

## EVIEW OF THE ANNUAL REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE ESTATES UNDER THE COURT OF WARDS IN THE PUNJAB FOR THE YEAR (1953-54) FROM 1st OCTOBER 1953 TO 30th SEPTEMBER 1954

There were 15 estates under the management of the of Wards during the year under review, with an area of acres. The figures of Tragger Court of Wards estate Multan district are, however, not included in this et, because though it was released on the 1st November its property was actually handed over to the Ward by Deputy Commissioner on the 10th November, 1952 and s not under the management of the Court of Wards since late. No estate was released and only four new estates brought under the superintendence of the Court of Wards g the year under review.

The total ordinary income and expenditure of the rates was Rs. 5,55,758 and Rs. 5,64,490 respectively wo main items responsible for increase in expenditure Rs. 1,46,463 and Rs. 1,17,418 on account of 'Land rue' and Cesses' and 'Cost of management' respectively. Were the four estates, newly taken over brought less and entailed more expenditure. The cost of manatalso includes an amount of Rs. 15,405 as wards rate a control and superintendence of the 14 estates.

The most important responsibility of the Court of is the education of wards and the Board of Revenue with pleasure that each year more boys and girls from milies of the wards are sent to schools and colleges and ssible efforts are made by the district authorities to be them on proper lines. Four wards are at presenting education at the Aitchison College, Lahore. Various have been adopted for the development of the estates sum of Rs. 24,479 was spent on such schemes during ar under review.

On assumption of charge of these estates the total ies were Rs. 2,07,097 and it is gratifying to note that bilities had dwindled down to Rs. 9,210 only. Almost estates became free from the debts except those of ur I, Darapur II and Mahmud Zaman Khan; the two were taken under superintendence during the year review, and the third was in the process of release.

A good deal of money has been invested in the purcha of securities. During the year under review securities the market value of Rs. 4,29,199 were held by these estat and a cash balance of Rs. 8,79,200 was lying in Governme Treasuries in the account of these estates. Two of the estat (Darapur I and Isa Khel) had an amount of Rs. 57,968 surplus in the banks. A good deal of money has been spe on the improvement of buildings and liberal contributio have been made to various local and provincial charities at laudable causes.

The commendation given by the Deputy Commissione to the managers and the officers in charge of estates is we deserved and the Board of Revenue, West Pakistan, endors it with the hope that their example will be followed by others.

### REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF ESTATES UNDER THE COURT OF WARDS IN THE PUNJAB FOR THE YEAR ENDING THE 30TH SEPTEMBER 1954.

I' In accordance with the instructions laid down in ragraph 40 of Standing Order 33, a Report on the adminisation of the Court of Wards estates in the Province is written nually for the agricultural year ending on the 30th Septemr. The preparation of these Reports was suspended during e War with a view to effecting reduction in work and economy paper. The last report was published for the year 1939-40. pereafter only statements I to IV, showing certain valuable atistics of income and expenditure and other sundry items ere compiled for local use. The question of compiling a mplete report was first taken up in the year 1948 and a few ped copies of the Report were prepared and distributed and the officers concerned. The task of prepration of the eport was again suspended thereafter. As the annual port is very useful from the administrative point of view. e Board of Revenue has decided to prepare and print these eports regularly every year.

II. Estates under Management—The total number of tates under the management of the Court of Wards during e year 1953-54 was 15 comprising an area of 57,476 acres. The figures in respect of Tragger Court of Wards in the Multan strict are, however, not included in this report in view of the fact that though this estate was formally released from perintendence of the Court of Wards with effect from the November 1954, yet the Deputy Commissioner, Multan, d handed over the property to the Ward on 10th November, 52, without obtaining the prior approval of the Court of tards:

Estates taken under Superintendence—Four new estates re admitted to superintendence during the year under sort. Their details are as under :—

(1) Darapur I Court of Wards Estate of Raja Afzal Mehdi an, son of Late Nawab Major Talib Mehdi Khan, O.B.E., Darapur, Tahsil and district Jhelum—This estate was first ten under Superintendence with effect from 29th January I and was released on the wards attaining the age of majority the effect from 1st March 1950. After its release Raja Afzal hdi Khan, entered upon a course of wasteful extravagance, ich was likely to dissipate the property of this well known and important family of the old Punjab. With a view t fore to saving the estate the proyerty wss again taken us superintendence with effect from 4th January 1954. estate comprises an area of 3631 acres. Its total assets valued at Rs. 6,96,782 and the ordinary annual income and expenditure are estimated to be Rs. 23,014 and Rs. 16, respectively with debts amounting to Rs. 802 only.

(2) Darapur II Court of Wards Estate—of Begum R widow of the late Nawab Talib Mehdi Khan of Daraj Tahsil and District Jhelum. This estate was taken w superintendence on 22nd February 1954 as the Begum arranging to sell the property standing in her name to promoney for her only son whose property had already taken under superintendence on account of his was habits. The estate comprises an area of 210 acres with a valued at Rs. 1,75,269. The ordinary annual income expenditure are estimated to be Rs. 1,737 and Rs. 161 pectively. Nearly half of the area is lying unbroken to lack of canal irrigation facilities. Efforts are being to feed the area either with canal water or with some of means of irrigation.

(3) Darapur III Court of Wards Estate—of Bed Durre-Shahwar wife of Raja Afzal Mehdi Khzn of Dara Tehsil and district Jhelum. This estate was taken usuperintendence on 9th April 1954 as Raja Afzal Mehdi Ishad persuaded his wife Begum Durre-Shahwar, to sell land gifted to her by him in 1952 and standing in her not provide money for meeting his extravagant demandant.

The estate comprises an area of 74 acres with assets va at Rs. 10,050. Nearly all the land is "Barani" and un

of which 22 acres are still lying as Banjar Qadim.

(4) Meharpur Court of Wards Estate —Of Princes M Bano Begum widow of late Nawab Qutab-ud-Din of Marin the Montgomery district. This estate was taken usuperintendence on 21st January 1954 as she was considered to be incapable of managing it being a female. The estate comprises an area of 1,325 acres. The ordinary and income and expenditure are estimated to be Rs. 17,620 Rs. 13,335 respectively. Claims to the extent of Rs. 25 have been accepted against the estate. Besides these cases a sum of Rs. 1,120-8-0 is to be paid by the estate on accomproperty tax.

Wards rate —For the control and superintendence of estates the charge levied was Rs. 15,405. This amount has en included in the total cost of management.

Assets—The total assets (the value of the proper included) of all estates under the superintendence of Court Wards amounted to Rs. 1,58,25,869. Securities of the mark value of Rs. 429,199 were held by these estates and Rs. 7,79, were lying in Government treasuries in the accounts of the estates. Besides, the following two estates:—

Attention of the Deputy Commissioners concerned has en drawn to this. They have been asked to make strenuous orts to recover the arrears expeditiously.

Cash and Batai Rents—The total cultivated area of these tates for the year under report was 18,392 acres. This elded a gross income of Rs. 5,12,548 representing an average come of Rs. 23-8-0 per acre. The amount of land revenue id was Rs. 39,647 representing an average of Rs. 2-2-0 per ltivated acre.

Expenditure on development—A sum of Rs. 24,479 was ent on various improvement schemes of these estates during the year under report.

Education—All the estates are taking keen interest in the education of wards and their dependents. All possible forts are being made by the district authorities to educate them on proper lines. The following wards are receiving ducation at the Aitchison College, Lahore, and are making attisfactory progress.

- S. Zulfiqar Ali Khan, grand son of late K. B. S. Ghulam faider Khan of Khosa estate in the Dera Ghazi Khan district.
- S. Wajid Ali Shah and S. Ghazanfar Ali Shah, Wards of hahjiwana estate in the Jhang district.

Mian Muhammad Mushtaq, the elder ward of Malko state in the Multan district.

Sultan Khizar Hayat, ward of the Sultan Bahu estate the Jhang district. The sister of the ward being above the ge of education, the question of her marriage is under consideration.

Both the minor wards Pir Allah Yar and Pir Ali Gohar Tibbi Lal Beg estate in the Montgomery district gave up teir studies, with effect from March 1954, of their own accord.

Audit—The Audit of these estates was carried out by aly qualified Auditors of the office of the Accountant-General, anjab, and excepting minor irregularities which have since sen rectified, the accounts were found to be satisfactory the whole.

Guardian and Wards Act—No new state has been rered to have been brought under the guardianship of Collecred during the year under report.

Notice of Officer—The Board of Revenue, West Pakistan, sires to convey thanks to the district officers concerned for a special attention and care they have given to the adnistration of the estates under their charge.
