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
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
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
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Things in Classroom




'C' is pronounced as 'K' with a longer sound as in cat, cap, cup.


Help the children if they don't / can't say the words in English.






For the teacher


For the teacher

Tick ✓ the picture which matches with the word.




PARTS OF THE BODY



For the teacher
