree of Rs. 5 lakhs only. This has considerably affected the liquidation programme of this estate.

It is to the credit of the local officers that claims of Rs. 5.38 lakhs against the estate of Baba Harbans Singh Bedi, were reduced to Rs. 2.71 lakhs by composition and payment of Rs. 1,03,491 only. Proposals for the liquidation of the remaining claims are under consideration.

Rupees 22,161 were paid in full and final liquidation of the debts of the Sheikhupura estate. The entire debt amounting to Rs. 1.88 lakhs has now been discharged from the income of the estate during the 4 years of superintendence. In addition to the liquidation of liabilities a sum of Rs. 35,000 was expended on the construction of a bungalow at New Delhi, for the use of the ward.

Marked improvement has been noticed in the management of the Jahanian Shah estate in the Shahpur district. Liabilities to the extent of Rs. 32,600 have been discharged during the year and it is anticipated that the same amount will be paid towards the discharge of liabilities next year.

Debts to the extent of Rs. 31,658 were repaid by the estate of the late Lt.-Colonel S. E. Skinner besides the payment of Rs. 11,501 made on account of arrears of allowances, etc. Progress in the discharge of liabilities was also made by the estates of Manauli (Rs. 17,100), Dada Siba (Rs. 17,573), Walidad Khan (Rs. 15,483), Kallar (Rs. 10,018), Mitha Tiwana (Rs. 7,000) and Attari (Rs. 6,046).

5. Arrears of rent.—Recoverable arrears of rent show an increase from Rs. 9.24 to Rs. 10.56 lakks during the year under report. Excluding the arrears on account of four new estates out of which the Mandal estate in the Karnal district alone accounts for an increase of Rs. 2.80 lakks, the arrears of rent amount to Rs. 6.14 lakks. In the 47 estates which remained under superintendence during the previous year and the year under report, the arrears have been reduced from Rs. 5.61 to 5.19 lakks. While there is a decrease in the arrears of rent in other estates, the following estates show an increase:—

The increase in the case of Jagadhri estate is due to the arrears from the United Provinces portion of the estate. In the estate of Kartarpur Rs. 17,845 have been secured by decrees and bonds and suits for the recovery of Rs. 2,131 are pending in the courts. Proceedings for the recovery of Rs. 4,217 are pending in court on behalf of the Sher Shah estate and steps are also being taken for the recovery of arrears due to the Shah Jiwana estate.

- 6. Cash and batai rents.—Cash and batai rents which averaged Rs. 4-5-11 in 1932 and Rs. 3-11-7 in 1933 have again risen to Rs. 4-6-5. This is probably due to the improvement in the economic conditions of the cultivator. Grain worth Rs. 1-16 lakhs was beld over from sale as compared with Rs. 1-58 lakhs last year. Batai rents are still preferred. No difficulty was experienced in letting out on cash rent colony lands belonging to the estates.
- 7. Expenditure on improvements.—In spite of the improvement in the economic outlook it was not possible to carry out permanent improvements on a large scale. The total amount spent on improvements during the year under report was Rs. 63,506 as compared with Rs. 42,942 last year. Of this the Sheikhupura estate alone spent Rs. 35,872 on the construction of a house at New Delhi and on the boring and repairing of wells. A sum of Rs. 3,600 was spent by the Kartarpur estate on the construction of four new shops and the sinking of a well.
- 8. Agricultural developments.—The Financial Commissioner attaches great importance to the propagation of good seed in estates under the superintendence of the Court of Wards. Instructions were accordingly issued and it is hoped that it will greatly add to the volume of good seed for distribution in the province. In certain estates good seed has been advanced to tenants by way of taccavi.

The Moti Fagh of the Kartarpur estate in the Jullundur district has had another successful year as a demonstration farm. Improved varieties of sugarcane and cotton seed were distributed free to 97 tenants and 200 maunds of 8-A and 9-D wheat seed were advanced as faccavi in kind to 207 tenants of the estate. Three hundred and eighty one fruit plants were planted in the garden.

Kikar trees were planted on the banks of a new watercourse, 35 miles in length, in the Mamdot estate. The agricultural farm comprising an area of 100 acres in the same estate was leased on batai. It yielded an income of Rs. 1,274 as against the expenditure of Rs. 748.

In the Behk estate in the Ferozepore district, where rural uplift societies had been started, an agricultural improvement society, which has for its members leading zamindars and more intelligent tenants, has now been organized. Improved varieties of rice, sugarcane, wheat, cotton and fodder have been supplied to the tenants of this estate. Six Hindustan ploughs and one horse hoe cultivator were purchased for the use of the tenants of the estate.

The Jahanian Shah estate has, during the year under report, produced sufficient improved variety of wheat seed to become self-supporting. Twenty-five Meston ploughs have been purchased for the use of tenants of this estate. Improved varieties of rice have displaced the local variety by over approximately half the area and it is anticipated that better results will follow during the next year.

8-A and 9-D wheat seed, 4-F American cotton and Coimbatore sugarcane were introduced in the estates under the superintendence of the Court of Wards in the Jhang district.

The necessity of encouraging cattle-breeding on estates under the superintendence of the Court of Wards has been realised by the Financial Commissioner and orders to this effect were issued and it is hoped that the next year will witness a marked improvement in the provision of suitable bulls and rams, etc., for the improvement of the stock on the estates. The veterinary hospitals at Jalalabad and Kartarpur have

proved very beneficial to the public. As the former served a large area outside the estate, the District Board agreed to contribute half the expenses for its maintenance for a couple of years.

9. Miscellaneous.—The efforts of the Court of Wards in curtailing expenditure on ceremonials have not met with any great success. The following table shows that the expenditure on ceremonials, etc., is still considerable:—
